TOWN WARRANT

State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Goshen in the county of Sullivan, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Goshen on Tuesday, the 8th (eighth) day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the

year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and

make appropriations of the same.

3. To hear the reports of Selectmen and other Town Officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

4. To raise and appropriate such sums of money

as may be necessary for Highways and Bridges.

5. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for winter road work.

6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for general expense of the

highway department.

- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250.00 for painting bridge over Mill Dam.
- 8. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selection to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

9. To see what sums of money the town will vote

to raise and appropriate for the Library.

10. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for town poor.

11. To see what sums of money the town will vote

to raise and appropriate for old age assistance.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$179.77 and the State will contribute \$719.07 for T.R.A. road.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for White Pine Blister Rust control program.

- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$30.00 for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the town, together with other towns in the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region Association.
- 15. To see what action the town will take in regard to obtaining the necessary land for a public dump.
- 16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the necessary sums of money to survey Mill Village Cemetery.
- 17. To see what action the town will take in regard to opening the road from Goshen Four Corners to Center Road.
- 18. To see what action the town will take regarding the continuation of the Rand Pond Road.
- 19. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$350.00 for the Fire Department.
- 20. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$700.00 for major improvements and current years maintenance on Town Hall.
- 21. To see what action the town will take regarding the setting up of a reserve fund for new equipment for the highway department.
- 22. To see what action the Town will take in regard to adopting the Caucus Laws.
- 23. To see what action the town will take in regard to wages paid town employees.
- 24. To take up any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN

Your local organization to prevent and extinguish brush and wood fires is glad to report a good year of forest protection in 1948. In spite of danger conditions nearly equalling at times those of 1947 when great losses were suffered in New Hampshire and New England, fire damage and loss this year have been greatifyly low.

With the continuing cooperation of all the people, we can hope to have another successful year in 1949. Let us remember that in any year, over 90% of all fires are caused by carelessness and that all of these

man-caused fires are preventable.

Today, we have more slash and uncut grassland than for many years in the past. Smokers, campers and tourists who use our outdoors are also more numerous than ever before. We must therefore be ready for fires which might occur but, above all, prevention by everyone is the greatest need.

A few simple precautions taken by every citizen will

help, as follows:

(1) Always get a written permit from the warden before kindling a fir e outdoors when the ground is not covered with snow.

(2) If you smoke, always extinguish matches and tobacco before dropping or shrowing them down. In automobiles, always use the ash trays.

(3) Report fires and smokes to the warden

without delay.

The observance of these and other simple rules will go far to insure safety from fire damage and your cooperation in this way is earnestly solicited.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Goshen School Board:

I herewith submit my third annual report as your

Superintendent of Schools:

It is a pleasure to be able to report that your schools have made progress this past year under the able direction of your two loyal, hard working teachers. There is no doubt but what they have profited a great deal from the workshops sponsored by the Superxisory Union and from the extension course given under the direction of Keene Teachers College. Every encouragement should be given to allow them to continue their professional advancement. However, I do not see how we are justified in expecting them to continue unless we are willing to increase their salaries so that they can afford the extra expense involved.

The two major improvements to the school buildings this year were the repair of the ceiling and repainting of the Village School and the providing of running water for the Corner School. Both were very much needed and have raised the efficiency of the building materially. There are several such projects that could well be undertaken to bring the schools up

to high standard rural schools.

There are those who would argue that we need a

new school building to house our pupils and that to spend money on these projects would be merely pouring money down the drain. There is certainly merit in these arguments but at the present time building costs are so high that construction of a new school house seems out of the qupestion. Until such time as new acommodations are possible we will continue to have children to educate and it would appear needed improvements increase the salable value of the buildings.

The outstanding achievement of the year has been the remodelling of the hall and woodshed at the Corner into a very fine, attractive hot lunch unit. Everyone in the district may well be proud of this achievement and everyone who tok part in this community project is to be commended for the unselfishness and willingess to help that has made this project possible.

The hot lunch program continues to be one of the better ones in the union. Thanks to the continued interest an dfinancial help of the women in town, the appropriation voted at the last school meeting, the efficiency of the worker, Mrs. Newhall and the new kitchen and program has improved a great deal this year. Even though some may feel that the school is assuming another responsibility of the home, the results prove that it is a very beneficial move and that the educational e ciency of the individual child is materially raised.

I would like to take this opportunity to express my personal appreciation for the fine cooperation of the school board, teachers and parents during the past year. With your continued support we can keep on im-

proving the Goshen school system.
