### Report of the Superintendent of Schools

To the School Board and Citizens of Franconia:

I herewith submit my second report as Superintendent of Schools.

The enrollment of your schools last year was 126, the average membership 115.24 and the percent of attendance 92.23. There were 15 tuition pupils in the Academy and 40 in the elementary schools. The average attendance in the Academy was 29.62.

This year the actual enrollment on February first was 123 with 25 in Grades 9 to 12, and 88 in Grades 1 to 8.

The three room elementary system is working well. There are twenty to twenty-five pupils in each room. Mrs. Mae Belle Sylvestre is doing excellent work with grades one and two. Mrs. Thelma Taylor teaches grades three and four, and Miss Kathleen Callahan teaches grades five and six. All three are experienced teachers. Their work is very satisfactory.

The elementary teachers have been handicapped this year by delayed book orders. Many book binderies are understaffed and orders are delayed from four to six weeks.

We have had no teacher changes this year. We have had to make emergency substitutions for all the elementary teachers. Mrs. Robert Jesseman and Miss Edith Johnson have borne the brunt of this substitute work.

During the summer Miss Angie Dantos resigned to accept a position near her home in Massachusetts. She was replaced by Miss Marguerite Poore. Miss Poore has previously taught Home Economics in Ashland, N. H., Concord, Mass., and Westerly, R. I. She came to Franconia from the Swinburne School, Newport, R. I.

Your High School staff is a good one. Mr. Rhoades is a capable headmaster. Mr. Tetley and Mr. Twomey are efficient teachers. Pupils of Mr. Twomey's English class submitted poems to the National High School Poetry Association. Several pupils received honorable mention and their poems were selected for publication. I cannot say too much in appreciation of the loyalty of the school and the cooperation of the teaching staff.

Mrs. Louise Peabody was engaged to coach girls' basketball this year. The girls have had a successful season winning most of their games. They are well coached.

There have been two changes in the school program. Civics is now being taught instead of Modern European History. The full year of Economics has been changed to  $\frac{1}{2}$  year of Economic Geography and  $\frac{1}{2}$  year of Economics. Courses in machines and aviation are given by correspondence.

It is questionable just how many repairs to make during war times. We feel that repairs and improvements that affect the safety and health of the children are desirable. After communicating with the Hussey Manufacturing Company at North Berwick, we made arrangements to have a fire escape installed at a reasonable cost. The stage curtains were fire proofed to comply with the Cocoanut Grove law. We replaced the old slate urinals with new sanitary porce-

lain urinals. This was an emergency replacement caused by the rotting of the wooden structure. A new safety lock has been put on the front door.

The third and fourth grade room has been difficult to heat. We have put an extra radiator in this room.

I wish to thank the Members of the School Board and the teachers for their cooperation.
