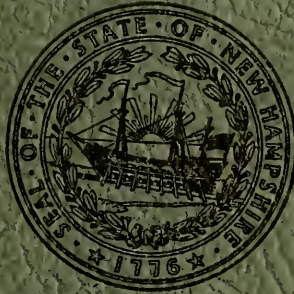


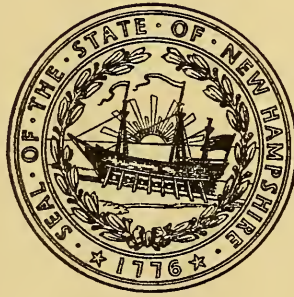

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

(L. S.)

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Eaton in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at Odd Fellows Hall in said Eaton on Tuesday, the 9th day of March, next, at Ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same. Including Town Officer's Salaries, Town Officers' Expenses, Election and Registration Expenses, Town Hall Expense, Police Department, Fire Department, Town Maintenance, General Expenses of Highway Department, Street Lighting, Library, Town Poor, Old Age Assistance, Health Department, Cemeteries, Interest on Temporary Loan, State Aid Construction Town's Share.

3. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds.

4. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes if necessary.

5. To see what provision the Town will vote to make for the care of tramps and make any necessary appropriation.

Polls will remain open until six o'clock p.m. unless a later hour is voted at the meeting.

To the School Board and Citizens of Eaton:

It would be impossible for me, of course, to make a comprehensive report on the condition of the Eaton School because of my very brief period of service. However, I might make the following observations. Mrs. Thurston, who substituted last year, is the regular teacher this year. It would seem that Eaton is fortunate in numbering among its citizens one who is willing to serve in this emergency as competently as Mrs. Thurston is doing.

Mr. Fuller called your attention last year to the crowded condition, which is still serious with 38 pupils. One suggestion along that line has been made to me, that is worth considering. That is, if possible, to arrange with Conway for the education of seventh and eighth grade pupils. Before September perhaps this and other possibilities should be explored.

The budget presented this year does not differ materially from last.

May I share with you the hope that your Superintendent, Mr. John H. Fuller will have a complete and rapid recovery and able soon to resume his duties.
