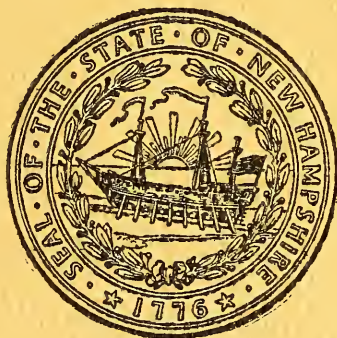

ART. 3. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount on all property taxes paid before July 1st and if so how much.

ART. 4. To see what the Town will do in regard to plowing dooryards for the ensuing year.

ART. 5. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT

To the School Board and Citizens of Chatham:

The boys and girls in Chatham are fortunate in having such capable teachers as Miss Lucretia Chandler in the Eastman School and Mrs. Edna Pitman in the Green Hill School. In both schools the standard of educational and social development is very good. The pupils show a fine appreciation of the educational opportunity with which the taxpayers of Chatham provide them.

It is gratifying to know that there are six pupils from Chatham who are attending Fryeburg Academy this year. They are Betty Haggerty, grade 9; Ralph Emerson, Lyle Wiggin, Richard Hill, Ronald Hill, grade 10; and Norman Eastman, grade 11.

There is a bill in the present session of the State Legislature which if passed and sufficient money appropriated would give Chatham an increase in State Aid from \$2,083.57 this year to \$3,169.61 for the 1947-48 school year. The Legislature will probably not make a final decision on this until after the annual school district meeting. If this money is available, it will help to offset the increased cost of the schools.
