TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hudson in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Junior High School in said Hudson on Tuesday, the 11th day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers of the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance and improvement of town roads.

4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the Police Department.

5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the Fire Department.

6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the observance of Memorial Day.

7. To see if the Town will vote to accept numerous bequests as Trust Funds, the income to be used for the perpetual care of the various Cemetery lots.

8. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to accept W. P. A. projects.

9. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to pledge the credit of the Town in anticipation of taxes.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$500.00 to care for the collection of ashes and other refuse, except

garbage, within a radius of 1½ miles of Taylor Falls Bridge, same to be collected regularly once a week, upon petition of Karl E. Merrill and others.

11. To see if the Town will vote to install a street light on First Street near the Junior High School.

12. To see if the representatives of the two major political parties in meeting here assembled by mutual consent will agree to dispense with the Party Caucuses held prior to Town Meeting and use the following system which is in compliance with the State Primary Laws: Any qualified voter in the Town desiring to be a candidate for any Town office may do so providing he presents to the Town Clerk, a petition containing the names of fifty (50) legal voters and in accordance with Chap. 23, Sec. 89 of the P. L. of New Hampshire. This method of election shall be in effect until recinded by the Town at some future annual Town Meeting dependent upon an article in the Town Warrant, upon petition of Arthur E. Fuller and others.

13. To see if the Town will vote to accept Gillis and Read Streets, so called and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 to improve the same from the junction of Central St. to a point near the property of Hormidas Beland, said improvement to include grading, graveling and tarvia, upon petition of Frank A. Connell and others.

14. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of the Municipal Budget Act, upon petition of George W. Harding and others.

15. To see if the Town will vote to extend the sidewalk on Library Street to a point on Central Street just beyond the so called Nursery School for the protection of the children in the Nursery School and those in the grade schools, and raise and appropriate money for the same, upon petition of Frank A. Connell and others.

16. To see if the Town will vote to accept Hurley Street, so called and raise and appropriate money to improve the same upon petition of Alphonse Dionne and others.

17. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the division of municipal accounting and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit agreeable to Chapter 211 of the Laws of 1939.

18. To see if the Town will vote to sell the Town Hall to Wattannick Grange for the sum of \$100.00.

19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Twenty-Five Hundred Dollars, (\$2,500.00) for the purpose of purchasing a Road Grader for the Highway Department.

20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$223.00 in compliance with Chap. 19, Sec. 1 of the Laws of 1939 in order to reimburse the Hudson Lumber Salvage Committee for money expended by them in building a road at Robinson Pond, so called, in the Town of Hudson said road being constructed in accordance with Chap. 19, Sec. 1 of the Laws of 1939, upon petition of Robert H. Hardy and others.

21. To see if the Town will vote to obtain a tax map for the use of said Town, in conjunction with a W. P. A. project or make such other arrangements for such a map as the Selectmen may deem advisable, upon petition of Fred W. Hall and others.

22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a certain sum of money for the purpose of purchasing a new Fire Truck or take any action relative thereto, upon petition of Harry J. Connell and others.

23. To transact such other business that may legally come before the meeting.

REPORT OF HEALTH DEPARTMENT

To the Selectmen and Citizens of Hudson:

I submit the following report, for the year ending January 31, 1941.

The town has been very free from reportable contagious diseases the past year. We had several cases of mumps and chicken pox among the school children, but not enough to warrant closing the schools.

There were two cases of scarlet fever reported.

The town dump has again been the cause of considerable expense to keep it clean and the odors down to a minimum. There has been considerable talk in regard to having a rubbish collection started. Whether the town is ready for this or not is for the voters to decide.

**PLEASE PUT ALL RUBBISH THAT YOU TAKE TO THE DUMP OVER
THE EDGE OF DUMP SO THAT OTHERS MAY USE SAME.**

The Tarnic Pond Settlement has been nearly cleaned up; the old out houses abolished and flush closets installed together with septic tanks and cesspools.

The State requirements have been stiffened in regard to flush closets where running water is available—also the Laws in regard to Nuisances, especially so in regard to odors and unsightly conditions.

There have been over 160 complaints made which have been checked, and in many cases, repeat calls have to be made to see that conditions have been corrected.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE HUDSON PLANNING BOARD

The Hudson Planning Board was appointed by the Selectmen as follows:

FRED W. HALL	—Term expires 1941
PAUL BUXTON	—Term expires 1942
H. A. SHEPHERD	—Term expires 1943
STAFFORD HILL	—Term expires 1944
FRED T. GOODWIN	—Representing the Board of Selectmen

The Board organized with Fred W. Hall, Chairman, and Paul Buxton, Secretary.

During the last two months, the Planning Board has attempted to analyze the local situation, and to determine what projects it should recommend at the annual meeting in order that it may present a picture of the anticipated development of Hudson, to the citizens of the town. The functions of a Planning Board is to make such studies and recommendations as will best promote the health, safety, convenience and general welfare of the community.

For a number of years there has been a dormant interest in having a tax map of Hudson. Such a map was started and partly completed under a C. W. A. Project, several years ago. Upon investigation by the Planning Board, it was discovered that there were a number of such maps in progress in New Hampshire at the present time. Two members of the Milford Planning Board met with the Hudson Planning Board, Selectmen and members of the Board of Directors of the Hudson Tax Payers Association, and had a thorough discussion of the method of procedure, and anticipated results from such a project in Milford.

Mr. Herbert Person of the State Planning and Development Commission in Concord discussed the program of Tax Map Development in New Hampshire, and the function of the State Planning and Development Commission in such projects, with the Planning Board, the Selectmen and School Board at a recent meeting.

In consequence of these meetings, the Hudson Planning Board recommends to the citizens of Hudson, that one of the most worthwhile projects which can be undertaken during the coming year is the development of a tax map and accompanying records for the Town of Hudson. Such a map to be constructed on the same basis as the Wilton tax map which has been completed, and as the Milford map which is now being done through a W. P. A. Project whereby 75% of the cost will be borne by the W. P. A.

The Planning Board is completing several committees who will work with it during the coming year in making detailed studies of the following projects:

1. The present possibility of a zoning ordinance for Hudson.
2. The possibility of encouraging the establishment of new industries in Hudson.
3. The study of the present trend of the population in Hudson.
4. The study of a ten-year tax program for the Town.
5. The study of a road beautification plan for Hudson.

Public hearings to discuss these projects will be advertised and held from time to time during the coming year. The projects recommended by the Planning Board at the next annual meeting will be based upon the findings of these several committees.

6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
8. To see if the district will vote to make any alteration in the amount of money required to be assessed for the ensuing year for the support of public schools and the payment of the statutory obligations of the district, as determined by the school board in its annual report.
9. To see if the district will authorize the school board to continue its support of the Nursery School and raise and appropriate \$300.00 for the same.
10. To see what action the district will take in regard to the continuing of the landscaping of the grounds around the

Junior High building and raise and appropriate \$1000.00 or any portion there-of for the same.

11. To see what action the District will take to recind the Vote passed at the 1939 annual meeting, "to hold the annual meeting in conjunction with the Town Meeting," and further advise the School Board concerning the date of the future annual School District Meetings.

12. To see if the School District will vote to grant the use of the Junior High School Auditorium to the Town for the purpose of holding all future State and National Primaries and Elections, and any other primaries or elections that may be necessary under Town jurisdiction.

Report of the School Board

It is concerning the physical properties of the schools that we would specifically report. For the conduct of the schools we refer to the report of the Superintendent.

Under the special appropriations we have had the exterior of the Webster building painted. Some incidental repair was necessary including the rebuilding of the front steps. The stoker unit which was authorized for the Webster building has been installed and is working very satisfactorily. In considering how best to expend the money for the development of the Junior High School grounds, we deemed it necessary to plan the final effect. Thus we decided that to gravel a parking area and to lay out and start the building of a circular drive at the front of the building, would be the most favorable use of the money available. This has been done.

Since a fine object in a poor setting tends to lose its attractiveness, we believe that the School District will be wise in providing the means for completing the development of the Junior High School grounds as soon as possible. Experience shows us that it will be difficult for the community to have any considerable use of the auditorium without undue interference with the school, until such time as it seems possible to add a vestibule containing checkroom and toilet facilities. It has been pointed out by some interested citizens that a ceiling for the auditorium would improve the acoustics and also assist in the heating.

The bill passed by the 1939 session of the State Legislature requires that corrective instruction be provided for handicapped children. Early in September, the hearing of all children above the second grade was tested with the audiometer. There were four children whose hearing loss was so great that it became a handicap, and therefore lip-reading has been provided for these children.

We are fortunate in that Barbara Smith, the Principal of the Webster School, has had sufficient training in lip-reading to be able to give this instruction, as part of her regular program, with no extra cost to the School District. So far we have been fortunate in that we have no other handicapped children for whom to furnish remedial instruction.

The regular instruction at both the Webster and Junior High is practically the same as last year. At Junior High a special effort is being made to have each child participate in club work and physical development exercises, which will tend to motivate their physical and mental development.

During the past year the various civic and social organizations of the community have more and more utilized the facilities of the Junior High School for their meetings. The Community Orchestra, which is a great asset in developing the instrumental musical talent of the community has used the small assembly room considerably for the last year. The boys of two local athletic clubs, and a group of older girls have used the gymnasium for basketball practice and games. Three groups of local women, of ten each, have used the facilities of the Home Economics Rooms for Cooking Schools conducted by the Public Service Company of New Hampshire.

There is no provision in the School Budget for money to pay for the care and operation of the school plant for other than school functions. It is therefore necessary that a minimum charge be made to cover these expenses to groups who desire to use the facilities of the building, even though it may be for educational purposes.

The hot lunches for both the Webster and Junior High Schools have been supplemented, and made more complete by Surplus Commodities, which are allotted by the W. P. A. for school lunches.

Several boys and girls have been on the rolls of the student aid of the N. Y. A., from whom they have received small contributions each month, for which they have performed certain tasks about Junior High School.

The new machinery in the shop at Junior High has enabled the boys to make a better quality of project. They have been of great assistance in completing several projects for use in the school buildings.
