Town Meeting Warrant

State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Wentworth, in the County of Grafton, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall, in said Wentworth, on Tuesday, the 8th day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
2. To elect a Delegate to the Constitutional Convention.
3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriations of the same.
4. To see if the Town will accept State Aid Construction of the Class II road known as North Dorchester Road, and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$786.00, or will accept State Aid for Construction of Class V roads and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$428.01.
5. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Highways and Bridges for the ensuing year.
6. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for snow removal for the ensuing year.
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate money for sanding.
8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate money for the sanding of Town Highways.

9. To see what action the Town will take to raise and appropriate money enough to put up a suitable fence or railing on Depot Hill, so called.

10. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for street lights.

11. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the library.

12. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of the fire engine and tools for the Fire Warden.

13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell either at public auction or private sale to such purchaser and for such price as they may determine any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds, and until such sale is made to administer such property in the interests of the town.

14. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of town poor.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the celebration of the Anniversary of the Ratification of the Federal Constitution by the state, June 21, 1938, said sum to be expended under the direction of the Selectmen.

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate 1-100th of 1% of the total valuation of the town for the development of the Dartmouth—Lake Sunapee Regional Association.

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$400. for White Pine Blister Rust Control.

18. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes, if necessary.

19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate money for stage fixtures for the Town Hall.

20. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board of the Wentworth School Dist:

I hereby submit my eighth annual report as Superintendent of School's. The statistical report for the year appears at the end of this report.

Owing to legislative enactment, it became expedient to dissolve the Plymouth supervisory union, and, on September 15, the Woodstock-Wentworth union absorbed the Plymouth school district. It cannot be expected that the personal supervision can be as much as before, and the Superintendent regrets the meritable loss of personal contact and close relations with citizens and pupils throughout the supervisory union. It seems advisable to move the office to Plymouth before September as this is nearer the center of the present supervisory union.

James R. Morrill resigned his position as teacher of the village grammar school in June. Mr. Morrill completed three years of highly successful work in this district, and his departure was genuinely regretted by pupils and community. He is an able schoolman of high scholarship and sound judgment.

The district was fortunate to secure Lawrence E. Goss of Rye to succeed Mr. Morrill. Mr. Goss brings energy and enthusiasm to the school and community. His interest and influence extend beyond the school-room to the older boys and girls, and he is always ready to support any forward movement in the com-

munity. He is a complete master of the subject material of his classroom work, and exhibitions of art work of his pupils in the post office are unique in this village.

The experiment of discontinuing formal report cards in Grades 1 and 2 and substituting short personal notes by the teacher is working out quite satisfactorily. This is the trend through many progressive systems. Experience shows that a few crisp sentences of praise or criticism bring a clearer picture to parents of the progress of those little people than the traditional report card.

The Atwell Hill school has a good many pupils for the size of the building, owing, as indicated in my last report, to the number of Piermont children enrolled. However, several of those are in all probability temporary, and it is hoped that another year the enrollment will shrink or at least grow no larger. The present teacher, Miss Marjorie McCoy, is handling the situation very well.

The enrollment at Foster school under Dorothy G. Veysey is 8, but with no scholars due to graduate until June 1939, it is reasonable to expect that the enrollment will increase some. As long as there are 8 or 10 pupils to attend and the village school continues its present enrollment, it will probably be advisable to operate a school in the south part of town.

The Board is prudent in the district's financial affairs. The cost per pupil of elementary schools last year was \$60.64 in the district while the average for

the state was \$77.16. A fire occurred at the village school December 10, 1937, doing some damage in the grammar room. The loss was fully covered by insurance, and the school only lost a half day of school. The Board expects to replace the old double seats of this room with modern single seats and paint both rooms inside.

There are no special appropriations, and the amount asked for is a substantial reduction from last year.
