

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Whitefield in the County of Coos and State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs. You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town, on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a Town Clerk, one Selectman to serve for a period of three years, a Town Treasurer, Highway Agent, two Library Trustees, Trust Fund Trustee, Auditor, three Hospital Trustees to serve for three years, and all other necessary Town Officers.
- 2. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for
 - a. Town Officers' Salaries
 - b. Town Officers' Expenses
 - c. Election Expenses
 - d. Municipal Court Expenses
 - e. Care of Repair of Town Buildings
 - f. Police Department
 - g. Town Fire Protection and Department
 - h. Forest Fires
 - i. Bounties and Damage by Dogs
 - j. Health Department and Vital Statistics
 - k. Sewer Maintenance
 - l. Highways and Bridges
 - 1. Town maintenance

- 2. Snow removal
- 3. Cleaning streets
- 4. Street lighting
- 5. General expense highway department
- m. Public Library
- n. Old Age Assistance
- o. Town Poor
- p. Memorial Day
- q. Soldiers' Aid
- r. Cemeteries
- s. Insurance
- t. Interest, bond and notes
- u. Sidewalk maintenance
- v. Band concerts
- w. Payment on principal of town debt
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to grant to the Woman's Study Club, American Legion and Morrison Hospital Auxiliary, Mount Washington Grange and Rotary Club, for public purposes, the free use of the Town Hall.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money by temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid Construction of Class V roads, commonly known as town roads, raise and appropriate for the purpose, the sum of \$490.97, and receive from the State \$1963.89.
 - 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appro-

priate a sum of money for advertising, the same to be expended through the Board of Trade.

- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250 to the White Mountains Region Association, being 10c per \$1,000 of the assessed valuation (1/100th of 1%), for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter and advertising and otherwise publicizing the advantages of the town in cooperation with the other 45 towns in the region.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to complete the repair work on Burns Cemetery.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to be expended by the Memorial Field Board of Control for the improvement of Memorial Field (By petition.)
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to take over and maintain all so-called private sewers, also locate and map as they are found. A fee of \$1.00 a year for every house that is connected to a sewer that extends off the property of said house. The dollar to be added to tax bill. (By petition.)
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of chapter 171-A of the Revised Laws relative to playing games of beano.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to purchase a new truck, and to turn in the Ford in part payment, and to spread the expense over a term of years.
- 13. To transact any other business that may lawfully come before said meeting.

Concord, New Hampshire November 27, 1950

Board of Selectmen Whitefield, New Hampshire

Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of an audit and examination of the accounts of the Town of Whitefield which was made by this Division, acting under authority of Chapter 82, Section 27, of the Revised Laws of New Hampshire, which provides in part as follows:

"Audit on Motion of Commission. The commission may cause an audit to be made of the accounts of any city, town, school district, village district or precinct, as often as once in two years, or whenever conditions appear to it to warrant such. xxxxxx"

This audit covered the fiscal year ended December 31, 1949, and the period from January 1st to October 31st, 1950. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report which is made up in three sections as follows:

Section I-Fiscal Year Ended December 31, 1949
Section II-Period January 1st to October 31st, 1950.

Section III - Statistical Table - Ten Year Statement of Indebtedness, Valuation and Taxes.

Scope of Audit

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Library Treasurer, Municipal Court and Trustees of Trust Funds.

Financial Statements

Comparative Balance Sheets — Dec. 31, 1948 — Dec. 31, 1949: (Exhibit A)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1949, are presented in Exhibits C and D. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit D), a net overdraft of appropriations of \$5,166.21, less a net revenue surplus of \$813.20, resulted in a net budget deficit of \$4,353.01.

Summary of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit E)

A summary of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1949, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit E. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of October 31st, 1950, is indicated in Exhibit P.

Statement of Long Term Indebtedness: (Exhibit 0)

A statement of outstanding long term indebtedness as of December 31, 1949, showing annual maturities of principal and interest, is contained in Exhibit O.

Audit Procedure

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks.

General Comments

Revised Balance Sheets:

It was necessary to make several changes in the balance sheets of December 31, 1948 and December 31, 1949, as originally made out by the town officials and included in the town reports of these years. The com-

parative balance sheets for December 31, 1948 and December 31, 1949, which are presented in Exhibit A, reflect these changes.

It was found that in the balance sheet for each of these years the uncollected taxes were entirely omitted from the assets.

In both years the unexpended special appropriation of \$2,500.00, in the hands of the Treasurer of the Airport, was included in the assets but omitted from the liabilities. As this fund was reserved for a specific purpose it should properly be set up as a liability as well as an asset item.

The appropriation balance due the school district by the Town was understated by \$9,406.44 in 1949 and the amount of dog licenses due the school district of \$1,193.67 was omitted altogether.

These and other minor changes affected the Net Debt of the Town as follows:

Current Deficit:

The revised balance sheets of December 31, 1948 and December 31, 1949, (Exhibit A) disclosed current deficits in each of these years amounting to \$4,970.00 and \$9,848.09, respectively, as indicated herewith:

It will be noted from the above that the current deficit increased by \$4,878.09 during the year 1949. In explanation of the term "current liabilities", it may be stated that these consisted of "accounts payable", "appropriation balances and dog licenses due

the School District" and "outstanding temporary loans".

To remain in sound financial condition a town should at all times have sufficient "assets" to meet its "current liabilities". The factor chiefly responsible for a town being in a deficit position is the accumulation of annual budget deficits resulting from appropriation overdrafts. This condition can be remedied only by more careful budget preparation and closer adherence to the appropriations which are authorized.

Refunding of Debt:

As of December 31, 1949, there were outstanding temporary loans in the amount of \$20,000.00. Inasmuch as on this same date there was a current deficit of \$9,848.09, it will be seen that one half of the outstanding loans which would amount to \$10,000.00, will eventually have to be paid by future appropriations.

It was also found that there was an outstanding note of \$5,000.00, issued in 1941, bearing an interest rate of 4% and held by W. F. Dodge and Son, which had no definite maturity date. This is in effect a "demand" note, the issuance of which is contrary to the provisions of the Municipal Bond Act.

It is therefore recommended that authorization be obtained from the incoming legislature to refund indebtedness as herein referred to in the amount of \$15,000.00, by the issuance of serial notes or bonds which would provide for its ultimate liquidation.

Deficiency of 1949 Tax Warrant:

The 1949 tax rate of \$4.95 was based on an assessed valuation of \$2,519,508.00, in accordance with the report submitted to the Tax Commission at the time when the tax rate was approved.

Subsequently it developed that the amount of property exempted to soldiers, of \$50,850.00, had erroneously been included as taxable valuation. Therefore the actual net taxable valuation was only \$2,468,658.00.

The result was that the actual 1949 property tax warrant was only \$122,056.00, rather than \$124,715.65, the amount which should have been assessed to meet budgetary requirements. The difference of \$2,659.65

accounted for part of the budget deficit as indicated in the budget summary. (Exhibit D)

Annual Town Reports:

It was noted that the annual printed Town report for 1949 contained neither the Tax Collector's or Town Clerk's reports. The law requires that the reports of these officials be included in the annual printed reports of towns and their inclusion in future reports should not be overlooked.

Town Treasurer:

The Town Treasurer enters checks in the cash book after they have been paid and cancelled by the bank. Only checks which are sent out of Town are signed by the Treasurer.

It is recommended that all checks be countersigned by the Treasurer and that every check be recorded by the Treasurer at the time of issuance. This is the only way that the amount of the actual treasury balance may be determined at all times.

It is also recommended that in entering receipts in the cash book the Treasurer designate the nature of the receipt (i.e., taxes, motor vehicle permits, income from departments, loans, etc.) as well as the official or other party from whom it is received.

Tax Collector:

As indicated by Exhibit R-1, as of October 31, 1950, there were unredeemed taxes from tax sales on account of tax levies from 1931 to 1947, inclusive, amounting to \$1,580.31. As the two year period in which redemptions may be made has expired, the Tax Collector should pass deeds to the Town at once on the properties represented by these unredeemed tax liens.

It is also recommended that the Tax Collector adopt the use of the standard loose leaf columnar cash book and the regular report form should accompany all remittances to the Treasurer on account of redemptions from tax sales.

Abatements:

It was found that individual orders have not been issued in all cases by the Board of Selectmen authorizing abatements which apparently have been allowed. It is required by law that this be done. It is also recommended that the detailed list of abatements which the Collector submits to the Selectmen at the close of the year be approved in writing and signed by the Board if found to be in order.

Conclusion:

The provisions of Section 31, Chapter 211, of the Laws of 1939, require that this report or a summary of its essential features shall be published in the next annual town report. This letter of transmittal should be included in its entirety but the inclusion of Exhibits is optional.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Town of Whitefield for their assistance during the course of the audit.
