THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Westmoreland in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Westmoreland on Tuesday, the Thirteenth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To hear the report of agents and auditors and take any action thereto.
4. To see if the Town will vote for snow removal and sanding on either Class V or Class VI roads or take any other action relating thereto, raise and appropriate money for the same.
5. To see if the Town will vote for Class V assistance for Class V roads and raise and appropriate the sum of \$600.79. State contribution to be \$4,005.28 under the proposed new law.
6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate in addition to what is required by law for highways and bridges.
7. To see what disposition the Town will vote to make of the income of the Jotham Lord fund.
8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the support of the library.

9. To see what sum of money, if any, the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repairing of the Town Library, an estimate of approximately \$800.00, or take any other action relating thereto.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the White Pine Blister Rust Control in cooperation with the State Forestry and Recreation department.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$74.00 to the Monadnock Region Association of Southern New Hampshire for issuance and distribution of printed matter, newspaper and magazine advertising, calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the Town in cooperation with the other thirty-seven towns of the Monadnock Region.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the upkeep of cemeteries.

13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$579.00 for the Elliot Community Hospital in Keene and take any other action relating thereto.

15.* To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum not to exceed \$20.00 to cut the doors leading from the kitchen to the diningroom, so that there will be a center section on hinges making an opening through which food and dishes may be passed.

16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint one road agent for the three districts to take effect in 1952.

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 to repair the road leading from the residence of Mrs. Etz to the Dutton Place, so-called, or take any other action thereto.

18. To see if the Town will vote to accept the street light in front of Miss Gerould's and maintain same or take any other action thereto.

19. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to purchase and install a siren on the Town Hall and raise and appropriate money for same.

20.* To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 to be used in addition to the \$300.00 carried over from 1950, for improvement on the Aldrich road leading from Route 12 to Dorothy Sawyer's.

21. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the Municipal Budget Act.

22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,250.00, State contribution to be \$18,750.00, for rebuilding the bridge over Partridge Brook, so-called, on Route 63 said being about one-half mile south of the Town Hall or take any other action relating thereto. (This article inserted in the warrant at the request of the State Highway Department.)

23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,250.00, State contribution to be \$5,250.00, to replace the bridge, at Kirk Aldrich's, or take any other action relating thereto. (This article inserted in the warrant at the request of the State Highway Department.)

24. To see if the Town will vote to have a budget committee of three, to be appointed by the Selectmen or elected by the voters.

25. To transact any other business which may legally come before said meeting.

TOWN MEETING

March 14, 1950

The moderator called the meeting to order and read the warrant. It was voted to keep Article 1, open during the entire meeting which closes at 6:15 p. m.

Article 2. The following sums of money were voted to be raised and appropriated for general government.

Town officers' salaries	\$1,500 00
Town officers' expenses	1,000 00
Election and registration	225 00
Town hall	1,200 00

Protection of Persons and Property:

Article 3. It was voted to accept the town reports as printed.

Article 4. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for snow removal and sanding on Class V and Class VI roads.

Article 5. The sum of \$581.04 was voted to be raised and appropriated for Class V roads. The State contribution to be \$2,324.17.

Article 6. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$8,870.00 for highways and bridges. This sum includes what is required by law.

Article 7. The town voted to instruct the selectmen to contact the Public Service Commission of New Hampshire to see what can be done to make a safer crossing of the railroad, at the Sawyer Crossing. It was voted to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$300.00 toward repairing and making safe for public travel the road leading from Highway Route 12 to the Dorothy Sawyer place.

Article 8. It was voted to re-open the road from the Goodrum place to the lower end of the mowing on the Arthur Busche property.

Article 9. It was voted to pass over this article pertaining to rebuilding and widening the bridge over Partridge Brook on Rt. 63.

Article 10. The town voted to instruct the selectmen to borrow a sum not to exceed \$2,500.00 to be used in conjunction with the sum on hand for the purchase of a power grader.

Votes cast 100. No 42, yes 58.

Article 11. The sections of road in this article to be discontinued by vote of the town.

From W. L. Cook's driveway on the old trunk line southerly 0.58 mi.

On the old trunk line northerly from junction with Capron road 0.15 mi.

From Route 12 to old Rogers Crossing, so-called.

Article 12. It was voted to use the income from the Jotham Lord fund for the support of the library.

Article 13. The sum of \$200.00 was voted to be raised and appropriated for the support of the library.

Article 14. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$80.00 for the Monadnock Region Association.

Article 15. The town voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for eradication of White Pine Blister Rust. It was voted that the State Forestry department be requested to give a triplicate report to the town, showing what ground was covered, where bushes were located and amount of bushes removed. Vote, Yes 40. No 10.

Article 16. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for upkeep of cemeteries.

Article 17. It was voted to authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Article 18. It was voted to pass over this article. (Elliot Community Hospital).

Article 19. The town voted to accept from Mrs. Jessie Joslyn the sum of \$100.00 the income to be used for perpetual care of the James and Sarah Keith lot in the Pratt cemetery.

Article 20. The town voted to accept from Mrs. Jessie Joslyn the sum of \$100.00, the income to be used for perpetual care on the J. W. and A. M. Keith lot in the Pratt cemetery.

Article 21. It was voted that the Board of Selectmen be authorized and instructed to accept on behalf of the town an offer made by Glenn E. Britton permitting the town, without charge, to cross his premises at the rear of his store building for the purpose of convenient access to and from the Town

Building for the fire equipment, with the understanding that his offer is merely a license which may be renewed from year to year unless revoked. It was voted not to reopen under Article 10. The vote was 37 yes, 41 no.

Under Article 1, there were 186 ballots cast. The result of the balloting was as follows:

Town Clerk. Ruth E. Burt had 167 votes and was declared elected.

Ruth Churchill had 1 vote.

Selectman for 3 years. Lawrence A. Leach had 153 votes and was declared elected.

George S. Wildey had 27 votes.

Town Treasurer. Charles H. Aldrich had 169 votes and was declared elected.

Marjorie Hudson had 3 votes.

Tax Collector. Ruth E. Burt had 177 votes and was declared elected.

Robert Blood had 1 vote.

River Road Agent. Leon E. McClening had 175 votes and was declared elected.

Kenneth Rounds had 1 vote.

South Village Road Agent. Charles W. Messer had 166 votes and was declared elected.

John Watkins and Leon McClening each had 1 vote.

East Westmoreland Road Agent. Richard W. Delano had 126 votes and was declared elected.

George F. Perry had 42 votes. Charles Messer had 5 votes.

Trustee of Library for 3 years. Anne E. Perry had 162 votes and was declared elected.

Grace Parker had 1 vote.

Auditors. Nina E. Christian had 170 votes and was declared elected.

Walter E. Dunn had 154 votes and was declared elected. Six persons had 1 vote each.

Trustee Public Funds for three years. Nellie F. C. Aldrich had 159 votes and was declared elected.

Three persons had 2 votes each and one person had 1 vote.

Constable. Richard D. Rhodes had 37 votes and was declared elected.

Linwood Burt had 22 votes.

There were 18 persons who had from 1 to 5 votes.

Surveyors of Wood and Lumber.

William S. Starkey had 159 votes and was declared elected.

Howard E. Smith had 159 votes and was declared elected.

Perley O. Thompson had 159 votes and was declared elected.

Fence Viewers. Selden B. Lund had 154 votes and was declared elected.

Lawrence A. Leach had 160 votes and was declared elected.

Russell H. Wellington had 155 votes and was declared elected.

Briggs Fund Committee. Mrs. John Terry had 46 votes and was declared elected.

Barbara Flagg had 31 votes and was declared elected.

Twenty-six persons had 1 or more votes.

The moderator read the results of the ballots. It was voted to adjourn the meeting. Some officers took their oath of office at this time.

PROPOSED SCHOOL WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the school district of the Town of Westmoreland qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, in said district, on the 13th day of March, 1951, at 1:00 o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a moderator for the coming year.
2. To choose a clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose a member of the school board for the ensuing three years.
4. To choose a treasurer for the ensuing year.

5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the school board and truant officers, and fix the compensation of any other officer or agent of the district.

6. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees, or other officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

7. To choose agents, auditors, and committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.

8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

The proposed budget for operating the schools during the next school year provides only for the necessities. Many of the items are controlled by outside influences. Administrative costs and health supervision are determined by the Union. Books and scholars' supplies have increased sharply during the last few months. The slight increases in your budget do not allow for the same amount of material that has been provided in other years. The figure for transportation is the same as the actual costs for this year. Due to increased enrollments in the various parts of the town added transportation is necessary. This would have been true even though the pupils had been enrolled in other schools. The school board is able to operate the schools this year on the budget that was voted last spring only because fewer children are attending high school this year than were planned for last year.

The tuition rate in Keene and Brattleboro High Schools is \$200. Next year it will be \$250. Walpole tuition is \$125 and will be the same another year. The new teachers' retirement law increased the assessment made on each town. This year you are paying nearly five hundred dollars toward an adequate retirement plan for your teachers. The new State Aid figure will be determined after the Legislature has voted the new law.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Westmoreland :

I herewith submit my sixth annual report as superintendent of your schools :

It is a pleasure to report that work is going forward very well this year. Recognition was made last year of the increasing enrollments. A committee was empowered at the last annual school meeting to work with the school board in determining a wise plan to follow for the immediate future, and to recommend something more far-reaching for the permanent relief of the overcrowding. During the spring the sanitary facilities at the Corner School were condemned and it was found necessary to transfer the pupils to the Depot School which was reconditioned for this purpose. Your special committee met with the school board and decided that it was more feasible to continue using the Depot School as it was slightly larger, and because it didn't seem to be good business to spend several hundred dollars on repairs to the Corner School if the over-all plan indicated that the school would be used for only a few years.

Last fall school opened with the first five grades in East Westmoreland and the South Village Schools. Grades six through eight are in the Depot School. This is a large step forward toward a graded school situation. Progress is better this year as each teacher has fewer grades and is able to devote more time to each group. Next year further adjustments may have to be made, certainly the following year, due to a large number of first graders coming in. Your committee is now considering this problem and hopes to present recommendations soon.

During the summer the school buildings were redecorated where they needed it the most, new furniture was obtained for the Depot School, and the usual minor repairs attended to. A set of encyclopedias were provided for the upper grades and additional reference and text materials supplied the other grades. School materials are going up weekly. A dollar today buys only part of what it bought last year. Pupils and teachers are cooperating to make full use of every item.

We want to thank the PTA and other community groups who continue to support the schools in many ways. The school lunch programs in the three schools do much to improve the health of the pupils and their attitudes toward education.
