Warrant for Town Meeting

L. S. THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the town of Grafton, County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the town hall, in said Grafton, on Tuesday, the tenth day of March next,

at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
- 3. To see if the town will vote to elect one or more Road Agents for the ensuing year.
- 4. To elect a member of the Board of Trustees of Trust Funds for the ensuing three years.
- 5. To elect a member of the Library Trustees for the ensuing three years.
- 6. To see what action the town will take in reference to continuing Dr. Mitchell's monthly bonus of \$83.33 after March 10th, 1931.
- 7. To see if the town will vote to allow a discount of 3 per cent upon all property taxes paid on or before July 30th, 1931.
- 8. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$25.00 to be expended in proper observance of Old Home Day.
- 9. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to make short time loans in anticipation of taxes.
- 10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of maintaining town highways and bridges, including the amount of 1-4 of 1 per cent as required by law.
- 11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of cutting bushes and railing embankments along the highway.
- 12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 to be used for the purpose of buying new metal culverts to replace old plank culverts.
- 13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of purchasing snow fence.
- 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$829.50 for State Aid Construction thereby obtaining State Aid of \$1658.00
 - 15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appro-

priate the sum of \$1600.00 for Trunk Line Maintenance thereby obtaining State Aid of \$10,400.00.

16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for State Aid Maintenance

thereby obtaining State Aid of \$50.00.

17. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to be expended in control of White Pine Blister Rust in co-operation with the State Forestry Department.

18. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of removing the stone wall beside the State Highway at the Grafton Center cemetery and purchasing and erecting a metal fence to replace the stone wall.

19. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of building a new

cement bridge at Grafton Pond.

20. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purchase of building a new cement bridge on the State Aid road near the Dimond Blacksmith shop.

21. To see if the town will vote to allow Mrs. Lizzie J. Braley damages to property occasioned by the recent road construction at East Grafton. An expression by

ballot preferred.

22. To see if the town will vote to reopen the road leading from Williams' Hill to the Boyle Place so-called, otherwise known as the Livingston Hill road, subject to gates and bars.

23. To see if the town will vote to discontinue a piece of road between the Hazel Carlson place and Mason abutments on right hand side of State road as going

north.

24. To take any vote or transact any further busi-

ness that may legally come before said meeting.

Report of Superintendent of Schools

To the School Board of Grafton, N. H:

The first and perhaps the most important fact which may impress people comparing the budget of a year ago with the one published in the current annual school report is the increase in certain of the items of expenditure as proposed by the school board. A word of explanation seems to be in order regarding these items. Increases in three places are suggested, teachers' salaries, elementary school tuitions and high school tuitions.

A year ago we were convinced of the need of dividing the East Grafton school, as mentioned in the last report, which necessitated the employment of another teacher. As we were unprepared at that time to expend the necessary amount needed for the wages of a permanent teacher, application was made to the Keene Normal school to supply cadet teachers for the remainder of the year. This the normal school was very glad to do and

the advantage was mutual to both the school cadets and to ourselves. This plan was continued during the year beginning September, 1930, as it seemed uncertain whether these two schools would be permanent.

As conditions seem now the division of the East Grafton school will be continued at least long enough to demand the employment of a regular teacher for the 6th, 7th and 8th grades at the usual pay. Hence for next year the sum of \$512.00 has been added to the amount proposed last year to cover the additional cost.

I believe that longer continuence of the cadet plan in this school would be detrimental to the best preparation of our pupils for high school and that they would receive many times more value from the employment of a regular teacher than the extra amount involved. The cadet plan has been entirely satisfactory for a temporary measure, but in the long run the regular teacher can do more for the pupils and take a greater personal interest in them than can temporary teachers.

The second and third items of increased expense Elementary and High school tuitions.

There is no choice for us in the matter of High school tuitions. This must either be raised or assessed in any case as towns are obliged by law to pay for the high school tuitions of all pupils from the towns who are prepared to attend. We expect an increase in our high school attendance next year and an increase of \$191.00 in proposed expenditures is to cover this item.

There are children living in the old Pinnacle district on and near the turnpike who attend the Maxfield school in Springfield who were not there last year. This means an increase in the tuition paid to Springfield of about \$160.00.

To partially offset these increases, reductions in some other items were made as seemed possible, and an increase of State Aid of over \$60.00 helped slightly.

There has been quite a change in the enrollment at

the several schools for last year as can be seen by the following table:—

At the Depot school Miss Elizabeth Goodwin of Eliot, Maine, Keene Normal school, 1930, replaces Miss Lula Hews and is continuing the excellent work of the school.

Miss Bernice F. Wolfson of Canaan, Plymouth Normal school, 1930, replaces Miss Christie Morse and is doing excellent work.

The attendance at the schools is not as good as could be wished. The tardiness of pupils has been, on the whole, improved over last year, and the attendance in most cases is better, except when sickness has made it impossible.

But there is so much room still for improvement that I feel justified in making appeal to parents to let nothing trivial interfere with the attendance of their children at school.

Absence from school does more to interfere with the progress of intelligent children in their school work especially in the primary grades than anything else but poor eyesight.

The record of our elementary school graduates in high school is gratifying. May I take this space to express my personal appreciation of the work they are doing, the records they are making, and to encourage those who have failed to satisfy themselves. No failures have been made which are not able to be remedied in a short time by perseverance in effort.

Whatever the district expends for these young people in way of tuition money is certainly well repaid by the work which they are doing.

In closing this report I should feel that I had done less than my duty if I failed to express my thanks and appreciation of the loyal support and encouragement given me by the school board. Those citizens, with whom I have been able so far to have an acquaintance, have done their part as well towards making my work in the schools of Grafton pleasant.
