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## INTRODUCTION

### SELECTMEN'S REPORT

The Selectmen are pleased to report that in spite of a year during which inflation continued to rise (but at a reduced rate), the town has been successful in living within the total operations appropriation of the 1982 town meeting. This has occurred as a result of the resourcefulness and diligence of both elected and appointed officials in striving to obtain the most value for the dollar expended while living within the town's appropriations. The 1982 tax rate increased by 3.4 percent -- a rate of increase below that of the general cost of living increase.

During 1982, substantial capital improvements were made in town buildings, namely:

- reconstructing of the foundation of the stage area of Community Hall.
- retrofitting the library, highway garage, and fire station with energy conserving equipment designed to reduce operating costs.

These projects were completed with capital reserve funds appropriated for town buildings.

State highway reconstruction funds were used to repair sections of road (Hubbard Road, South Road, and Gilsum Road) which had deteriorated to the extent that reconstruction was needed.

As 1983 commences, from the Selectmen's perspective Sullivan has some specific needs (not listed in order of priority):

- additional highway improvement at various locations of the town.
- additional improvements in town buildings - primarily at Community Hall.
- a plan for upgrading present highway equipment
  - the age range on our equipment is 14 years (newest) to 32 years (oldest). A sizeable appropriation for "repair" has been included in the highway budget for many years.
- reassessment to equalize the property tax burden among all of Sullivan's taxpayers.



It would be remiss if no comment were made on the potential impact on Sullivan of the present State of New Hampshire financial position. In 1982, the town received directly the amount of \$33,294.42 in state intergovernmental transfers. In all likelihood, the 1983 amount will be reduced because of percentage cuts or other loss of funds by the town or by the school district.

Finally, we should like to formally recognize a new group of volunteers in Sullivan - Sullivan Rescue. With a membership of eight, this group provides emergency first aid and stabilization treatment to the sick and injured in the community. In these depressed economic times, we commend the spirit of "volunteerism" exhibited by this group and appreciate the benefits received by the community from their efforts.

Voted, by voice vote, to raise and appropriate the sum of \$40,886.00 to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year.

### ARTICLE 3

Voted, by voice vote, to raise and appropriate the sum of \$37,934.21 for the maintenance of highways and bridges and construction of the same for the ensuing year as follows: \$24,451.21 to be raised by taxes and \$13,483.00 to be withdrawn from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under provisions of the State and Local Assistance Acts of 1972.

### ARTICLE 4

Voted, by voice vote, to accept and appropriate the sum of \$8,265.79, that being Highway Subsidy and Additional Highway Subsidy for the maintenance of highways and bridges and construction of the same for the ensuing year.

### ARTICLE 5

Voted, by voice vote, to establish a Capital Reserve Fund for Highway Equipment Purchase, and to raise and appropriate and place therein the amount of \$1,500.00 and to designate the Selectmen as agents of the Town, authorized to make withdrawals from said Fund.

### ARTICLE 6

Voted, by voice vote, to raise and appropriate the sum of \$505.59 for Town Road Aid in order to receive the full State's share of \$3,371.00.

### ARTICLE 7

Voted, by voice vote, to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,200.00 for the operation of the Police Department and the purchase and maintenance of equipment for the Police Department.

### ARTICLE 8

Voted, by voice vote, to raise and appropriate the sum of \$8,870.00 for the operation of the Fire Department for fire protection and purchase and maintenance of equipment and buildings for the Fire Department and/or other fire expenses.

ARTICLE 9

Voted, by voice vote, to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,338.60 to provide and maintain public library service and authorize the Library Trustees to receive and use supplemental funds otherwise provided.

ARTICLE 10

Voted, by voice vote, to raise and appropriate the sum of \$700.00 for the care and maintenance of Town cemeteries.

ARTICLE 11

Voted, by voice vote, not to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 to add to the existing Capital Reserve Fund for the purpose of capital improvements to the Town Hall.

ARTICLE 12

Voted, by voice vote, to amend, to take \$4,000.00 from the current surplus, for the purpose of revaluation of the Town to be added to the existing Capital Reserve Fund and authorize the Selectmen as agents of the Town to make withdrawals from said Fund to carry out the purpose for which it was established.

ARTICLE 13

Voice vote to defer Article 13 until after Article 25 was declared undecided by the Moderator. A show of hands was declared to close for call. A ballot vote

ARTICLE 14

Voted, by voice vote, to support the Town's continued participation in the existing regional solid waste facility located in Keene, N.H. and agree that a future solid waste facility may be located in the Town of Sullivan.

ARTICLE 15

Voted, by voice vote, to require municipal licenses for public dances sponsored by other than non-profit organizations, subject to a fee to be determined by the Selectmen and authorizing selectmen as agents of the Town to be the disbursing and enforcing authority of said Licenses according to the following: (RSA 31:39)

1. Application for license for recurring dances will be made to the Selectmen no later than 1 December for the coming year. Application for a one-time dance will be made to the Selectmen no later than ten (10) days prior to the dance. Application for the license in the year 1982 must be made no later than 30 March 1982, and the fee will be pro-rated to reflect the voting date of this article.
2. Failure to make application and receive license will result in a fine of not more than \$25.00 per day until license is granted.

#### ARTICLE 16

Voted, by voice vote, to require municipal license for all coin-operated amusement devices subject to an annual fee to be determined by the Selectmen.  
(RSA 31:41-d)

1. Application for license will be made to the Selectmen no later than 1 December for the coming year. Application for license in the year 1982 must be made no later than 30 March 1982, and the fee will be pro-rated to reflect the voting date of this article.
2. Failure to make application and receive license will result in a fine of not more than \$25.00 per day until license is granted.

#### ARTICLE 17

Voice vote was declared undecided by the Moderator.  
A show of hands           25 opposed  
                                  45 in favor--to require municipal license for food service establishments subject to an annual fee as established by the Selectmen. Licensee is further subject to semi-annual health inspections with a fee to be determined by the Selectmen and health officer. (RSA 31:39)

1. Application for license will be made to the Selectmen no later than 1 December for the coming year. Application for license in the year 1982 must be made no later than 30 March 1982, and the fee will be pro-rated to reflect the voting date of this article.
2. Failure to make application and receive license will result in a fine of not more than \$25.00 per day until license is granted.



## ARTICLE 18

Voice vote was declared undecided by the Moderator.

                                 52 in favor--to accept the following ordinance: No trash, garbage, refuse, slash or any other kind of rubbish shall be disposed of or permitted to remain within fifty (50) feet of any boundary line or right of way subject to a daily fine to be determined by the Selectmen, not to exceed \$50.00 per day and authorize the Selectmen as agents of the Town to be enforcing authority of the above ordinance. (RSA 31-29)

## ARTICLE 19

Voice vote was declared undecided by the Moderator.  
A show of hands      10 opposed  
                                 42 in favor--to pass over this article which was to require a permit from the Selectmen to build or to place any structure, or to alter or add to, or to convert any structure to any business of industrial use.

## ARTICLE 20

Voted, by voice vote, to sell, after an appraisal, the small piano in the East Sullivan Town Hall at a price agreeable to the Selectmen.

## ARTICLE 21

Voted, by voice vote, to pass over this article, which was to designate the Selectmen as agents of the Town authorized to sell or otherwise divest the Town of property (land and buildings) acquired at Tax Sale.

## ARTICLE 22

Voted, by voice vote, to authorize the Selectmen to apply for and to accept and expend on behalf of the Town any and all gifts, grants or other funds which may now or hereafter be forthcoming over and above the total appropriations voted by the Town.

ARTICLE 23

Voted, by voice vote, to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

ARTICLE 24

Voted, by voice vote, to accept the reports of Agents, Auditor and Committees as printed in the Town Report.

ARTICLE 25

A standing ovation was given to Harvey W. Swett for his many years of service to the Residents of the Town of Sullivan.

Suggestion was made to see if Trust Funds accounts could earn more interest.

Voted, by voice vote, not to adjourn Town Meeting to May 25, 1982.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Sullivan in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at East Sullivan Town Hall in said Sullivan on Tuesday, the eighth (8th) day of March, next at 1:00 P.M. of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To vote on the following: "Are you in favor of the adoption of the zoning ordinance as proposed by the Planning Board?"

You are hereby notified to meet at the East Sullivan Community Hall on Thursday the 10th day of March next at 7:00 PM of the clock in the evening to act on the following subjects:

3. To vote to raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to contract for computer services for the maintenance of its tax records as prescribed by RSA 8-C:11 and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$600.00 for this purpose or take any action relating thereto.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$37,193.02 for the maintenance of highways and bridges and construction of the same for the ensuing year as follows:

\$23,392.11 to be raised by taxes

\$13,800.91 to be withdrawn from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972; or take any action relating thereto.

6. To see if the Town will vote to accept and appropriate the sum of \$10,081.98, that being the Highway Subsidy and Additional Highway Subsidy for maintenance of highways and bridges and construction of the same for the ensuing year; or take any action relating thereto.



7. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Capital Reserve Fund for Major Equipment Purchase for the Highway Department and place therein the sum of \$2,000.00 and to designate the Selectmen as Agents of the Town authorized to make withdrawals from said fund to carry out the purpose for which it was established; or take any action relating thereto.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$503.15 for Town Road Aid in order to receive the State's full share of \$3,354.37.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2500.00 for the operation of the Police Department and the purchase and maintenance of equipment for the Police Department; or take any action relating thereto.

10. To see if the Town will vote to accept the gift of a 1968 Cadillac Rescue Vehicle from the Town of Sound Beach, Long Island, New York, and designate the vehicle for use by the Sullivan Fire Department; or take any action relating thereto.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$9,202.50 for the operation of the Fire Department for fire protection and purchase and maintenance of equipment and building for the Fire Department and/or other Fire Department expenses or take any action relating thereto.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,339.00 to provide and maintain public library service and authorize the Library Trustees to receive and use supplemental funds as provided; or take any action relating thereto.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$700.00 for the care and maintenance of Town Cemeteries.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 for the purpose of revaluation of the Town to be added to the existing Capital Reserve Fund and to designate the Selectmen as agents of the Town authorized to make withdrawals from said fund to carry out the purpose for which it was established; or take any action relating thereto.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00 for capital improvements to the East Sullivan Community Hall and to establish a Capital Reserve Fund for the same and place therein the amount of \$2,500.00 and to designate the Selectmen as agents of the Town authorized to make withdrawals from said fund to carry out the purpose for which it was established; or take any action relating thereto.

16. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue, subject to gates and bars, the so-called Boulder Road beginning at the junction of Nurse Path and leading to the Sullivan-Stoddard Town line; or take any action relating thereto.

17. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the so-called "Bingham Road" beginning at the junction of the same and Gilsum Road and leading to the beginning of the formerly discontinued portion of said "Bingham Road"; or take any action relating thereto.

18. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the so-called "Old Ellis Mill Road", subject to gates and bars, beginning at the junction of Ellis Road and the Old Ellis Mill Road leading to the west side of Otter River and to include that section of the so-called Warren Road from the Nowill place (#115) to the Old Ellis Mill Road.

19. To see if the Town will vote to accept the following Cemetery Trust Funds:

Neil A. and Nadine B. Henry	\$200.00
Ellison B. and Marguerite Brooks	\$200.00

20. To see if the Town will vote to establish the Winch Trust Woodlot as a Town Forest under RSA 31:110-114 thereby making the Town eligible to receive assistance from the Division of Forests and Lands of the New Hampshire Department of Resources and Economic Development for the preparation of a forest management program consistent with the original provisions of the Winch Trust.

21. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint the Trustees of Trust Funds to serve as the Forestry Committee to be responsible for the management of the Town Forest.

22. (By petition) "To see if the Town will vote to go on record in support of immediate actions by the Federal Government to control and reduce acid rain which is harmful to the environment and economy of Sullivan and to the health and welfare of the people of Sullivan.

These actions shall include:

1. Reduce by at least half the major cause of acid rain, sulfur dioxide emissions, by the year 1990.
2. Conclude negotiations and adopt a treaty with the government of Canada that will commit both nations to this same goal.

23. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell and convey any Real Estate acquired by the Town during the period until the next Town Meeting and that the Selectmen be authorized to sell and convey such Real Estate by auction, sealed bid, or in any other manner as justice may require; or take any action relating thereto.

24. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply for, and to accept, on behalf of the Town, and to expend any and all gifts, grants or other funds which may now or hereafter be forthcoming over and above the total appropriations voted by the Town.

25. To vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

26. To vote to accept the reports of the Agents, Auditor and Committees as printed in the Town Report.

27. To transact any other business which may legally come before this meeting and to listen to opinions of a purely advisory nature in regard to the conduct of Town affairs for the ensuing year.

## NOTICE TO PROPERTY OWNERS

A new law effective April 1, 1978 imposes a penalty for failure to file a fully completed inventory form.

"RSA 74:7-a Penalty for Failure to File. Any person who fails to file a fully completed inventory form on or before April 15, unless granted an extension under RSA 74:8, shall pay a penalty of one percent of the property tax for which he is liable. In no case, however, shall the penalty be less than \$10 or more than \$50. Any person who fails to file an inventory form and who becomes liable to pay the penalty specified in this section shall lose his right to appeal any matter pertaining to the property tax for which he is liable or exemptions to which he may be entitled. This penalty has all the force of taxation and shall be treated as incident to the tax."

Inventory blanks are mailed before March 25 as required under RSA 74:5, but if for any reason you fail to receive one, you should contact the Selectmen to obtain one and complete it as required above.

The Town of Sullivan still requires the use of inventory forms. Current Use, Veteran, and Elderly Exemptions must be applied for annually on the reverse of the inventory.

## HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT REPORT 1982

The first four months of 1982 seriously depleted the highway budget; high costs for snow removal during those months meant that summer road maintenance was kept to a minimum.

Major reconstruction of three sections of road was completed with TRA and Duncan funds. Future reconstruction areas are being considered carefully.

The age and condition of the equipment is still a problem for the town. Maintenance is on-going and equipment has to be used cautiously to avoid larger maintenance and repair costs.

The Road Agent and Selectmen will continue to set priorities for road maintenance and reconstruction to see that work will be done within the constraints of budget and equipment.

## SULLIVAN VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT

The Sullivan Fire Department wishes to thank the many people who have donated money for services rendered in the past year. The department has purchased one scott air pack and one new extension ladder.

We have four new members: Richard and Barbara Labadie, Pam Gladu and David Sayre.

This year the fire department has responded to two chimney fires, three auto accidents, three brush fires, one pig peg fire; responded to Gilsum for a trailer fire and one structure fire. The department cleaned thirty chimneys; this alone helps to cut down on a lot of fires.

We now have a dry hydrant at the bridge and we are in hopes of putting in another dry hydrant this coming year.

The chicken bar-b-que and dunk tank at the summer-fest was a success.

The Sullivan Volunteer Rescue Squad was put into service on June 22, 1982, which I might add was a surprise to all the squad members. We didn't know that Keene Mutual Aid had us listed as "In Service" and we got "Toned" to respond to an emergency at 6:30 in the morning.

It has been a fast year for us. It all started when Mr. Fred Heemsoth donated a 1968 Cadillac Ambulance to our town. A search thru our fire department found ten willing people to take the 160 hour each, Advanced First Aid and CPR sessions. Some how we managed to tear cars apart, calm our squeamish stomachs and eight became licensed by the State of N.H. as ambulance attendants and two certified in CPR.

Our next step was to start supplying the "Rescue Squad" with some equipment. In just five short months, with the help of alot of people, we have stocked the rescue squad with approximately \$1000.00 worth of equipment.

We want to thank all the towns people who baked for our bake sale and those who bought also. Thank You to all the generous contributions we have received. We will become familiar faces in town and our only

goal is to provide basic life supporting emergency care.

As of this date, November 30, 1982 we have responded to eleven calls, three of which were last week alone, with a total of 145 man hours. Although each call was medical emergency, two were motor vehicle accidents, none have been life threatening.

Anyone interested in becoming a Rescue Squad Volunteer should have taken and passed the necessary first aid courses, including oxygen therapy, auto extrication, child birth and advanced first aid course. Our meetings are the first and third Thursday's of each month. We meet at the fire station at 7:30 P.M.

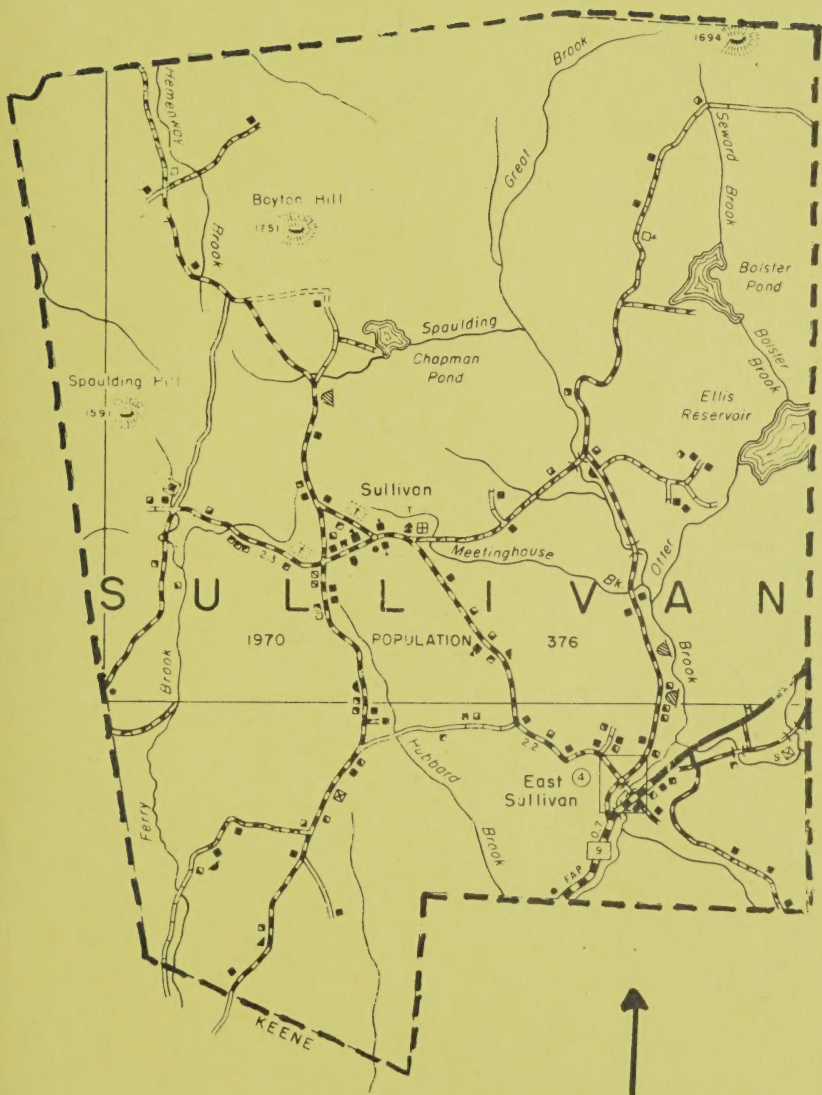

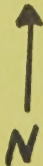
