TOWN WARRANT

(L. S.) THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the town of Grantham in the County of Sullivan, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Grantham on Tuesday the 14th day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- Article 1. To choose by ballot and major vote one Town Clerk, one Town Treasurer, one Police Officer and one Overseer of Poor for the ensuing year, one Selectman, one Trustee of Trust Funds and one Trustee of the Public Library for the ensuing three years.
- Art. 2. To choose one or more Highway Agents and all other necessary town officers, agents and committees, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- Art. 3. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be necessary to defray town charges.
- Art. 4. To see if the town will vote to apply for State Aid for highways, and raise and appropriate money for same.

- Art. 5. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be necessary to repair highways and bridges.
- Art. 6. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be necessary for snow bill.
- Art. 7. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be necessary for the support of the Public Library.
- Art. 8. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 for White Pine Blister Rust control, to be spent in cooperation with the State Forestry Department.
- Art. 9. To see what sum of money, if any, the town will raise and appropriate for the support of the District Nurse in cooperation with the Lake Sunapee Nursing Association.
- Art. 10. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for the care of cemeteries.
- Art. 11. To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to hire money if necessary.
- Art. 12. To hear the reports of the officers, agents and committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
- Art. 13. To transact any other business that may come legally before said meeting.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Grantham:

I am pleased to submit herewith my eighth annual report as Superintendent of Grantham Schools.

The enrollment in the schools for this year is substantially the same as heretofore but with a slight increase in both schools.

TEACHERS

There were two changes in teachers in the Grantham schools. In Grantham Village, Miss Hazen's place is taken by May Knight, a graduate of Keene Normal School in 1932; at the North Grantham school Miss Hambleton's place is taken by Ina Bombard, also a graduate of Keene Normal School in 1932. The grammar room in the village school is being conducted on the same high plane by Mr. Norman Young. The two new teachers are proving their worth and bear testimony to the work that the Normal Schools are doing in producing teachers so well able to settle down to the work at the start of the year.

GENERAL STATISTICS

The total number of children registered in the Grantham schools for last year was fifty-seven. Two of these had previously registered in some other district in the state. The per cent of attendance was ninety-five and one-half. Six pupils were neither absent nor tardy although there were twenty-seven cases of tardinesses during the year. No children had to be transported to school which assisted in keeping expenses down. The register summary shows that eleven visits were made to schools by school board members, fifty-two by the Superintendent of Schools and sixty-

five by citizens of the town. The School Board held four meetings during the year in addition to a few informal conferences.

MINOR REPAIRS

Something needs to be done to the chimney at the Grantham Village school in order to prevent creosote from leaking through on to the desks during rain storms. This building was shingled last summer which puts it in comparatively good shape.

FINANCES

The budget as prepared by the School Board is somewhat less than a year ago. This is due primarily to reduction in the salaries of teachers and the superintendent and in the high school tuition payments. There are some minor reductions in other items. The state aid is approximately the same as it was a year ago.

CONCLUSION

Allow me to thank the teachers and school board for their cooperation and assistance.
