## *Town Warrant*

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*To the Inhabitants of the Town of Stark in the County of Coos in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town, on the second Tuesday of March next, March 9, 1948, to act upon the subjects herein after mentioned. The polls will be open at said place and date from 9:00 o'clock in the forenoon until 3:00 o'clock in the afternoon for the reception of your ballots upon the election of town officers under the Non-Partisan Ballot System: furthermore you are hereby warned that on said date and place, at 9:30 o'clock in the forenoon, the matter of appropriations and such other business properly coming before said meeting will be taken up for your consideration and action.

1. To choose by ballot the following town officers: one town clerk for one year, one selectman for three years; and the following for one year: a town treasurer, a tax collector, one auditor, two road agents, two constables, two sextons and one trustee for the cemetery trust funds.

2. To see if the town will instruct its selectmen to appoint all other town officers required by law.

3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for same.

4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for current expenses.

5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for:

- (a) Highway Maintenance
- (b) Snow Removal
- (c) Town Maintenance

6. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid for Class V Highways and appropriate \$276.96 and set aside for this purpose. The State will contribute \$1107.83.

7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Town Relief.

8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Old Age Assistance.

9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to defray Interest charges for the ensuing year.

10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Public Library Purposes.

11. To see if the Town will vote for a scale of discounts for payments of taxes on the basis of Three per cent if paid by Aug. 31, Two per cent if paid by Sept. 30.

12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to incur debts for temporary loans in anticipation of taxes for the ensuing year and pay such debts from tax money when received.

13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the upkeep of the Cemeteries.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$50.90 to the White Mountains Region Association, being 10 per cent per \$1000 of the assessed valuation for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter and advertising and otherwise publicizing the advantages of the town, in cooperation with the other 45 towns in the region.

15. Article entered by petition of ten signers. To see if the Town will vote to lay out and build

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a piece of road from the State Highway to Lawrence Parks residence, a distance of about 250 feet, and raise money for same.

16. To see if the Town will vote to purchase 1000 feet of snow fence and raise money for same.

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$400.00 for White Pine blister control recommended by the Forestry Recreation Commission.

### *Teachers*

Mrs. Elizabeth Stone resigned to accept a position as home economics teacher at Stratford High School. Mrs. Winifred Hart, a former teacher at the Stark Village School, was secured to fill the position. Mrs. Urania House returned to the Village School and Mrs. Maud Sanderson to Crystal.

Our teachers have realized the part a school must play in a rural community, and have sponsored interesting activities for children and adults.

The serious shortage of teachers throughout the country has been developing for the past ten years and we are faced with a crisis in education.

Not more than twenty-four teachers will be graduated from our teachers' colleges in New Hampshire this June, and there will be about two hundred vacancies in the State.

### *General Information*

New textbooks and workbooks have been purchased and we are now adequately supplied with current editions.

The suggested State Program of Studies is being followed in all subjects.

The health program is under the supervision of Miss Florence Wheeler, R. N., and the following is a report of her findings.

Extensive repairs were made on the Crystal School house. The unsanitary condition caused by water seepage under the building was eliminated by creating proper drainage. The interior was completely renovated by putting in new celotex walls and a new ceiling. Slight minor repairs were made on the roof.
