

TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

(L. S.) To the Inhabitants of the Town of Lempster in the County of Sullivan in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Lempster on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March, next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Interest on Debt.
- 4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to keep the Common mowed around the Soldiers' Monument at Lempster Street.
- 5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for State Aid Construction or Town Road Aid.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to allow the Selectmen to deliver blank inventories at the time they appraise the property for taxation.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to elect one Road Agent instead of three, to take effect in 1940.
- 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Home Day and Memorial Day.
- 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the Library.
- To see if the Town will vote to reinsure the Town Hall and Union Hall.
- 11. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money for the Town in anticipation of taxes.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to limit the Road Agents to the appropriations.

- 13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Old Age Assistance and pass any vote in relation thereto.
- 14. To see what sum per hour the town will pay for labor on the highway.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to receive sealed bids for moving town roads. A separate bid to be sent for each district.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the highway beginning one hundred feet beyond the buildings of the so-called Dexter Hosley place to the Goshen Town line.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$25.00 to be matched by the State for tools for fighting fires.
- 18. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the Fire Company.
- 19. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the Athletic Association.
- 20. To see what sum of money the Town will vote for Pine Blister Rust.
- 21. To see if the Town will vote to accept in trust the sum of \$125.00 from Mrs. S. S. Harris for the care of her lot in the East Lempster Cemetery.
- 22. To see if the Town will vote to accept in trust the sum of \$100.00 from James T. Nichols' Heirs for the care of his lot in the East Lempster Cemetery.
- 23. To see if the Town will purchase a few more acres of the adjoining land, to enlarge the Cemetery at East Lempster.
- 24. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

We have been very fortunate not to have any brush fires in the year 1938. Therefore, there is not very much expense, only posting notices and looking up fires for the Look-out Stations. I hope it will be the same this year, but we are facing the worst fire hazard that I have ever seen.

The storm of September 21, 1938, blew down and up-rooted such a vast amount of trees of every kind and leaves us to face a danger equal to none that we ever had before. With more than fifty per cent of the timber left lying in the woods makes one tremble when they think what could happen if some careless person should throw down a cigarette stub or a match that was not entirely out.

Fishermen, berry pickers, picnickers, and in fact every human being should be more careful than they have ever been before. People should not kindle fires at any time without a permit to do so, and should any person see any signs of a fire, he should notify the Fire Warden or some one just as soon as possible, for just a few minutes might save hundreds of dollars for the State and Town.

I know the Lempster Fire Company will be ready and willing to assist anyone at all times as they have always done in the past, which is indeed a help when you know that when you call them they will respond at once. I think the Town is very fortunate to have this company to look to in a time like this. We all hope that we do not have to call them at any time for help.

SCHOOL REPORT

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Lempster School Board:

I hereby submit my eighth annual report as your superintendent of schools.

Lempster is fortunate in having two able experienced teachers working in the schools. Miss Sing is teaching her second year at the East Lempster schood, with twenty-six pupils in the four lower grades. Mrs. Viola Horton is teaching the upper grades at the Street School.

I wish the citizens of Lempster would re-read a paragraph from my report in the issue of January, 1936. It deals with transportation.

In the year 1937-1938 Lempster paid for transportation \$2,151.00, but the state approved only \$1,748.00. In 1936-1937 Lempster paid \$1,759.00 and the state approved \$1,624.00. Before that time the transportation costs had been approved for near full amount of what Lempster had paid. The statements that transportation was too high came originally from citizens of Lempster, not from any state official. The state took the ground that if there is a less expensive way to transport, it could approve only that expense.

Last spring the state took the stand that it could approve only the cost of two buses. Lempster could transport her pupils by any method that was acceptable to the motor vehicle departement, but any extra costs would have to be paid by local taxation.

The roads in places are not suited for buses, especially in winter. I believe that the breaking of those roads is paid wholly from local taxes. I fear that a few bad storms might make it cheaper to pay for a more expensive transportation.

However, it is possible to rearrange the routes to overcome many of these difficulties. The contracts are for two years. At the end of that time it should be easy to determine which is best for the town and district. After all, the children are your best investments. Someone has said, "Roads are used to a great extent by people travelling through the town, but the schools by only those who live in it."

I wish to thank the school officials, the teachers, and citizens for their help and kindness.

The school health program includes regular health inspection, class room inspection, weighing and measuring, follow-up work, home visits, taking children to clinics or hospitals, and inspection before returning to school after sickness whenever the matter is brought to my attention.

I wish to thank the Superintendent of Schools, the School Board, the teachers, parents, pupils, and others for their splendid cooperation and interest in the health work.
