STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

(L. S.) To the Inhabitants of the Town of Shelburne, in the County of Coos, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Shelburne on Tuesday, the eighth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
- 2. To hear the reports of town officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
 - 3. To hear the report of budget committee and act thereon.
- 4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the year ensuing and make appropriation of the same.
- 5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of town highways and bridges.
- 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for town road aid construction of highways.
- 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the library.
- 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of the cemeteries.
- 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for public welfare.
- 10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for fire prevention.
- 11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for fire trails.
- 12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$80.00 for the town's share of co-operative participation in White Mountains Region Association.

- 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$275.00 to purchase a memorial plaque and finance a Memorial Day observance with unveiling of the Honor Roll.
- 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,000.00 for construction of the town garage.
- 15. To see if the town will vote to observe, during the month of August, 1949, the 50h Anniversary of Old Home Week, and raise and appropriate a sum of money therefor.
- 16. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through tax collector's deeds.
- 17. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to distribute the inventory blanks when taking inventory.
- 18. To see if the town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the division of municipal accounting, and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.
- 19. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 20. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

To the Inhabitants of the School District in the Town of Shelburne qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Shelburne on the 8th day of March, 1949, at 10:30 o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects.

- 1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
 - 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agents of the District.
- 6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or officers heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To choose Agents, Auditors, Committees, in relation to any subject embraced in this Warrant.
- 8. To see if the district will vote to endorse the action of the School Board in assigning all pupils, grades 1-6, to the Shelburne School, beginning September 1949.
- 9. To see if the District will vote to make any alterations in the amount of money required to be assessed for the ensuing year for the support of public schools and the payment of the statutory obligations of the District, as determined by the School Board in its annual report.

10. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT

To the Superintending School Committee and the Citizens of the Shelburne School District:

Foreword

We must keep constantly before us the fact that children cannot delay the growing-up process. What they will be, they are now becoming. Children depend upon so many for their chance to grow in safety, strength, and security. The home, the school, and the community each have a responsibility. In our hands, as parents and citizens of today, rests the obligation to see that the foundations of morality, religion, and culture, are built strong. It is the purpose of the school to do everything possible to help train our boys and girls to become active, reliable, self-supporting citizens, in a democracy.

Special Meeting

A special school district meeting was held on September 22, 1948. The article was, "To see if the district will vote to authorize the School Board to purchase a school bus, and appropriate the sum of twenty-five hundred (\$2500.00) for this purpose."

The vote was in the affirmative and the board purchased the bus, from Randolph, and put it into operation in October.

Dentalmobile

Services of the dental trailer and staff were available during the fall. All of the children had an opportunity to have their teeth cleaned and four applications of fluorine. Through the generosity of the Grange each child was presented with a tube of tooth paste and a tooth brush.

Notes on the Budget

The School Board's total budget for 1949-50 is \$6,153.00 as compared with \$5,889.80 for last year. The requested appropriation is \$163.20 more than the amount appropriated last March.

Teacher

The teacher, this year, is Marie Daley. Mrs. Daley has been with us for the past three years. Due to illness, she was absent from November 15 till after the Christmas Vacation. The substitute was Jennie Keach.

Tuition

There are 14 from the district attending school in Gorham. Four are in the high school and 10 in the elementary.

The tuition rates are as follows: Gorham Elementary, \$75.00, and Gorham High, \$158.74 per year.

Enrollment and Attendance

There are, at this writing, 9 enrolled in the school. This represents a decrease of two from the same period a year ago.

The average attendance last year was 8.90. The percentage of attendance was 95.60. There were no tardinesses.

Conclusion

We have faith in the youth of America. With proper training in the home, the church, and the school the vast majority of our youth will not become cynical and indifferent.

I wish to take this opportunity to express my appreciation to the members of the school board, parents, teacher, and friends for the interest they have shown in the school, and for their loyal cooperation during the past year.
