

WARRANT FOR THE ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

[L. S.]

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Webster in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Webster on Tuesday, the 13th day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
- 3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum necessary to secure State Highway construction.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum necessary for the maintenance of highways and bridges.
- 5. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for ploughing roads in winter.
- 6. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town library.
- 7. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Home Day.
- 8. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.

- 9. To see if the town will vote to give a discount of 2% (per cent) on all 1934 taxes paid on or before Aug. 1st, 1934.
- 10. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay on town notes.
- 11. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for interest on town notes.
- 12. To see if the town will vote to give the Selectmen the right to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 13. To see whether beer or other lawful alcoholic beverages shall be manufactured or sold locally as permitted under Chapter 99 Section 22, Laws of 1933.
- 14. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the road from Little's Hill to Hellbach's bridge subject to gate or bars.
- 15. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

Health Inspection

The school nurse, Mrs. Naomi A. Fifield, examined the children in January, 1933. She reported 22 underweight, 9 with defective vision, 3 with deformity, 17 with defective teeth, 4 with diseased tonsils, 1 with adenoids, 3 with defective speech, 42 vaccinated, 6 unvaccinated, 5 cases of skin disease during the year.

To this report she added the following comments:

"Five visits were made to the schools for examinations and inspections and the parents of twenty-two pupils interviewed.

Although there are seventeen with dental defects the mouths are in good condition and show the results of our previous dental clinics. During the summer we hope to hold another. We regret that the death of Dr. Chandler has taken away one who has been interested in the welfare of our children and has made it possible for them to have their dental work done at a very low cost."

In June 1933, the following pupils were graduated from the eighth grade:—Irving V. Merrill, Emily M. Mignault, Anne Collins, Eleanor L. Frost, Ernest M. Frost, Suren Melkonian, Popkin Melkonian, Theda Stone, Marian Beth Lovett.

The school board and the teachers have contributed toward making my half-year as superintendent a most pleasant one.

It is evident that the schools have been so well conducted in the past that I would not wish to make any radical changes if I could. The schools are of good size, not too large yet large enough to keep the teachers very busy. It has seemed to me that for efficient work they should be provided with the best tools possible. The cost of an adequate amount of books and supplies is very small compared with the total cost of schools. Supplies in good quantity were bought at the close of last year. I have made an effort to provide the most needed books. Some new reading material has been supplied, new histories in grade 6, geographies in grade 4, and a new reading system in the first grade. New geographies are needed in other grades. Other books should be added as rapidly as possible.

The Putney Hill School, while not too large for one teacher, is somewhat large for the schoolroom. The average citizen is not interested in the details of proper ventilation. When his room becomes stuffy on a winter evening and he can hardly keep awake to read his paper, he opens a window a little and moves out of the draft to another part of the room. One cannot do that when a room is crowded with people. Just as it is poor economy to keep the teacher from having good tools with which to work, so it is a waste of good money to try to conduct the expensive operations of a school in a room where it is hard to provide enough fresh air to keep the children wide awake for all the six hours of the school day. The small size of this school room may be one argument in favor of the consolidation of the schools at Sweatts Mills which the district was considering last year, assuming, of course, that it was proposed to provide rooms there of ample size.
