You are hereby notified to meet at the hall in The Massabesic Inn in said Town on Tuesday, the tenth day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

First. To bring in your ballots for Town Clerk for the ensuing year. One Selectman for three years.
Tax Collector for the ensuing year.
Town Treasurer for the ensuing year.
Highway Agent for the ensuing year.
One Library Trustee for three years.
One Cemetery Trustee for three years.
One Trust Fund Trustee for three years.
One Trust Fund Trustee for one year.
Three Auditors for the ensuing year.

At 12:30 o'clock P.M., the meeting will be open for the following articles:

Second. To choose all other necessary Town Officers.

Third. To see if the Town will vote to incur debt for temporary loans in anticipation of taxes for the year 1936.

Fourth. To hear the report of the Budget Committee and act thereon.

Fifth. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of eight hundred (\$800.00) dollars for Town Officers' salaries.

Sixth. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred and fifty (\$350.00) dollars for Town Officers' expenses.

Seventh. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred and twenty-five (\$225.00) to pay the expenses of election and registration.

Eighth. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred (\$100.00) dollars for the expense of the Municipal Court.

Ninth. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of sixty (\$60.00) dollars for rent of Hall.

Tenth. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred (\$100.00) dollars for the Police Department.

Eleventh. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred (\$300.00) dollars for the Fire Department.

Twelfth. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of ten (\$10.00) dollars for the Health Department, including vital statistics.

Thirteenth. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of twenty-eight hundred (\$2800.00) dollars for the care and maintenance of highways to be expended as follows: three hundred (\$300.00) dollars for the repairs of bridges, thirteen hundred (\$1300.00) dollars for the care and maintenance of the highways in summer, and twelve hundred (\$1200.00) dollars for winter roads.

Fourteenth. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of nine hundred (\$900.00) dollars for street lights.

Fifteenth. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of four hundred (\$400.00) dollars for the general expenses of the Highway Department.

Sixteenth. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred (\$100.00) dollars for the Library.

Seventeenth. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two thousand (\$2000.00) dollars for Town Poor.

Eighteenth. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred (\$300.00) dollars for Old Age Assistance.

Nineteenth. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars for Memorial Day.

Twentieth. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred and seventy-eight (\$278.00) dollars and seventy-five (75) cents for Aid of Soldiers and their families.

Twenty-First. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred and seventy-five (\$375.00) dollars for interest on Temporary Loans.

Twenty-Second. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred and twenty (\$120.00) dollars for interest on Long Term Note.

Twenty-Third. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand (\$1000.00) dollars for State Aid Road.

Twenty-Fourth. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred and two (\$502.00) dollars and sixty-nine (.69) cents for Class V Highways (Town share).

Twenty-Fifth. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand (\$1000.00) dollars for the payment on Long Term Note.

Twenty-Sixth. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand, four hundred and eighty-three (\$1483.00) and fourteen (.14) cents for the deficit of previous years.

Twenty-Seventh. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand, eight hundred and sixty (\$1860.00) for the State tax of 1936.

Twenty-Eighth. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two thousand, one hundred and thirtytwo (\$2132.00) and fifty-five (.55) cents for the County tax for the year 1936.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board of Auburn:

School House Enlargement

In my report last year it was suggested that the school house in District No. 1 ought to be enlarged to meet the rapid increase in pupils in that part of the town. The District Meeting, acting under a special article in the Warrant, voted the sum of \$300 to make such alterations as seemed necessary.

Auburn is a state-aided town and as such is required to consult the State Department as to plans for such major repairs.

The local school authorities, after several consultations with the State Board, decided to add ten feet in length (instead of the eight first considered). This change and some extra work in toilets and woodshed made new plans and bids necessary. The contract for this work was awarded to E. W. Smith for the sum of \$350. This did not include painting, curtains, and other expenses incurred in getting the school house ready for use.

The total expense involved in this necessary improvement was \$424.

That this was a necessary outlay is shown by the fact that the enlarged school room has been filled to its full capacity since it was opened. I desire to congratulate the Town of Auburn on this job of school house improvement and to thank the contractor, Mr. Smith. for his faithfulness in giving a full dollar's worth of service for every dollar he received.

The balance of cost above the appropriation made has been met from savings in other budget items.

HIGH SCHOOL TUITION

In one item of last year's budget the estimate was too small and as School Superintendent I frankly admit the full responsibility for this error. I fully believed that \$3,000 was ample but we now know that the amount should have been greater.

The special appropriation of \$350, to become immediately available, if provided, will balance the budget for the year ending June 30, 1936.


