

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Alexandria in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Alexandria on Tuesday, the 12th day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see how much money the town will raise for the maintenance of highways and bridges except snow work.

4. To see how much money the town will raise for plowing and sanding roads in the winter.

5. To see if the town will accept Town Road Assistance and raise \$586.44 for the same.

6. To see if the town will vote to elect one trustee of Trust Funds to replace the present board of three trustees.

7. To see if the town will vote to have street lights installed in the centre of the village and raise money for the same.

8. To see if the town will vote to erect a memorial to World War II veterans.

9. To see what kind of a memorial shall be erected and raise and appropriate money for the same,

also to elect a committee to purchase and erect such memorial.

10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate money for the improvement of cemeteries.

11. To see if the town will raise \$400.00 for Blister Rust control.

12. To see if the town will vote to raise \$52.00 for the Lakes Region Association for advertising the advantages and attractions of Alexandria.

13. To see if the town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting, and make appropriation for the same.

14. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
