TOWN WARRANT

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

CARROLL, SS.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Conway, County of Carroll qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House at Center Conway, New Hampshire, March 13, 1951, at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers.
- Art. 2. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the following purposes:
- Section a Town officers' salaries
 - b Town officers' expenses
 - c Election and registration
 - d Municipal Court
 - e Expenses Town Hall and other buildings
 - f Town office expense
 - g Police department
 - h Fire department
 - i Health department
 - j Town dump
 - k Vital statistics
 - 1 Town maintenance of highways—Summer and Winter

- m Libraries
- n Town poor
- o Old age assistance
- p Memorial Day
- q Soldiers' aid
- r Parks and playgrounds
- s Damages and legal expenses
- t Interest, on temporary loans and bonds
- u Payment on bond issue
- v Insurance
- w County taxes
- Art. 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to distribute the blank inventories at the time they examine and appropriate the property to be taxed.
- Art. 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire upon the credit of the Town the sum of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000.00) if needed.
- Art. 5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint a competent highway Supervisor and do away with electing a road agent each year. This vote to come effective in 1952 to remain in effect until recinded at some future meeting.
- Art. 6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to purchase the Littlefield lot in the rear of the town garage and to work in conjunction with the School Board in building a storage shed, for the storage of school buses and town equipment and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for the same.

- Art. 7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to contract for the installation of parking meters in the Town, in those places where parking creates unnecessary congestion. And that the revenue from same be applied to the police department.
- Art. 8. Shall the provisions of Chapter 171A of the revised laws relative to the playing games of beano be adopted in this town. The same to remain in effect until recinded at some future meeting.
- Art. 9. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1000.00 to be expended by the Ralph W. Shirley Post, American Legion for a Memorial Park and Playground to be supervised by said Legion Post. Agreeably with a petition signed by Arthur J. Wiggin and others.
- Art. 10. To see if the Town will vote to accept a further extension of Pollard Street in Conway Village as deeded to the Town by Damon and others.
- Art. 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$280.00 for Memorial Day to be divided as follows: \$70.00 to each of the following: W. R. C., Ralph Shirley Post American Legion, North Conway Legion Post No. 95 and the Veterans of Foreign Wars, with the understanding that these four organizations will work together in purchasing flags, etc. And Memorial Day exercises.
- Art. 12. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen of Conway to accept a road as surveyed by Roger Burnell of Conway in the plan of land of Louise Wagg Potter. The same road way to be deeded to the Town of Conway by Louise Wagg Potter and giving access to thirty-one house lots, some of which are already under development. These lots being in the vicinity of Oak St., Conway Village. Agreeably with a petition signed by Lillian F. Demeritt and others.
- Art. 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$523.87 to the White Mountains Region Association, being 10c per \$1000 (1/100th of 1% of the assessed valu-

ation of the Town for the previous year, for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter and advertising and otherwise publicizing the advantages of the Town, in cooperation with the other towns of the region.

- Art. 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 for State Aid Construction to be expended on the Kearsarge road, said amount to be matched two to one by the State. And to raise and appropriate \$1,009.50 for Town Road Aid to be laid out on class five roads, with the State contributing \$6,730.03, and to raise and appropriate \$3,830.00 for class IV mileage trunk line urban extensions to be used to match available Federal funds and the State will contribute \$3,830.00.
- Art. 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of four hundred dollars (\$400.00) to assist in the operation of the Conway and North Conway Information Booths, this sum to be divided equally between the two booths; agreeably with a petition signed by Wendell Woodbury and others.
- Art. 16. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Moderator to appoint a Budget Committee, said appointment to be made on or before April 1, 1951. Agreeably with a petition signed by H. C. Lovejoy and others.
- Art. 17. To act upon any other business that may legally come before said meeting.



Report of Police Department

A total of 98 cases were handled by the Conway Municipal Court in 1950, excluding juvenile offenders.

Cases brought to court by the Conway Police Department consisted of the usual offenses, such as speeding, driving under the influence of intoxicating liquor, reckless driving, driving after suspension of license, and without registration, drunk and disturbing the peace and non-support.

In addition to the arrests 59 accidents were investigated, 43 warnings were issued, not including many verbal warnings, for minor motor vehicle violations. Twenty-two drunks were taken home or temporarily locked-up for safe keeping, and 98 tramps were lodged at the police station. A total of 21 criminal investigations were made, some in co-operation with other law enforcement agencies in New Hampshire and other states. Our records show 2 cases of help in locating lost or missing persons, 24 cases concerning family disputes, or disturbances, 78 automobiles out of gasoline, or otherwise stranded, and 318 telephone calls the past year, which were handled any time throughout the night or day.

Records, concerning many of our duties, are not available as that amount of detail would require too much time to be spent doing office work. To mention a few of these duties are: letters which are answered, messages delivered, fingerprints taken, information to tourists, investigations of juvenile cases, and work at the police station.

Considerable amount of time was spent in Conway the past summer helping with bicycle safety work. The bicycles of nearly all the grade school students were inspected, in co-operation with other volunteers. Also the distribution of approximately 650 booklets on bicycle safety to grade school students throughout the town. These booklets were bought by the donations of several business men. Six donors in Conway and six in North Con-

way bought over 50 large safety calendars, and these have been posted by the police department.

I hope and believe we have wisely used the 1950 appropriation of \$4,800. However, due to the area of the town, the total population, including visitors and the distribution of this population in several villages, plus the amount of police work throughout the year, I recommend raising enough additional money to acquire the services of one other full time officer.

Report of Forest Fire Wardens

Each year two hundred thousand forest fires annually burn over 36 million acres of the forest land of this great nation. This area is roughly the size of our New England states. Tens of thousand of man-hours costing over 40 million of dollars are used in combating these fires. They destroy valuable mature timber and new growth, and leave desolation and often death in their wake. With the large deficit in rainfall the past four to five years the need for extreme caution is great.

Every brush, grass or forest fire that you have in your town has its effect on you in several ways; such as increased taxes, loss of mature timber, marring of the landscape and spoiling the recreation value of our country side. It is safe to say that approximately 97% of the fires occurring in this state are mancaused and because all man-caused fires are preventable, remember — only YOU can prevent forest fire.

Our forest fire organization is doing a grand job in keeping our fires small, but the public in general is becoming increasingly careless in discarding matches and cigarettes. Another form of carelessness is the neglect to secure the required permit from the town fire warden to burn brush or use an incinerator in or near woodlands. It is YOU and YOU alone who can help correct this shameful waste of our natural resuorces by:

- 1. Seeing that your incinerator is tight and is sitting on clean ground.
- 2. Always clean a space about any open fire to prevent its spreading.
- 3. Never burn in dry windy weather.
- In all cases a written permit is required from your town Fire Warden.

It is with your co-operation that this shameful waste of timber and money can be stopped.

Superintendent's Report

To the School Board and Citizens of Conway:

The Conway School District has received no general State Aid for the last two years. The present State Legislature has a plan proposed by the State Board of Education which, if passed, will pay Conway several thousands of dollars. It is interesting to know that no other state gives from state revenue so little financial help to the local districts.

The operating budget for 1951-52, which is recommended, calls for a sum from local taxes of approximately the same amount as was raised last year. At the March, 1950 meeting the District voted by means of a special article to set aside \$10,000.00 towards a new elementary building. Including this \$10,000.00 the total raised by local taxes in 1950 was \$134,156.59. The operating budget for 1951-52, as recommended, including \$10,000.00 for a new building, will be \$134,303.04.

The tuition rate for next year in High School will be \$200.00 per pupil. This pays for items that may legally be charged for tuition purposes, which include teachers' salaries, books, supplies, janitors, fuel, repairs, health, the High School share of retirement, Superintendent's salary, administration, and Union budget. It also provides about \$17.00 per pupil for rent of the building and equipment.

The School Board believes that a sound policy of employing the teachers is highly desirable and have studied in detail many schedules and suggestions. A salary schedule and statement of employment practices have been prepared and submitted to the teachers for their consideration.

Your Building Survey Committee has worked very hard in

gathering the facts and has presented the critical elementary building situation to you in a report. I urge you to support the committee's recommendation.

A Citizens Committee composed of two representatives from several civic organizations was invited to meet with the School Board to discuss school problems. Several meetings have been held and I hope as a result of such work there will be a better public understanding of the educational problems of the school district.

My sincere thanks are extended to the School Board, teachers, Survey Committee, Citizens Committee, town officials and all others who have helped to make the past year worthwhile.
