

## Town Warrant

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the town of Jackson, in the county of Carroll in said state qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Jackson on Tuesday, the tenth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- 2. To raise such amount of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for the same.
- 3. To see what amount of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for highways and bridges.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum necessary to secure State Aid maintenance of highways.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum necessary to secure State Aid for trunk line maintenance of highways.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum necessary to secure State Aid for construction of highways.
- 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay on the town debt.
- 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum necessary to tarvia the road from the Glen Ellis House to the covered bridge.
- 9. To see what action the town will take in regard to fire protection.

- 10. To see if the town will take any action relative to the State reports.
- 11. To see if the town will take any action relative to schoolhouse in district No. 5.
- 12. To see if the town will raise and appropriate any money for the control of White Pine Blister.
- 13. To act on any other subject that may legally come before the meeting.

## Librarian's Report

To the Board of Trustees of the Jackson Public Library :

I beg to submit herewith my report of the work done by the Library and a statement of its condition for the year ending Feb. 1, 1925.

The Library has been open 117 days. From July 1 to October 1 the hours were from 10 a. m. to 1 p. m. daily; and for the remaining months from 2 to 4 p.m. every Thursday. In this time the total number of books given out 3,282, a monthly average of 274 volumes and a weekly average of 63 volumes. The largest daily circulation was 80 volumes, Feb. 28, 1924.

There have been added to the Library by gifts 24 volumes and by purchase 17 volumes making the total number of volumes in the library 3,533. In addition to these, we have on file the following magazines: National Geographic, Nature Magazine, World's Work, Musical America, The Dearborn Independent, Good Housekeeping, Saturday Evening Post, Literary Digest, Woman's Home Companion, American, St. Nicholas, Needlecraft, Pictorial Review and John Martin.

We gratefully acknowledge gifts of books and money from friends and especially for the following donations:
