To the inhabitants of the Town of Gorham in the County of Coos, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in the Municipal Hall on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To elect one selectman for three years, and to choose all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for highways and bridges.

Article 3. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for winter roads.

Article 4. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for water and sewer maintenance.

Article 5. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for street lights.

Article 6. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Public Library.

Article 7. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the District Nursing Association.

Article 8. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Gorham Skating Rink.

Article 9. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Common.

Article 10. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Public Dumping Ground.

Article 11. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Charges.

Article 12. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Cemeteries.

Article 13. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the retirement of Water Bonds.

Article 14. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the American Legion Memorial Day.

Article 15. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Band Concerts.

Article 16. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Water and Sewer Construction.

Article 17. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Hydrants.

Article 18. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Police for the ensuing year.

Article 19. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the White Mt. Regional Association.

Article 20. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for repairs at the American Legion Hall.

Article 21. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for a Concrete Wall at Gorham Hill Reservoir.

Article 22. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Engineering and Survey of Additional Water Supply.

Article 23. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Androscoggin Street Extension.

Article 24. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Water on McFarlane Street.

Article 25. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Sewer on Lancaster Road.

Article 26. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Advertising.

Article 27. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to distribute the inventory blanks when taking the inventory.

Article 28. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes, when such debts are incurred and expressly made payable therefrom by such vote. And to see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to apply to the Governor and Council for assistance in financing the needs of the town, as previously provided by Chapter 63 of the laws of 1933, or any amendment made thereto.

Article 29. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for a Fire Truck.

Article 30. To see if the town will vote to purchase the Common (so-called) for the Town of Gorham, N. H., as a "Living Memorial" for World War Veterans, and asking that they may be given the power to use general funds, if necessary, issue land bonds or raise and appropriate the funds for the same, depending upon the circumstances at the time they may make an agreement of sale.

Article 31. To see if the town will vote to adopt the following article: that the Board of Selectmen be authorized to take over the duties and responsibilities of:

- (1) the Dump Committee
- (2) the Park Committee
- (3) to appoint Road Agent

and that it be further resolved that said Board of Selectmen be

authorized to engage, fix the compensation and define the duties of such employees as may be necessary to carry out the prescribed duties.

Article 32. To see if the Town will vote to have the Town Clerk have office hours in the Town Building at least 4 hours daily, except Sundays and Holidays; also that public notice be posted as to when these hours shall be.

Article 33. To hear the reports of town officers, agents, committees heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 34. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.
