## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

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### TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Troy in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in Said Town on Tuesday, the 14th day of March next, at 10 A. M. in the forenoon for the election of Town officials elected by ballot, balloting on Article 2 as set forth in the warrant, and you are hereby requested to meet at the Troy Elementary School on the same day at 8 P. M. in the evening for consideration of the remainder of the articles in the following Warrant:

Article 1. To bring in your votes for a town clerk, one selectman for three years, one selectman for one year, town treasurer, tax collector and all other officers chosen by ballot.

Article 2. To bring in your votes relative to the zoning ordinance as proposed by the planning board for the Town of Troy.

Article 3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray the following town expenditures for the ensuing year;

- a. Town officers salaries
- b. Town officers expenses
- c. Election & Registration
- d. Town Hall & other buildings
- e. Parks & Playgrounds
- f. Legal fees & vital statistics
- g. Insurance
- h. Social Security

- i. Interest-temp. loans
- j. Memorial Day
- k. Town dump
- l. Street Lighting
- m. Civil defense
- n. Pine Blister control
- o. Monadnock Regional Association

Article 4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for winter highway maintenance.

Article 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for highway oiling and general maintenance.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate a sum not to exceed \$6175.00 for the purpose of making improvements to the following Class V road in Troy: Road #63-Mackey Road so-called, such sum to be raised through the issuance of bonds or notes under and in compliance with the provisions of Chapter 241, New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, as amended, and to authorize the Selectmen to determine the date and place of payment of such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon and to take such other steps as may be necessary to negotiate such bonds or notes as shall be to the best interests of the Town of Troy.

Article 7. To see if the town will vote to accept the present highway known as Cranberry Hill Road, beginning at the intersection of North Main Street, for a distance of 840 feet, and 30 feet wide.

Article 8. To see if the town will vote to appropriate a sum of money for the purchase of a new highway truck and body, and authorize the selectmen to make the necessary arrangements.

Article 9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the support of the fire department.

Article 10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for alterations and improvements to the fire station.

Article 11. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the police department.

Article 12. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the maintenance and operation of the water department.

Article 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the employment of a district nurse.

Article 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money as its share of the operating cost of the Elliot Community Hospital.

Article 15. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the War Memorial Program.

Article 16. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the support of the Gay-Kimball Library.

Article 17. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the care and improvement of cemeteries.

Article 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for Public Welfare.

Article 19. To see if the town will vote to raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the payment of the water bonds and interest thereon.

Article 20. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money to pay town charges.

Article 21. To see if the Town will vote to become a member of a regional planning agency. This agency will have membership of at least two of the municipalities in the Keene area. The objective of this agency will be to plan for and en-

courage regional planning analysis, provide consensus on major problems of regional concern, and to assist in the effectuation of projects which extend beyond the boundaries of a particular town.

The agency will be established pursuant to the State enabling act (RSA 36:37-44)

The agency will have no jurisdiction over any matter of local affairs. It will be primarily, advisory. Two members of the regional planning agency shall be from Troy to be appointed by the Selectmen.

A "YES" vote is in favor of joining the regional planning agency.

Article 22. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 as its share of the cost of a study to determine the feasibility and approximate cost of a Sanitary Sewer System and Treatment Plant or Plants, to jointly serve the Town of Marlboro, Swanzey, Troy and the City of Keene. The objective of this study is to provide information, for consideration at the 1968 Town Meetings, relative to the feasibility, cost and economic advantage of an area Sewerage Treatment facility.

Article 23. To see if the town will vote to change the open days of the town dump from the present days to the following:

Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday and Sunday.

Hours open to be discussed and acted upon at town meeting (By petition)

Article 24. To see if the town will vote to change the method of choosing the Road Agent from appointment by the Selectmen, to a direct vote of the town. (By petition)

Article 25. To see if the town will vote to change the method of choosing the Chief of Police from appointment by the Selectmen to a direct vote of the town. (By petition)

Article 26. To see if the town will vote to change Water Street and Prospect Street or parts thereof from one way streets to be opened to two way traffic. (By petition)

Article 27. To hear the reports of agents, officers or committees heretofore chosen, and take any action relating thereto.

**REPORT OF TRUSTEES OF GAY-KIMBALL LIBRARY  
FUND FOR YEAR ENDING DEC. 1966**

Several improvements have been made in the library building this year. Aluminum combination windows were purchased for all windows. Two new double electrical outlets were installed in the children's room. Repairs to our water system now insure water 12 months a year.

12 new adult chairs were purchased and 2 tables have been added to the children's room.

71 adult fiction books and 90 adult non-fiction books have been purchased. 73 juvenile fiction and 31 juvenile non-fiction books have been added.

Attendance at the library is led by the juveniles with 1,276 coming to the library. 1,224 teenagers attended, followed by 937 adults, and 133 pre-choolers.

Juvenile books led in circulation with 2,481 books. This was followed by 1,469 books in the fiction category and 1,374 books in the non-fiction category.

A library open-house which featured movies and refreshments and a contest for the children highlighted library week. The Area Womans Club Art Contest winners were exhibited at the library in February. From June 5 to June 25 an exhibit of the work of Mr. Oscar T. Carlsson was displayed at the library. November featured an exhibit "Art for Enjoyment", a collection of paintings and art work by area artists who paint for fun.

The trustees thank the librarian, Mrs. Dorothy Lagrenade, Mrs. Francis Childs, substitute librarian and Miss Mary Callahan and Miss Judy Syria, assistant in the children's room for their contributions and interest.

The Friends of the Library have again this year made many contributions of time, effort, and material. They have been responsible for furnishing readers for children's story hours on alternate Thursdays throughout the year. They have presented the library with a portable stereo record player which will receive wide use.

Contributions of books, records, and magazines by various citizens of Troy are deeply appreciated.

Your library has been open two additional hours this year to better serve you. The trustees and staff of the Gay-Kimball library urge you to visit the library often and to make use of the new facilities which the library offers.

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## FIRE RECORD

Fire records are made by people — those who cause fires and those who control them. Your forest fire warden, deputy wardens, fire chief and firemen have, in spite of a prolonged drought, made one of the best fire control records in recent years. Despite a very dry spring, we in New Hampshire working together, have substantially reduced our fire incidence (885 in 1965 to 595 in 1966.)

This enviable record is largely due to two factors:

1. A closely coordinated and integrated state-town organization jointly carrying out programs of forest fire prevention, training and suppression with dedicated personnel.
2. Your appreciation of our forest fire control program and your individual effort in practicing fire prevention.

Statistics show, however, there is room for improvement. Major problems are still with us; (1) the careless disposal of cigarettes; (2) the householder's carelessness in burning rubbish; (3) the failure of woodlot owners and contractors to completely extinguish their brush burning fires; (4) failure to extinguish camp fires; (5) unsupervised children playing with matches.

New Hampshire has 4,339,000 acres of woodland to be protected. In 1966 we experienced 595 forest fires on this area and restricted acreage burned to 395 acres — a fine testimonial to the efficiency and dedication of the men who make up our forest fire control organization.

1. If you must burn you will need a permit. Permits are not issued between 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M. except on rainy days. Permits are not needed when the ground is covered with snow. To minimize risk the best way to dispose of rubbish is at your authorized town or municipal dumping area.
2. Be sure all discarded smoking material is out.
3. Don't leave a live camp or cooking fire.
4. Most important — Instruct your children that matches are not play things.
