WARRANT FOR THE ANNUAL MEETING March 13, 1945

State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Lebanon qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town on the second Tuesday of March next at 9:30 o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects; said meeting to be held open until seven o'clock in the afternoon:

First—To see if the Town will vote to accept the report of the Budget Committee and vote to adopt their recommendations as printed.

Second—To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

Third—To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Municipal Accounting Division.

Fourth—To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to discontinue the Wilder Bridge so-called at East Wilder and the approach highway between the bridge and East Wilder road, if and when the owners of the dam build the contemplated dam over the Connecticut River below said bridge: and also ,to instruct the Selectmen to make such arrangements with said owners as may appear to be for the best interests of the Town.

Fifth—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate sufficient funds to build an administration building at Lebanon's Airport.

Sixth—To see if the Town will vote to establish a new airport commission and authorize said commission to administer any and all sums of money appropriated by the Town for airport purposes.

Seventh—To see if the Town will vote to direct the Selectmen to enact the necessary ordinance or ordinances regarding hawkers and peddlers for the protection of Lebanon merchants in conformity with the Laws of the State of New Hampshire.

Eighth—To see if the Town will vote to direct the Selectmen to issue permits to the Robert P. Snow Post, Veterans of Foreign Wars and the Arthur G. Guyer Post No. 22, American Legion to conduct a Carnival for one week each on the Johnson Lot on Seminary Hill in West Lebanon during the summer of 1945.

Ninth—To see if the Town will vote to transfer \$10,000.00 from the cash balance of the Town to a capital reserve fund, said fund to be divided into the following parts: \$5,000.00 for new highway equipment and \$5,000.00 for sidewalk construction and/or equipment.

Tenth—To see if the Town will appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 yearly as a depreciation fund for road equipment.

Eleventh—To see if the Town will vote the sum of \$7,000.00 for re-surfacing the street and reconstructing sidewalks on High Street.

Twelfth—To see if the Town will appropriate the sum of \$10,000.00 for systematic collection of garbage and ashes.

Thirteenth—To see if the Town will vote to hear the report of the Incinerator Committee and act thereon.

Fourteenth—To choose a Selectman for the ensuing three years.

Fifteenth—To choose a Town Clerk, a Tax Collector, Overseer of the Poor, Treasurer, a Highway Agent, and a Chief of Police for the ensuing year.

Sixteenth—To choose two Library Trustees for the ensuing three years.

Seventeenth—To choose a Trustee to administer the Trust Funds for the ensuing three years.

Eighteenth—To choose four members to act on the Budget Committee for the ensuing three years.

Nineteenth—To bring in your votes on the following question: "To see if the Town will vote to support United States membership in a general system of international cooperation, such as that proposed at the Dumbarton Oaks Conference, having police power to maintain the peace of the world."

Twentieth—To transact any other business that may properly come before the meeting.

Board of Selectmen, Lebanon, New Hampshire Gentlemen:

Presented herewith is our report of the audit and examination of the accounts of the Town of Lebanon for the eleven months' period ended December 31, 1944.

Scope of Audit

We examined the accounts of the Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Trustees of Trust Funds, Library Trustees and Library Treasurer, Lebanon and West Lebanon Cemetery Committees and Municipal Court.

Balance Sheets

We present herewith comparative balance sheets for fiscal year ended January 31, 1944 and period ended December 31, 1944, also comparative balance sheets in condensed form for the ten periods January 31, 1936 to December 31, 1944. (Exhibits I & II)

In the eleven months' period ended December 31, 1944, Surplus increased \$607.24 to \$21,578.46, after giving effect to the results for the period as set forth in Exhibit III "Reconciliation of Change in Surplus."

As stated in our report of January 31, 1944, during a ten year period the financial condition of the town had improved to the extent of approximately \$118,000.00, changing from a Net Debt of \$97,027.00 as of Jan. 31, 1935 to a net surplus of \$20,971.22 on Jan. 31, 1944. This position has been maintained and slightly increased during the period ended December 31, 1944. It may be noted that the cash status had also improved.

The average tax rate in Lebanon decreased from \$3.18 in 1935 to \$2.85 in 1944. The average tax rate for the whole state during the same years was \$3.17 and \$3.07, respectively.

Audit Procedure

We examined and audited the accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody of and who receive and disburse public funds. All recorded cash receipts were checked by source and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from the depository banks. Vouchers and cancelled checks were examined and compared with supporting invoices and payrolls, and checked to entries in the books of record. Additions were tested in all books of record.

Temporary loan notes paid during the period were examined and found to have been cancelled.

Tax Accounts

The tax warrant for the levy of 1944, of Collector Milo L. Knight, was audited and balanced as indicated by Schedule B. Prior year tax warrants of 1943, 1942, 1941 and 1940 were also examined and are summarized in Schedule B-2.

Tax Sale accounts were examined and the activity for the period is set forth in Schedule B-3.

Town Clerk

The accounts and records of the Town Clerk pertaining to motor vehicle permits and dog licenses issued were examined. All funds received from these sources were properly accounted for through remittances to the Town Treasurer. (Schedule C)

Trust Funds (Schedules D, D-1, D-2, D-3 and D-4)

The records of the Trustees of Trust Funds were examined. Principal and income were found to be in the form of deposits in savings banks and securities as follows:

During the year new funds were added in the amount of \$2,158.58. (Schedule D-1)

The disbursements of trust fund income was found to have been properly made.

It will be noted that compared to the previous period income from trust funds shows a slight reduction from 1.88% to 1.79%. (Schedule D-2)

As reported in our previous audit several of the library trust funds are held by the Treasurer of the library, and we again call attention to the law that "The Trustees of Trust Funds shall have custody of all trust funds held by their town."

General Comments

For the purpose of showing Balance Sheet Assets on a more current basis it was considered advisable to charge off to Surplus the item of "Property Bought By Town" in the sum of \$1,422.81.

The financial accounts and records of all town officials which were examined were found to be in good condition and in accordance with prescribed methods.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 31, Chapter 211, of the Laws of 1939, this report or a summary of its essential features should be published in the next annual town report.

During the course of our examination, officials and office personnel assisted us for which we extend our thanks.

HEALTH OFFICER'S REPORT

The year just passed has been a busy one for this department, owing to the great number of complaints, from different localities. Notwithstanding that the Town has established a suitable "Town Dump", the public still throw their" along the Highways or into the River as before. The Old East Lebanon Road seems to attract people with Trucks and Trailers, to dump their loads, either beside of, or into, the River, although Signs are posted all along the road. In two cases, parties were made to re-load and clean up places where they had dumped their loads. All along our highways people are still throwing paper bags and boxes, of garbage, thus providing a breeding place for flies and mosquitoes.

The Doctors and Nurses have reported the following cases: 38 cases of Scarlet Fever, 22 of Mumps, 22 of Chicken Pox, 7 of Measles, 7 of Venereal Diseases, 6 of Infantile Paralysis, with two deaths, 2 of Pneumonia, 1 case of Anthrax, 1 of Para-Typhoid, 1 of Undulent Fever and 1 of Whooping Cough.

During the prevelance of the Infantile Paralysis cases, we tried to protect the children of our community, by closing all Public Swimming Places, and by forbidding all children under sixteen years of age to attend the picture theatre, or any other public gathering. The Board of Education very kindly postponed the opening of the Fall Term of Schools, and the general public seemed pleased with the result, for while at one time we had 32 children quarantined, we did not get a bad result, from it, due to the cooperation of the parents and children.

The local Doctors and Nurses, with the assistance of ladies from different societies, have conducted Child Clinics, during the year as usual.

Again I wish to thank the Selectmen, the Doctors, the District and School Nurses, and all citizens, who have in so many ways aided me in my work as your Health Officer. To Harry Manson, Superintendent of the Lebanon Water Works, I also extend thanks for the courtesies he has shown me, in viewing dumps along the River.

REPORT OF MILK INSPECTOR

A large percent of the milk now consumed in Lebanon is pasteurized. This is the safest method to use.

All the cattle are now Bang's tested, removing the danger of Undulent Fever to a great extent.

The report rendered by The Laboratory of Hygiene in Concord, N. H., from the last samples taken were very satisfactory in regard to Bacteria Count, B Coli, and Sediment.

The samples and general technic of inspection has been carried out as in the past with results that have proved satisfactory.

We are able now to treat Mastitis, when found, more satisfactorily than before, using the sulfa drugs. This trouble occurs in many herds producing milk and if animals suffering from this disease are not restricted from the milk supply and treated, will cause serious trouble to public health.

Milk is conceded to be one of our greatest food supply when produced under sanitary conditions.

FOREST FIRES

Another Enemy to Conquer

Here is a home front fight that everyone can get into. Last year in this State 558 brush and forest fires burned over 4,648 acres of land, of which 2,788 acres were valuable timber and young growth. With available manpower the lowest of any year since the war started, you can help to keep this loss down by preventing these fires from starting.

Keep in mind these simple rules:

- 1. Always get a permit from your forest fire warden before starting any fires in the open. Burning under certain conditions is permitted.
- 2. Never burn unless you have enough help to control your fire—a permit does not excuse you of negligence in case it gets away.
- 3. Always report any uncontrolled fire promptly to your forest fire warden. Minutes lost are acres lost.
- 4. Be especially careful with cigarettes, matches and pipes. Smokers caused most of our fires.
- 5. Never leave a fire unless it is dead out. You can't feel safe while there is a spark left.
