# TOWN WARRANT State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of New Boston, in the County of Hillsborough, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are notified to meet at the town house in said New Boston on Tuesday, the ninth day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, polls to close at six o'clock P. M., to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary officers for the ensuing year.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for the same, or act in relation thereto.
  - (a) For town officers' salaries.
  - (b) For town officers' expenses.
  - (c) For election and registration.
  - (d) For the expense of the town hall.
  - (e) For the police department.(f) For the fire department.
  - (f) For the fire department.(g) For the health department.
  - (g) For the health dep(h) For vital statistics.
  - (i) For summer maintenance of highways.
  - (j) For winter maintenance of highways.
  - (k) For street lighting.
  - (1) For general expense of highway department.
  - (m) For support of the library.
  - (n) For town poor.
  - (o) For old age assistance.
  - (p) For Memorial Day and care memorial.
  - (q) For interest.
  - (r) For the payment of long term notes.
  - (s) For the town dump.
  - (t) For deficit.
- 3. To see if the town will vote to accept state aid for road construction of Weare Road, raise and appropriate the sum of \$272.00 providing the state will contribute the sum of \$2,544.00 or act in relation thereto.

- 4. To see if the town will vote to close, subject to gates and bars, a section of road 84 from a point 50 feet east of Lull bridge to a point 50 feet west of said bridge or act in relation thereto.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to close, subject to gates and bars, that part of road 70 that lies between the junction of road 70 with road 97 and the junction of road 70 with road 125 or act in relation thereto.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to close, subject to gates and bars, the road leading from the Wilton Road to South Hill, from the Wilton Road to a point near land of Walter Berry Heirs or act in relation thereto.
- 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for cooperation with the state in the control of white pine blister rust or act in relation thereto.
- 8. To see if the town will vote to give the selectmen authority to issue long term notes in the name of the town for cost of construction of Village bridge, said notes not to exceed \$8,000.00, or act in relation thereto.
- 9. To see if the town will vote to give the selectmen authority to execute in behalf of the town of New Boston, a stipulation as to just compensation for the estate in those of the roads and portion of roads involved in Civil Action No. 528, pending in the United States District Court for the District of New Hampshire, which are situated within the limits of the town of New Boston, or act in relation thereto.
- 10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding \$84.90 for the Merrimack Valley Region for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the material advantages and resources of the town in cooperation with the other 37 communities in this region.
- 11. To see if the town will vote to make road 123 a dead end street by closing the south end of the street where it joins route 13, or act in relation thereto.
- 12. To see if the town will vote to place a street light in Creamery Square or act in relation thereto.
- 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the use of the Town Planning Board, or act in relation thereto.

14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money in addition to the \$1,000 unexpended last year for the purpose of remodeling the kitchen in the Town House, or act in relation thereto.

15. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to sell or administer property of the town acquired by

tax deed or gift.

- 16. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to hire money to meet the necessary expenses of the town.
- 17. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to deliver inventory blanks at the time the inventory is taken.
- 18. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

#### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the School District in the town of New Boston, qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the 9th day of March, 1948, at 9 o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
  - 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
- 6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To choose Agents, Auditors, and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 8. To see if the district will vote to make any atleration in the amount of money required to be assessed for the ensuing year for the support of public schools and the payment of the statutory obligations of the district, as determined by the school board in its annual report.
- 9. To see if the district will vote to make alterations to the present high school building so-called, and to construct and equip an addition thereto.
- 10. To see if the district will vote to construct and equip a new four-room elementary school building.
- 11. To see if the District will vote to authorize the School Board to execute any and all contracts or agreements necessary, proper and advisable in connection with Article No. 9 and/or No. 10.

- 12. To see what sum of money the district will vote to raise and appropriate for such renovations, additions, or new construction as provided for in Articles No. 9 and No. 10, and in order to furnish such funds, to authorize the School Board to issue serial bonds or notes, maturing not longer than 20 years from date of issue, in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Bond Act, New Hampshire Revised Laws of 1942, Chapter 72, and Chapter 156, Laws of 1947.
- 13. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

# REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School District of New Boston:

I hereby submit my annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

The current school year opened wieh several changes in our teaching staff. Carroll E. Sanderson (formerly of Warner) replaced C. Edgar Stevens as headmaster and instructor in Vocational Agriculture. Sophie Gagalis of Manchester (as teacher in Social Studies) and Martha H. Colburn (in the primary room) replaced Gale Huntington and Helen P. Gutterson respectively. Althea B. Sanderson

was engaged to teach the upper primary room.

At the school district meeting of March, 1947 the problem of providing adequate housing for our increasing school population was discussed. One plan called for the upper two years of the high school to be provided for in neighboring high schools. A second plan called for the renovation of the Community House into a classroom unit. The latter plan was followed, and grades 5 and 6 were accommodated in that building when school opened last September. Although we have experienced minor difficulties in such an arrangement, by and large it has satisfactorily served its purpose.

However, present indications are that we are now in the same position as of a year ago. As you will see by the statistical table found elsewhere in this report, our primary room—Grades 1 and 2—now numbers 47, and indications are that we will have another large group entering grade 1 next fall. Not only should the entering grade 1 be set-up as a separate unit, but the present primary group should be divided. No teacher can be expected to secure successful educational results with a group of 47 pupils in two grades.

Obviously the school district is compelled to find added quarters before September 1 of this year. Several possible solutions have been offered, and your school board has tried to provide for them in its warrant. To the school

board there are three answers to the problem:

- 1. Construct an addition to the present school building, and completely renovate the interior. Our facilities in the present building are very inadequate for the number of pupils housed in the building. Not only are we short of classroom space, but our toilet facilities are very inadequate.
- 2. Transport the upper years of the high school to neighboring towns on a tuition basis, and—
- 3. Transport to other towns certain of our elementary pupils living near the town boundaries. (It is questionable if this plan will relieve our situation at points of greatest pressure.)

The reader may wonder why the suggestion of a cooperative high school is not included under the above solutions. The so-called cooperative school bill, which was passed by the state legislature in 1947 provided that two or more school districts could combine for the purposes of joint operation of one or more schools on either an elementary or secondary level. Briefly the bill provided that the districts so uniting would be called upon to bond themselves in the same ratio as existing between their equalized valuations. In other words, if New Boston, Goffstown and Weare were to form a cooperative district for secondary school purposes, New Boston would be required to carry 13.5% of the total bonded indebtedness. Operational costs would undoubtedly be shared on a per-pupil basis,—in the particular case suggested above, approximately 21%.

The primary reason for not including the cooperative school plan with the three suggestions above is that some solution must be reached by September, 1948, and to secure immediate agreement and action by several towns on a cooperative plan is an impossibility. Furthermore, New Boston's share of the bonded indebtedness of a cooperative school project would be of such proportions as to practically prohibit future borrowing on the part of the school district for the next 10 or 15 years, which would mean that the district would not be in a position to make any extended alterations in its school plant during that time. Certainly the proposition is worthy of serious consideration, but the facts are such that the solution can not be hastily approved.

New Boston's problem is indeed a serious one. As has been mentioned above, our present building is in need of extensive renovation. Educationally the present plant does not lend itself to an adequate program for the pupils. Under present conditions such phases of the accepted school program as music, art, physical education, noon lunch program, and many others can not be provided for. Whatever plan we follow, we should provide for that type of program which will best serve the educational needs of the young people of New Boston during the years ahead.

#### REPORT OF THE SCHOOL NURSE

Good health is given first place among the needs of children. All should be as healthy as possible, and should learn

how to remain healthy.

In our work with the school children, we have had, and continue to have, the support and understanding of the parents and the several organizations in the towns. These groups have been actively interested in aiding in correcting at least four of the outstanding and common defects found in school children; namely, teeth, vision, hearing and tonsils.

I would like to suggest that the child who is to enter school for the first time in the fall should have a thorough examination by a physician and by a dentist in the spring or early summer. This will allow the summertime for the correction of defects, and for vaccinations, also immunizations if needed. Frequent use of clinics afford an opportunity for an early diagnosis, treatments and corrections with little or no expense.

Nearly every pupil in our schools has had the Patch test for tuberculosis. In January, 1947 and again in November,

1947, 57 took the test.

A toxoid clinic was held May 27, 1947 for pre-school children. Five in the first grade were given the treatment. Nearly all of the other pupils had had this immunizing done before entering school.

In the fall of 1946, the beginning of our 1947 school year, about 160 pupils were examined by our school physician, Dr. Fraser. The following report shows the number of pupils affected, and the number of defects corrected at this time:

Defective vision, 19
Defective teeth, 120
Diseased tonsils, 6
Number of defects corrected, 17
Number of defects corrected, 86
Number of defects corrected, 3

There were three orthopedic cases who had a check-up at least once a year, and one is still under treatment. We have been quite free from any epidemics until this fall. Up to the present time we have had 29 chicken pox cases, and 2 mumps cases.
