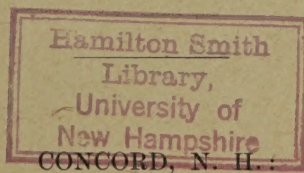

## REPORT OF SCHOOL BOARD.

---

The board of education respectfully submits the following report for the year ending February 15, 1903:

“Knowledge is in every country the surest basis of public happiness,” are the words of one of the founders of our republic, and most forcibly do they present the thought that our political safety as well, lay in the intelligence of its people, making it apparent that our common school is the corner stone of national architecture. During the year ended, as in previous years, we trust that much has been accomplished in our schools for the advancement of education.

The Cate schoolhouse has been shingled, the Lower Ridge and Yellow schoolhouses have received a coat of paint, the White schoolhouse has received interior repairs, while minor repairs have been made on other buildings. By referring to our treasurer's report it will be seen that our resources have been considerably more than last year, consequently we have had several weeks more of school than ever before.

We have made no changes in text-books during the year, believing that, as a whole, those now in use are among the best, and that not so much depends upon the text-book as upon the teacher.

Little need be said here of our teachers, as but few of them have been strangers in our schools. The fact that many of them have been retained term after term, or perhaps year after year, gives evidence that their efforts in our behalf have been appreciated and their services deemed of value to our town.

The demand of the day is for men and women who are representative of modern progress, and as the advance in education must come through the thought and activity of our citizens, let us seize every opportunity to help on this noble cause, and by so doing hasten the day of universal knowledge, peace and prosperity.
