TOWN WARRANT

State of New Hampshire

Carroll, SS.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Conway, County of
Carroll qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House at Center Conway, New Hampshire, March 11, 1952, at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary town officers.

Art. 2. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the following purposes:

Section a. Town officers' salaries

b. Town officers' expenses

c. Election and registration

d. Municipal Court

e. Expenses Town Hall and other buildings

f. Town office expense

g. Police department

h. Fire department

i. Health department

j. Town dump

k. Vital statistics

l. Town maintenance of highways—
summer and winter

- m. Libraries
- n. Town poor
- o. Old age assistance
- p. Memorial Day
- q. Soldiers' aid
- r. Parks and playgrounds
- s. Damages and legal expense
- t. Interest, on temporary loans and bonds
- u. Payment on bond issue
- v. Insurance
- w. County taxes

Art. 3. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to distribute the blank inventories at the time they examine and appropriate the property to be taxed.

Art. 4. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire upon the credit of the town the sum of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000.00) if needed.

Art. 5. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint a competent highway supervisor and do away with electing a road agent each year. This vote to become effective in 1953 to remain in effect until rescinded at some future meeting.

Art. 6. To see if the town will vote to adopt a plan for extending to employees of the town the benefits of title II of the Federal Social Security Act (Old-Age and Survivor's Insurance) as authorized by Chapter 234 of the Laws of 1951 and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$450.00 to defray the town's share of the cost thereof.

Art. 7. If the foregoing article is adopted, to see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to execute on behalf of the town the necessary agreement with the State of New Hampshire to carry into effect the plan and to see if the town will designate the Town Treasurer as the officer to be responsible for the administration of the plan.

Art. 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,000.00 for State Aid Construction to be expended on the Kearsarge road. With the State providing \$20,000.00 and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,009.35 for T.R.A. with the State providing \$6,728.97, and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,070.00 with the State matching this amount for class IV Urban extension.

Art. 9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of (\$400.00) to assist in the operation of the Conway and North Conway Information Booths. This sum to be equally divided between the two.

Art. 10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the support of civilian defense. The same to be expended under the civilian defense officer and under the direction of the Selectmen.

Art. 11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$523.86 to the White Mountains Region Association, being 10c per \$1,000. of assessed valuation (1/100th of 1%) for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter and advertising and otherwise publicizing the advantages of the town, in cooperation with the other towns in the region.

Art. 12. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for the support of Memorial Hospital at North Conway. Agreeably with a petition signed by Robert N. Davis and others.

Art. 13. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,300.00 for the purchase of new replacement equipment.

Art. 14. To act upon any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

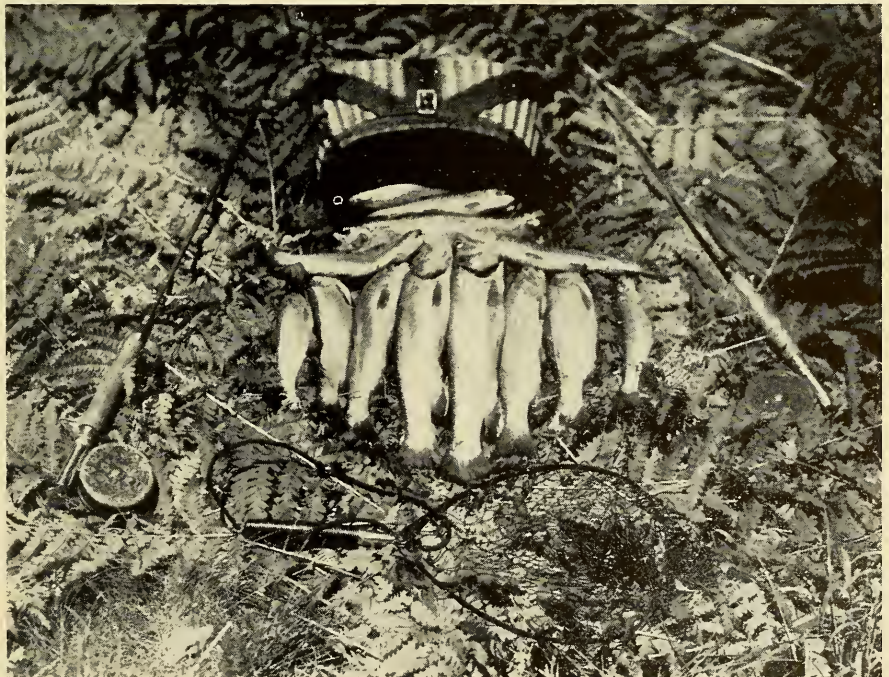

Report of Police Department

The majority of arrests by the Police Department were for motor vehicle violations, and these consisted of the following: operating without a license, failure to stop at a "stop-sign", reckless driving, speeding, driving under the influence of intoxicating liquor, and failure to obtain an inspection sticker.

Cases other than motor vehicle law infractions, were drunk and disorderly and larceny.

In addition to the arrests, 67 written warnings were made plus many verbal warnings for minor violations, or disturbances. Also numerous check-ups were done on cars and trucks, including the issuance of defective equipment tags in several instances.

Forty-seven accidents were investigated and aid was given to 97 motorists out of gasoline, or otherwise needing assistance.

Fifty-nine drunks were temporarily locked-up for safe keeping, or as usually the case, taken home.

Thirty-nine criminal investigations were made, with success in a large percentage of cases.

92 tramps were lodged at the police station. 18 of these lodgers asked for and received meals.

We recorded 462 telephone calls asking for police assistance or information.

It has been our policy and desire, to work for the prevention of accidents, and continuing along the lines set up last year, have distributed safety calendars, and bicycle safety booklets, in addition to part of our normal work of traffic supervision and control.

As we did not employ our second full-time officer until last May a substantial sum was saved from the \$6500 appropriated last Town Meeting. However, I believe we should continue

as at present, with at least two full-time officers. If these plans are followed, we would need as much, or slightly more than the sum appropriated last year, for the ensuing year of 1952.

REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDENS

In the past year your local forest fire organization did a very fine job of pre-suppression and suppression of forest fires. Our early spring was very dry and with extra high winds and all our fires were during that period. We find that the general public is still very careless with matches and cigarettes.

In the "Keep American Green" program there is a story of two bad boys who cause most of our forest fires. The first one we call, "I don't care." He is the person that builds fires anywhere, never gets a permit to burn brush or has a safe place for his home incinerator. He is also very careless with matches and cigarettes. The other one is called, "I don't know any better," and the best way to describe him is a plain dunce. It is only with your help that these two bad actors are controlled. Their carelessness can be the cause of our pretty and valuable woodland to be destroyed by fire. Even your own home can be burned by them.

It is up to you and you alone to report these two characters to your local forest fire warden whenever you see them operating. To have our woodlands green and our mountain streams clear, your cooperation is needed by:

1. Seeing that your incinerator is tight and is sitting on clean ground.
2. Always clean a space about any open fire to prevent it from spreading.
3. Never burn in dry windy weather.
4. In all cases a written permit is required from your local town fire warden.
5. Be sure that your matches, cigarettes and pipe ashes are out before discarding.

It is with your cooperation that this shameful waste of timber and money can be stopped.

Report of Superintendent

To the School Board and Citizens of Conway:

Overcrowded conditions in the Conway Elementary School necessitated the transportation of the fourth grade to the Center Conway School building. A similar situation in the North Conway Elementary School resulted in the adoption of half-day sessions for the first grade.

The need for more adequate housing facilities as reported by the Building Survey Committee has become more evident at this time.

A three days' Workshop in Art Education, sponsored by the State Department of Education, was offered to the elementary teachers of the Conway School District. During this second semester both elementary and high school teachers are attending a fifteen-week extension course in Guidance.

Adult education became a reality this year and is firmly established as a definite part of the total school program. The services, facilities and resources of our schools will be used to the fullest capacity to further and extend the interest and needs of adults in this area. The inclusion of adult education has expanded the scope of the school program—in the near future consideration should be given to the need for public kindergartens.

A financial report of the school lunch programs and the Kennett High School Activities Association are included in this school report.

I wish to express my appreciation to the School Board for their assistance in the administration of school affairs.

REPORT OF SCHOOL NURSE

Dear Mr. Appleton:

I hereby submit my annual report of the health program for the year, 1950-51.

In the fall of 1951, a well-child conference and immunization clinic was held at Conway with one hundred children receiving inoculations. It is interesting to note that 70% of the children were from the first and second grades. If all children could have these inoculations, whooping cough would be a disease of the past as is small pox.

The dental program extends over the whole year and there is need of considerable improvement in this area. Cards were sent home to all students that had cavities that could be seen by the naked eye. It is gratifying to report that I can notice a drop in teeth defects since the Dental mobile unit was with us three years ago. It is my sincere desire that we may be able to carry on more dental work in the future.

A treatment Center, started last year in North Conway, has afforded children a chance to do their exercises which they were given at the Orthopedic clinics. This is a real improvement, inasmuch as Miss Bullock, Physical Therapy Consultant, may now see from 12-15 children at each clinic, three times a year where as previously she had been able to make only four or five home visits a year.

278 children were given the Tuberculin Patch Test, with 37 also receiving chest x-rays. I am glad to be able to report no active T.B. cases in the school.

There has been considerable absence from school due to the common cold. I believe it might be helpful if parents would check the children in the morning and keep them home during the nasal discharge stage, the most contagious time, and it might help to halt the spread of the disease.

May I express my sincere appreciation for the assistance and help rendered by members of the school board, Supt. of Schools, teachers, Red Cross Motor Corps, Salvation Army, State Sight Conservation Program, Women's Club, P.T.A., and everyone interested in the school health program.
