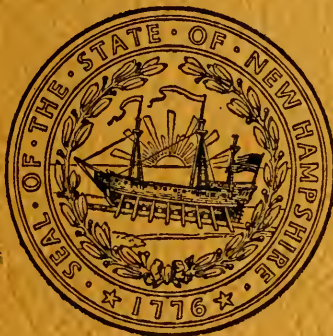

TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Bartlett in the County
of Carroll, in said State, qualified to vote in Town
affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said
Bartlett on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March next, at ten
o'clock in the forenoon and until six o'clock in the afternoon to
act upon the following subjects.

ARTICLE 1. To choose necessary town officers for the
ensuing year.

ART. 2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and ap-
propriate the sums of money called for in the budget as pre-
pared by the Selectmen.

ART. 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the
Selectmen to borrow necessary sums in anticipation of taxes.

ART. 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the
Selectmen to distribute the blank inventories at the time they
examine and appraise the property to be taxed.

ART. 5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the
Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired
by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds.

ART. 6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the
Selectmen to have charge of snow removal work, by authority
as given under Section 5, Chapter 188, of the 1945 Revised
Laws.

ART. 7. To see what action the Town will take toward securing a Town dump, or dumps, and to see what sums of money, if any, they will raise and appropriate for same.

ART. 8. To see what action the Town will take about transferring the Defense Building, so called, in Bartlett village, to the Francis P. Murphy Post, No. 5386, V.F.W., of Bartlett.

ART. 9. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

Forest Fire Warden's Report

HELP YOUR FOREST FIRE WARDEN PREVENT FIRES — IT PAYS!

Prevention is one of the most important phases of all fire effort. This is particularly true of forest fire control work. Preventing forest fires preserves valuable forest growth and other property, conserves man power and permits their use in productive channels, saves taxpayers' money and conserves fire fighting equipment.

The prevention of forest fires is the most important and difficult part of the work of your forest fire warden who heads a local organization set up primarily for the security of your community's forest property. Appointed by the State Forester, upon recommendation of the Selectmen, he is charged by law with the responsibility of local administration of forest fire laws, fire prevention and suppression. In his work he is aided by deputy forest fire wardens who, in emergency, may assume his power and authority. The warden is guided in his work by instructions received from the State Forester and by the District Fire Chief who represents the State Forester.

The importance and value of the work of the forest fire warden and his deputies is, perhaps, best appreciated during hazardous periods when fire danger is greatest. The public, however, looks to him at all times for speedy and economical suppression of going fires.

To properly fulfill his mission, the warden needs the generous and understanding cooperation of the public at large. He attempts to secure this cooperation by the posting of caution notices, news items and by word of mouth, always carefully explaining the necessity of restrictions imposed. In the matter of giving cooperation, however, the public often

fails. The record shows that an average of 7,300 acres of woodland are burned over by forest fires in New Hampshire each year. Analysis of fire causes reveal the fact that more than 98 percent of all forest fires are, consistently, the result of human carelessness and are preventable.

The careless smoker fails to properly extinguish his cigar, cigarette or pipe ashes or thoughtlessly throws them from the car window; the debris burner fails or refuses to consult the warden, as the law requires when the ground is not covered with snow, before attempting to burn; campers fail to properly extinguish their fires or frequently build fires when conditions are unfavorable.

The elimination of human causes from the forest fire problem is the answer. This is not as difficult of accomplishment as it might appear at first glance. Let each one who reads this—

1. Use ordinary common sense with fire in and near woodland.
2. Comply with requirements on the use of fire in and near woodland and when the ground is not covered with snow, secure written permission to burn from the forest fire warden.
3. Be careful when smoking in or near woodlands. Don't throw lighted material from moving vehicles.
4. Cooperate with and assist the warden and urge others to do so.
5. **HELP YOUR FOREST FIRE WARDEN PREVENT FIRES**—his efforts are only as effective as is the cooperation you give him!

Report of Superintendent

To the School Board and Citizens of Bartlett:

Over 300,000 teachers have left the profession since 1941 to enter positions of greater pay and for other reasons plus the fact that there are but 32 elementary pupils at Keene and Plymouth combined, means that it will be very difficult to secure new teachers for the coming school year.

All positions were filled this year and the additional teacher at Lower Bartlett has greatly improved that school.

During the past school year the Upper Bartlett school was given two coats of paint. This was the only major item of repair although new steps were made at the grammar school in Bartlett and the high school furnace was repaired. I believe that the Bartlett Grammar and high schools should have the rooms given one coat of paint.

It is interesting to compare the cost of education in Bartlett with the average cost in New Hampshire. For the 1944-45 school year, the latest figures available, it cost Bartlett \$102.97 for each elementary pupil and the average for the State was \$112.29. The cost for Bartlett High School for the same year was \$191.54 per pupil and the average for the State was \$158.03. The increased costs of carrying on the schools, especially the amount paid to teachers, will make the average per pupil cost higher for this year, and it appears that there will be a sharp increase for the 1947-48 school year. School budgets are being increased throughout New Hampshire up to 40% for the coming year.

The work of the Lower Bartlett P.T.A. under the direction of Mrs. Anna Martin, president, has been outstanding in the noon lunch program which they have sponsored. Some Federal funds have been secured for the purchase of equipment and are being received for the partial payment of meals. The balance has been provided by the P.T.A. and the pupils.

I want to thank the members of the school board, the teachers, janitors, and all others who have assisted in the schools this year.
