TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Sandwich, in the County of Carroll, in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs. You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town on Tuesday, the Thirteenth Day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

2. To choose Delegates to the National Convention.

3. To see if the town will determine by vote the salary to be paid any of its officers or agents.

4. To raise money to pay interest on School Fund Note for the year ensuing.

5. To see if the town will vote to raise money for the support of the Library in addition to the amount required by law.

6. To see if the town will vote to raise money to pay the expense of decorating soldiers' graves.

7. To see if the town will vote to raise money for the observance of Old Home Week.

8. To see if the town will vote to raise money for the repair of the Notch and Dale road.

9. To see if the town will vote to raise money for the maintenance of the Trunk Line road.

10. To raise money for the maintenance of State Aid roads.

11. To see if the town will vote to raise money in addition to the sum required by law to obtain State Aid for the construction of State road.

12. To raise money to make and repair highways and bridges and pass any vote relating thereto.

13. To see if the town will vote to appoint a committee to investigate the merits of a town forest and pass any vote relating thereto.

14. To see if the town will vote to raise money to help eradicate the White Pine Blister Rust.

15. To see if the town will vote to raise money to purchase snow fences.

16. To see if the town will vote to raise money for the Laconia Hospital.

17. To see if the town will vote to raise money to purchase one or more tractors and snow plows.

18. To see if the town will vote to raise money to build Thompson Bridge.

19. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to pay town charges for the ensuing year.

20. To see if the town will vote to raise money to build a building to house the fire engine and other town property.

Six teachers for seventy pupils.

Large transportation expense in spite of the number of schools.

School houses not attractive within.

Sanitary arrangements poor as a whole and at the Center and North offensive.

High per pupil cost.

Almost nothing for modern equipment, teachers and pupils supplies.

Percentage of attendance in all of the schools save Whiteface a little less than the state average.

Tax rate for schools about the lowest in the State.

Teachers salaries very low.

I have found it difficult to state clearly the problems which confront the school district. There is extravagance and there is parsimony at the same time. As I stated last year I believe in consolidation for children are better trained as a whole and have more interest in their work when grouped with others of the same age. At present the Center School needs to be considerably improved or a new one with reasonable modern improvements built before it will be possible to convince the people near the old schools of the desirability of a change.

At present there is some excellent work and some high grade teaching in the Sandwich Schools but teachers and pupils have not the environment, equipment and advantages which they should have.

To the Citizens of Sandwich:

The following is a brief report of some of the Board's activities for the past year:

The Lower Corner School was opened last fall to a class of eleven scholars. It is one of our best schools with an average of about nine scholars at the present time. A suitable place was found to board the teacher at Sandwich.

The schools were closed, during the winter months, at 3.30 p. m., because of the darkness.

The 1928 Dental Clinic was held in Center Sandwich. Thru the courtesy of the Quimby Trustees and the cooperation of Mr. Young, the Quimby School was opened to the children. Forty-nine scholars were cared for which is about one-half of the school membership. Dr. Clifford B. Learned of Meredith conducted the Clinic.

The condition of the schools is not the best and much should be done to bring them up to the condition they should be. Chick's Corner School should be shingled and much should be done at No. Sandwich to make the school pleasant for the children and a credit to the community. The interior of all the schools should be painted to brighten them up.

The Board wants to thank the citizens and particularly the parents, for their cooperation the past year.
