Meeting called to order at 9:00 a.m. by the Moderator, Scott F. Eastman. Voted to dispense with reading the articles in the Warrant at this time. Voted to close the polls at 10:00 p.m.

Article I: To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

Article II: To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for same.

The recommendation of the Finance Committee was \$20,850.00. Harold Flanders moved \$20,850.00 be raised and appropriated to defray town charges. Vote was affirmative

Article III: To choose Delegates to the Constitutional Convention.

Article IV: To vote on the Question, "Shall Sweepstakes Tickets be sold in this Town"?

Ballots Cast: 423 Yes 324 No 99

Article V: To make provisions for the collection of taxes.

Upon motion by Gerald Hight, it was voted to leave the collection of taxes up to the selectmen. Vote was in the affirmative.

Article VI: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow on behalf of the Town in anticipation of taxes; said loans to be payable from taxes for 1964, and to issue notes therefor, in the name of the Town, at such rate of interest and payable at such time and place within one year as the Selectmen may decide.

Everett Chase moved that this article be adopted as read. Vote was in the affirmative.

Article VII: To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount on taxes.

Henry Fisher moved this article be dismissed. Vote was in the affirmative.

Article VIII: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of highways and bridges and take any other vote in relation thereto.

A motion by Harold Hall for \$18,000. under this article was voted down. Leonard Hall then moved \$15,000. be raised and appropriated for maintenance of highways and bridges. After discussion vote was in the affirmative.

Article IX: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for general expenses of the Highway Department.

Walter Hodgman moved that \$7,000. be raised and appropriated for general expenses of the Highway Dept. Discussion followed and the vote was in the affirmative.

Article X: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,586.75 to be used with the sum of \$10,578.32 to be furnished by the State, for Class IV and Class V construction, Reconstruction and Betterment Aid.

Henry Fisher moved that this article be accepted as read. Vote was in the affirmative.

Article XI: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Weare Police Department.

Robert Clement moved that \$1,000 be raised and appropriated for the Weare Police Department. Discussion followed and the vote was negative. Walter Hodgman moved that \$1500. be raised and appropriated under this article. Vote was in the affirmative.

Article XII: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Weare Fire Department.

Gerald Purington moved that \$4,000 be raised and appropriated for the Weare Fire Department. Discussion followed and the vote was in the affirmative.

Article XIII: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of cemeteries.

George Buxton moved that \$800 be raised and appropriated for the care of cemeteries. Vote was in the affirmative.

Article XIV: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for band concerts.

George Buxton moved that \$400 be raised and appropriated for band concerts. Vote was in the affirmative.

Article XV: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Weare Public Library.

Henry Fisher moved that \$400 be raised and appropriated for the Weare Public Library. Vote was in the affirmative.

Article XVI: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the observance of Memorial Day.

It was moved and supported that \$200 be raised and appropriated for the observance of Memorial Day. Vote was in the affirmative.

Article XVII: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$200 for the Water Safety Program.

John Dwinnells moved that \$200 be raised and appropriated for the Water Safety Program. Discussion followed and the vote was in the affirmative.

Article XVIII: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$225 for the support of the Concord Hospital.

John Dwinnells moved that \$225 be raised and appropriated for the support of the Concord Hospital. Heated discussion followed and the vote was in the negative. Robert Crosby then moved that this article be dismissed. By standing vote the count was:

> Yes 86 No 41

This article was dismissed.

Article XIX: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 for White Pine Blister Control.

Henry Fisher moved this article be accepted as read. Discussion followed. The vote was in the affirmative.

Article XX: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Civil Defense.

George Welch moved that \$400 be raised and appropriated for Civil Defense. Discussion followed. The vote was in the affirmative.

Article XXI: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of celebrating the Town of Weare Bi-Centennial in July 1964, and take any vote in relation thereto.

George Buxton moved that \$2000 be raised and appropriated under this article. Discussion followed and a report was given as to plans of the celebration in regard to entertainment, parade, tour of old buildings, and school alumni meetings. Vote was in the affirmative.

Article XXII: To see if the Town will vote to accept the Zoning Ordinances as recommended by the Planning Board and take any other vote in relation thereto.

Richard Perkins moved that this article be dismissed. Vote was in the affirmative.

Article XXIII: To see if the Town will vote to include the road from Weare Center Store - known as "Memorial Drive" to Clinton Grove in the Town Road Aid Plan. (By Petition)

George Buxton moved that this article be accepted as read and part of it be done in 1964 if possible. Discussion followed. It was suggested that the Duncan Fund money be used this year on this road if possible. Vote was in the affirmative.

Article XXIV: To see if the Town will vote in accordance with the terms of Contract No. DA-19-016-CIVENG-59-419, as amended, between the Town and the Government, to authorize the Selectmen to discontinue, vacate and abandon in accordance with existing State law, all the roads and highways or portions thereof within the Hopkington-Everett Dam and Reservoir Area, of which the abutting land is now owned by the Government; namely, Sugar Hill Road, Cross Road (also called Sewell Hoyt Road), Middle Road (also called Dunbar Road) and State Highway 77.

Richard Perkins moved that this article be accepted as read. The vote was in the affirmative.

Article XXV: To see if the Town will vote to purchase two snow plows, and raise and appropriate a sum of money for the same, and take any other vote in relation thereto

Bernard Phelps, Jr., moved that this article be dismissed. After much discussion, the vote was in the negative. George Merrill then moved that \$1960 be raised and appropriated to purchase two snowplows. The vote was in the affirmative.

Article XXVI: To see if the Toun will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100 for the Town Forest.

Gordon Brown moved that \$100 be raised and appropriated for the

Town Forest. It was brought out in discussion that with thinning and re-seeding a goodly return could be gotten for mo ney spent. Vote was in the affirmative.

Article XXVII: To see if the Town will note to dispose of a certain tract of land at Chase Park to Mildred Mouthrop, and take any other vote in relation thereton.

George Sawyer moved that the Town dispose of a certain tract of land at Chase Park to Mildred Moulthrop for \$1.00. Discussion brought out that this was a narrow strip of land, about twelve feet wide at its widest point, between the present property owned by Mildred Moulthrop and the adge of the lake, and of no current value to the Town.

Gerald Hight amended this motion to include a similar strip of land bordering the Vintinner property and that it be disposed of to the Vintinners' at the same price of \$1.99 on each strip. Vote was in the affirmative.

Article XXVIII: To see if the Town will vote to allow the David Eaton family to ese the water from the Town's supply at a nominal fee, and take any other vote in relation thereto.

Everett Chase moved that the Town allow the David Eaton family to use the water from the Town's supply and that the Selectmen set a nominal fee to protect the Eaton family and the Town. Vote was in the affirmative.

Article XXIX: To see if the Town will vote to elect the Police chief for a one year term, and if accepted, that the vote will be taken by ballot. That future candidates for Police Chief will file with the Town Clerk, and take any other vote in relation thereto. (By Petition).

Frederick Cleveland moved that this article be dismissed. A vote by paper ballot was requested.

Total vote cast was 155 Yes 79

No 76

This article was dismissed.

Article XXX: To see if the Town will vote to elect the Fire Chief in the future. (By Petition).

Richard Perkins moved that this article be dismissed. After discussion, the vote was in the affirmative.

Article XXXI: That a person shall not hold office of Selectman and School Board Member at the same time. (By Petition).

Howard Ineson moved that this article be accepted as read. A Vote by paper ballot was requested.

Total vote cast was: 127 Yes 46 No 81

The motion was defeated.

Article XXXII: To see if the Town will vote to relinquish the right of way of the North end of the Martin Road, from 114 to the new right of way constructed in 1963, to Gordon Brown, and take any other vote in relation thereto.

Henry Fisher moved that this article be accepted as read. Vote was in the affirmative.

Article XXXIII: To see what sum of money the Town of Weare, would vote to raise and appropriate to continue the Whitten Case. (By Petition)

A motion was made by Wilfred Lahey, and duly seconded, to dismiss this article and continue the Whitten Case. A request for an explanation and facts on the case was called for. Attorney Winslow Osborne gave this explanation. Discussion followed and the vote was unanimous in the affirmative.

Article XXXIV: To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the purchase of radio equipment for the Weare Police Department, or take any other vote in relation thereto.

Wendell Colburn moved that \$1,000.00 be raised and appropriated for radio equipment for the Weare Police Department. Discussion followed and the vote was in the affirmative.

Article XXXV: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Little League,

A motion to raise and appropriate \$100.00 for the support of the Little League was duly seconded. Discussion followed. Vote was in the affirmative.

Article XXXVI: To see if the Town will vote to close, subject to gates and bars, a section of the Old Barnard Hill Road, from the new Barnard Hill Road to the land owned by the Government.

It was moved and seconded that this article be accepted as read. Vote was in the affirmative.

Article XXXVII: To transact any other business, that may legally come before this meeting.

Leonard Hall moved that bids be required on all purchases by the Town of \$100.00 or over. This motion was seconded and a standing count was requested. Discussion followed.

> Vote - Standing Yes 26 No 40

The motion was lost.

A report on the North Weare Dam was given by Walter P. J. Brennan as to its condition and he believed it was in good condition now and that the beavers had done repair work on it sufficient to keep it from leaking at this time.

Walter Hodgman moved, and it was duly seconded, that a purchase order, signed by the Selectmen, be required for all articles purchased in the name of the Town. Vote was in the affirmative

Proceeded to count the ballots. Newly elected officers were sworn in by the Moderator.

Voted to adjourn at 4:30 a.m. March 11th, 1964.

WARRANT FOR 1965 TOWN MEETING THE TOWN OF WEARE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Weare in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall, Weare Center in said Town on Tuesday, the ninth day of March, next at one of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 5. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount on taxes.
- 6. To see what sum of money, the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of highways and bridges, and take any other vote in relation thereto.

- 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Weare Police Department.
- 10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Weare Fire Department.
- 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of Cemeteries.
- 12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Band Concerts.
- 13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Weare Public Library.
- 14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the observance of Memorial Day.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the Water Safety Program.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the support of the Concord Hospital.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 for White Pine Blister Control.
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to accept the Zoning Ordinances as recommended by the Planning Board and take any other vote in relation thereto.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to lay out a Class V Highway over the Peaslee Hill Road, so called, starting at Old Route #77 and extending to Brown's Corner. RSA 234:1 (by petition)

- 20. To see if the Town will vote to request the State Tax Commission to make a complete re-appraisal of the lands and buildings within the Town, to equalize valuations in accordance with the law, and to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the same.
- 21. To see if the Town will vote that no person may hold more than one Town Office, Position or job, so called, at one time in any year, following the date of the March 1965 Town Meeting. (by petition)
- 22. To see if the Town will vote to adopt this article, that all Hawkers and Peddlers obtain an eight dollar (\$8.00) License from the Town Clerk before battering or selling any goods, wares or merchandise in the Town of Weare, New Hampshire. This License to be signed by the Chief of Police and a majority of the Selectmen.
- 23. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to take all necessary action to cause the posting of reasonable speeds along the highways within the Town in accordance with the provisions of the State Law.
- 24. To see if the Town will vote to elect a Police Chief for the present year 1965 and in the future years, and if approved, nominations can be taken from the floor. Said election to be done by secret ballot (by petition)
- 25. To see if the Town will vote that no person shall locate or maintain a motor-vehicle junk yard, except that after public hearing, in which evidence on both sides is heard, the Selectmen shall have authority to decide whether a permit for such motor-vehicle junk yard shall be granted, which shall conform with RAS 367.

The Term "motor-vehicle junk yard" as used herein, shall mean any yard or field used as a place of Storage in which there are displayed to the public view two or more unregistered motor vehicles which are unfit for reconditioning for use on the highways, or used parts of motor vehicles or materials from motor vehicles, the sum of which parts or materials shall be equal in bulk to two or more motor vehicles.

Whoever violates this ordinance shall be fined not more than \$25.00 and in addition \$10.00 per day for every day such violation continues after a conviction for a violation of this ordinance. (by petition)

- 26. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to investigate the possibilities of procuring a water supply for the Town from Mt. William Pond, and to contact the proper Government Agencies for advice on the same, and take any other vote in relation thereto.
- 27. To see if the Town will vote to raise the Town Officers' Salaries.
- 28. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE WEARE POLICE DEPARTMENT

During 1964 the Department was called on about 150 cases. Accidents top the list a continued increase. Two fatal accidents occured. Several resulted in injuries. The Rescue Squad assisted at most accidents. Motor Vehicle violations also showed a marked increase. Breaks, larcenies, and cases involving juveniles showed marked decrease. Much stolen property was recovered.

Patrol was continued nights and other unscheduled periods. We feel that this operation was very worthwhile and is appreciated by the residents of Weare. It involved 181 hours time, 1,752 miles of travel, and cest \$368.89

A two way radio network was purchased consisting of a base station and four mobiles. It has been of great assistance in our work. An additional radio on the State Police frequency was purchased second hand. This has been very helpful as much of our work is in conjunction with the State Police.

Two new men were appointed which has increased our efficiency. The records and filing system department were reorganized and a clerk appointed to keep them in order.

Other much reeded equipment was purchased consisting of badges, belts, holsters, handcuffs, etc. The men themselves purchased uniforms, guns, and other necessary items.

The services of the Department are donated at Lawn Parties, Band Concerts, Winter Carnival, Memorial Day, School Plays, Graduations and Funerals. The Rescue Squad also serves without pay at accidents and other emergencies.

It is impossible for the police to keep track of the people who are floating around a town such as Weare both day and night. Breaking into houses when no one is home is a common practice. They ring the bell or knock and if no one appears to be home they enter and carry off what they want. Peddlers may be looking over your place. Take numbers of cars in your vicinity, ask for identification of strangers. License numbers and descriptions will help us to discourage such persons and aid in catching up with them.

REPORT ON THE WEARE, NEW HAMPSHIRE BICENTENNIAL

Our gala Bicentennial Celebration in July, heralding the twohundredth anniversary of the incorporation of the Town of Weare, was the paramount event of 1964 for many of the town's citizens.

Planned for many months by the Bicentennial Committees, prepared for by the men, who sprouted luxuriant beards, and by the ladies, who designed elaborate period costumes, the celebration officially began on Thursday, July 9th. Since a great many people returned to Weare to participate in the celebration, most of the first day was devoted to renewing old acquaintances and to making plans for attending the various scheduled events, the first of which was the Little League Baseball game on Thursday afternoon.

A capacity crowd filled the elementary school gymnasium and vigorously applauded the Minstrel Show presented by the talented young people of Weare on Thursday evening. The show was staged against a well-executed backdrop, depicting a village blacksmith scene, painted by a Weare man. Immediately following the show, an elaborate display of fireworks was set off in front of the school.

On Friday, July 10th, many people enjoyed a tour of twelve homes, both old and modern, graciously opened to the public by their owners. Following the tour, refreshments, prepared by the Church Circle, were served in the Federated Church of North Weare.

Ending the day, 350 people attended a public supper which was served in the elementary school gymnasium. In the evening, the young people twisted, frugged, and Watusied at a record hop and entertainment held expressly for them.

On Saturday morning, a spectacular display of color and pagentry was presented to more than 5000 people who cheered the Bicentennial Parade which wound its way along a long route through the town and past a reviewing stand where each unit was described by the Master of Ceremonies. It was vividly evident to the crowds who viewed the parade that long hours had gone into the design and the execution of the many colorful floats participating in the parade. Several hundred people who watched the parade climaxed Saturday morning by attending the chicken barbecue served to them under a large tent set up on the lawn near the library building.

Following the barbecue, His Excellency, Governor John W. King, brought official greetings from the State of New Hampshire to the Town of Weare, and the Honorable James Cleveland, United States Congressman, presented the town with a flag that had been flown over the United States Capitol in Washington, D.C.

Governor King and Congressman Cleveland also spoke at the dedication of the Everett Dam and Park, held on Saturday afternoon. The featured speaker at the dedication was the Honorable Harry C. McPherson, Deputy Under Secretary of the Army. Music for this important and well-attended occasion was furnished by the 39th Army Band and by a soloist from Deering, New Hampshire.

On Saturday evening, approximately 250 Weare High School Alumni gathered in the tent on the library lawn to partake of a dinner catered especially for them. Since a large number of former students had traveled long distances to reminisce with their classmates, the Alumni Banquet proved a memorable event.

Following the Alumni Banquet, the Bicentennial Ball, held in the elementary school gymnasium, culminated the varied activities of Saturday. Six-hundred dancers and spectators enjoyed the music furnished by the Allen Kendall Orchestra, and observed the cake-cutting ceremonies, after which a slice of cake was served to everyone present. The gymnasium was handsomely adorned for the occasion with attractive flower arrangements and other appropriate decorations.

The gymnasium, used for so many Bicentenary activities, was the scene of Community Church Services on Sunday morning, July 12th, with Dr. Daniel Poling and Reverend Earle Fellows conducting the moving service. Music was provided for the service by an organist and two soloists. The Bicentennial Committee was honored to have these two men accept its invitation to enrich Weare's celebration in this significant way.

On Sunday afternoon, a gymkhana horse show was presented at the Kamp field on Quaker Street. Prizes were awarded by the judges to the winners of each of the sixteen exciting classes of the gymkhana. This was the first time that an event of this kind had been held in the Town of Weare and was declared to be a successful part of the Bicentennial by the huge crowd attending the affair.

Bringing the four eventful days of the Bicentennial to a close on Sunday evening, the Weare Band performed a concert for a large audience gathered in Weare Center for this final event. During the four days, a carnival show was operated daily on the elementary school grounds, and proved to be very popular with the young people. Other well-attended events, open each day, were the antique show, held in the Town Hall, the Old Book Sale, and the Hobby Show. In addition, refreshment booths were open every day.

The Bicentennial Celebration, which proved to be successful far beyond our expectations, was enhanced immeasurable by the spectacular four-tiered birthday cake, 12 feet by 12 feet in size, and illuminated with 200 electric candles, that was displayed on the lawn of the Town Hall for a month before the Bicentennial, and that was the focal point of the celebration itself. The impressive glittery pink cake, with the dates 1764-1964 inscribed in large numerals on one of its tiers, was a tremendous attraction for local people, and also to tourists who photographed it innumerable times. The cake was designed, built, and decorated by a local contractor.

In addition to the festive air contributed by our Birthday Cake, the gay period costumes created by the local women and the impressive beards grown by some of our hardier citizens added a gala atmosphere to our two-hundredth birthday party. Those who made this extra effort to make our celebration a success were rewarded when they were judged by Governor and Mrs. King and awarded prizes for their efforts.

Those attending the celebration should be commended for their orderly behavior at all times. We are pleased that the first aid station was not used once during the entire four days.

On behalf of the people of the Town of Weare, the chairmen of the Bicentennial wish to thank humbly and sincerely the chairmen and the workers of the various committees for their tireless endeavors to make the celebration the successful and satisfying event that it proved to be. The committee accomplished with distinction their many duties and responsibilities, spent long hours, and traveled countless miles to complete the tasks that they undertook to do.

Now that the celebration is a part of our past, may we all realize in the future the satisfying fulfillment of our plans and carry in our hearts everlasting memories of the beautiful and eventful Bicentennial of our beloved Town of Weare, N.H.

REPORT OF YOUR FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND YOUR DISTRICT CHIEF

The 1964 forest fire season surpassed the record year of 1963 in both length and severity. For the second successive year, we experienced a rainfall deficiency of more than ten inches and the compounding of such drought conditions, together with the many days of strong, dry winds, characterized 1964 as one of the most hazardous years in the past half century. Although our fire season was three weeks longer than that of 1963, the number of fires showed only slight increase and more remarkable was the fact that the area burned dropped from 2280 acres in 1963 to 900 acres in 1964. Early detection and rapid response kept many potential fire disasters from becoming reality. We all owe a debt of gratitude to the men in this community who responded and fought our fires so efficiently. Our state is now 86% wooded and its economy - both industrial and recreational - is greatly dependent on this forest resource. The responsibility for adequate fire protection of this great area - 4,350,000 acres - is everyone's responsibility and prevention is one of our most effective tools.

Prevention is good common sense.

- 1. Take your rubbish to the town dump. If you must burn, obtain a permit and watch your fire until it is dead out.
- 2. Instruct your children in fire safety. Keep matches from young children. Explain to them the dangers of lighting matches and making outdoor fires.
- 3. Be sure discarded smoking material and matches are out.

A major portion of our preventable fires this year are chargeable to three causes: (1) permit fires allowed to escape; (2) children playing with matches; and (3) smokers. Let's be mindful of the fact that all such fires endanger property and lives

We wish to thank you for your very fine cooperation during the past fire season and with your continued cooperation we are confident that we can improve our fire record in 1965.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE WEARE VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT

The Weare Fire Department answered 37 calls during 1964: 2 Building fires, 7 Chimney fires, 2 Out of Town Building Fires, 17 Brush and Grass fires, 4 Car fires, 1 Clothes Dryer fire, 1 Rubbish fire and 3 fires at the town dumps. The number of building fires is very small and losses were very low with only minor damage to the building involved. The increase in brush and grass fires is not good. Burning of rubbish, and fires set by children are the biggest causes.

Children playing with matches and setting fires present a serious problem. Children should be warned of the dangers of playing with fire, and matches kept away from them. The brush fires were all kept small but many of them can be avoided by burning only with a permit from the Forest Fire Warden when conditions are safe.

Twelve monthly meetings were held and several drills were held. Training sessions one night a week are being conducted starting last November. Instruction in the use of equipment and methods of fire fighting are being taught. It is impossible for men to get experience on fires which fortunately are few and small.

Over 250 calls were answered by the Red Network System including the 37 fires, about 100 calls for Police, 18 calls for the Rescue Squad and numerous for information, power failure, locating persons, Etc. We once again thank the Operators of this important system and wish to emphasize that this service is available 24 hours a day to anyone needing assistance in any emergency. Dial 8-2333 and stay on the phone. Give the operator all information possible: name, road, part of town, former owner (if you are a new resident), nature of emergency and any additions.

The Ladies Auxiliary carried out their usual program: Serving our Annual Dinner, A christmas Party, Strawberry Festival and lunches at fires. These services are greatly appreciated by the members of the Department.

During the year the following equipment was added: A smoke ejector, a 1500 watt generator, 4 coats, 2 reels for the booster hose, one each on #1 and #4 trucks.

Truck #4 purchased in 1949 was given a complete brake job, which it needed badly. Age catches up with grease seals and hydraulic cylinders and cups. The tank in this truck was repaired

and a gated 1½ inch outlet installed to the rear for the live line. This addition makes all four trucks alike in the operation of their preconnected lines. These additions to our equipment have already proved very helpful.

The Company purchased with its own funds 2 Johnson portable radios which are of great value in any emergency. A test of the radios and a road test of the trucks is held once a month.

The Rescue Squad was called out 18 times on accidents and other emergencies: lost children and transportation of seriously ill persons. A donation of \$500.00 was made to the Fire and Police Departments by Mr. Ronald T. Lyman of Boston, Mass. who was involved in a serious accident. He, his wife and son were taken to the hospital. This money was used to purchase a complete set of Hydraulic rescue equipment and an electric saw for cutting metal, wood etc. This equipment is a welcome addition to our emergency equipment and will make our work more efficient.

The apron in front of the Sugar Hill Station was covered with Hot Top and the aprons of the other two stations were sealed to preserve them. The outside of the Central Station was coated with a white sealer which keeps moisture out of the walls and and adds much to the looks of the building. The south side of the station will have to be shingled this year.

Much time has been given by the members this year in maintaining the equipment and the stations. We wish to thank all who have assisted in this necessary work.

We have several new, young, interested members but need more men who are available during the daytime. We have lost several members this year by death and moving away from town.

We wish to thank those who have assisted in Department in our efforts to give better fire service to the people of Weare.

RECORD OF SCHOOL MEETING - MARCH 5,1964

The meeting was called to order by the Moderator, Scott F. Eastman, at 6:00 p.m.

Lyhl Perrigo moved, and it was supported, that the reading of the articles in the warrant be dispensed with at this time. Vote was in the affirmative.

The polls were declared open for voting at this time for: (1) Moderator; (2) Clerk; (3) 3 members of the School Board for 3 years and (4) Treasurer.

At 8:00 p.m., the Moderator declared the polls closed, voting to be resumed later in the evening.

- ARTICLE 5: Recommendation by the budget committee was \$155.00 (the same as last year). Howard Ineson moved, and it was supported, that the sum of \$155.00 be fixed as compensation for salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer. Vote was in the affirmative.
- ARTICLE 6: No action was taken on this article. Article passed.
- ARTICLE 7: It was moved by Howard Ineson, and duly supported that the Town Auditors audit the School District accounts. Motion carried.
- ARTICLE 8: The Finance Committee recommended the sum of \$172,633.55 for the school budget.

Wendell Colburn requested an additional \$1,000 for the operation of the school busses. After lengthy explanation by Mr. Colburn as to why additional money was needed (i.e. more children, making more stops, repairs, etc.,) it was voted to raise the additional \$1,000.00.

It was moved and duly supported that the District raise and appropriate the sum of \$173,633.55 for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes of the town. Motion carried.

ARTICLE 9: It was moved by Andre Hines, and duly supported, that the district raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000 to be used for the purchase of library and reference books. Motion carried.

ARTICLE 10: Lyhl Perrigo discussed at length the Industrial Arts Program. He had talked with authorities on the subject and was told that "if the Town cannot do this well, do not attempt to do it at all". The cost of such a program is very high — \$18,000 just for equipment; another teacher would be required, etc., probably bringing the total cost of the program for the first year in the vicinity of \$25,000. Discussion followed.

Mr. Perrigo was also told that the current class and set-up the school had was a fairly good one. Also, any boy really interested in such a course could go to any one of the various schools which have adopted this course, and the State will pay the tuition.

Mr. Engleberger moved, and it was supported, that this article be dismissed. Vote in affirmative.

ARTICLE 11: Howard Ineson moved, and it was supported, that this article be dismissed.

Lyhl Perrigo said he felt that more people would vote if both elections were held at the same time.

Much discussion followed.

Walter Brennan acted as Moderator to give Mr. Eastman an opportunity to say a few words regarding this article.

In his opinion, Mr. Eastman said, the main advantage was that a greater number of people would vote since they would be coming to the Town Meeting anyway, (and they might not choose to go to the School Meeting in itself as it would not or might not - hold the same interest for them). He also stated that the individuals running for school offices would feel better by being elected by more people than just a few.

Mr. Eastman thought to adopt this article would expedite the school meeting, that it would be a step forward in combining both elections and prove to be an economy move as well.

Because the voting could not be tabulated by "yes" or "no", it was moved and supported that voting by ballot be done.

- ARTICLE 14: Mr. Eastman brought up the question of the preparation of the ballots for election of the school District Officers. He was of the opinion that the School officers would still prepare the ballots as in the past, but that the Town Officers would receive and count them. Wendell Colburn moved, and it was supported, that this be incorporated in Article 11. No discussion, vote in affirmative.

At 8:40 p.m. polls re-opened, and were closed at 10:30 p.m., after which the ballots were counted.

To the School Board and Citizens of Weare:

I herewith submit my annual report relative to the Weare Central Elementary School and the Weare High School.

The total enrollment for the 1964-65 school year is 368, by grade as follows:

There were only three changes in teaching staff this year with Mr. Foley in the Junior High School, Richard Levesque in the High School and Miss Byam in the elementary school grade 1, a new position.

Modern Mathematics has been introduced in all grades with all teachers having participated in courses dealing with methods and materials in the teaching of modern mathematics.

An additional classroom was added to the elementary system this year with the renovation of one of the rooms in the Weare Central School. The additional grade was necessitated by a was large grade one enrollment, the first double grade in the Weare Central School.

Continued improvement has been effected in the high school in the vocational agriculture program under the direction of William Menzi, Agriculture Teacher; in the science department by Mr. Louis LaForce; in the library by Michael Theall; by Mrs. Janet Moulton, commercial department, as well as in all of the other departments.

Weare is fortunate to have dedicated teachers in its schools. The school board is making an honest effort to maintain a competitive salary schedule and satisfactory school facilities properly equipped to attract and retain competent teachers.

In the Weare Schools we are attempting to give each boy and girl a good foundation in the 3 R's, provide a wide range of real and vicarious experience, and to relate the work and experience of the secondary school to the needs of the students.

The needs of youth are suggested by the following developed by the National Association of Secondary Principals. All youth need to:

- (1) develop salable skills and those understandings and attitudes that make the worker an intelligent and productive participant in economic life.
 - (2) develop and maintain good health and physical fitness.
- (3) understand the rights and duties of a citizen of a democratic society, and to be diligent and competent in the performance of their obligations as members of the community and citizens of the state and nation and the world.
- (4) understand the significance of the family for the individual and society and the conditions conductive to successful family life.
- (5) know how to purchase and use goods and services intelligently, understand both the values received by the consumer and the economic consequences of their acts.
- (6) understand the methods of science, the influence of science on human life, and the main scientific facts concerning the nature of the world and of man.
- (7) develop their capacities to appreciate beauty in literature, art, music and nature.
- (8) develop respect for other persons, to grow in their insight into ethical values and principles, and to be able to live and work cooperatively with others, and to grow in the moral and spiritual values of life.
- (9) grow in their ability to think rationally, to express their thoughts clearly, and to read and listen with understanding.

The schools of Weare, as the schools in every city and town in America, must be continually evaluated for assurance that the outcomes of our educational process satisfy the needs of youth as outlined above.

I wish to express my appreciation to the citizens of Weare for the excellent support given to the educational effort, to the school board for their dedicated service and direction, and to the principal, teachers, and students for their sincere endeavors to attain excellence, and to the Supervisory Union Staff, Spiro Anastos, Teacher Consultant and Mrs. Ruth Kenk and Mrs. Harold Smith for their devoted service.
