Solicitor's Report

TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS FOR THE COUNTY OF CARROLL:

Below is submitted report of Solicitor for the County of Carroll since April 1, 1907, at which time my term of office commenced.

At the June term of Superior Court indictments were found as follows:

Keeping for sale cider,	2
Keeping for sale intoxicating liquor,	12
Adultery,	2
Larceny,	1
Breaking and entering in the night time,	1
Aggravated assault,	1
Assault with intent to kill.	1

At the December term of Court the following indictments were found:

Aggravated assault,	1
Bigamy,	1

Keeping for sale intoxicating liquors,	4
Breaking and entering in the night time,	2

And one information filed by County Solicitor, for fornication.

Of the indictments thus found only three have been brought to trial before the trial jury, resulting in one conviction for assault, one for breaking and entering in the night time and one acquittal on the charge of aggravated assault. The other indictments, with the exception of eight, have been disposed of by such plea as the Court and County Solicitor deemed for the best interests of the community to accept, and have resulted in numerous fines and, in some cases, imprisonments.

Of the eight indictments still upon the criminal docket found during the terms of Court aforesaid, the respondents in six of them are in parts unknown; and in the other two, the respondents are serving terms of imprisonments upon other charges.

Especially in obtaining indictments against liquor sellers, it has been a great source of annoyance to solicitors in the past and to the present solicitor, that interested parties have brought illegal influences to bear upon witnesses who were summoned before the Grand Jury. At the last June term of Court, in two cases, there were commitments for contempt; one of a witness for misconduct before the Grand Jury, and the other for tampering with this witness by an interested party. It is believed

that these contempt proceedings and proceedings of this nature in every case where such influences are brought to bear in the future, will materially assist in alleviating the difficulties mentioned.

There have been no civil cases in which the County is engaged during the year.
