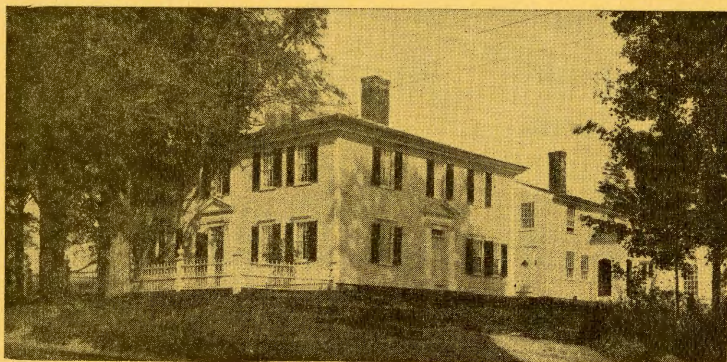

TOWN WARRANT

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Windsor in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Woodrow residence in said Windsor on Tuesday, the 14th day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same and an overdraft, 1949, of \$63.50.
3. To hear reports of Auditors and Agents heretofore chosen and to pass any vote in relation thereto.
4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for repairing highways and bridges.
5. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid on its highways and raise and appropriate \$28.62 as the town's share.
6. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
7. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired through Tax Collector's deeds.
8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$21.96 for the street light for the ensuing year.
9. To see what action the town wants to take in having a property map made.
10. To see if the town will vote to replace the old fire pump which is beyond repairs and appropriate money for same.

11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$8.00 (a sum not exceeding one one-hundredth of one per cent of the assessed valuation based on the assessment of 1949 for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the town, together with other towns in the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region Association.

12. To transact any other business that may lawfully come before said meeting.
