SELECTMEN'S WRITTEN REPORT

In submitting this report the Selectmen would like to explain a small matter that may be of interest to the voters.

In turning to State Aid Maintenance you will note that there is still due the town \$325.88.

There were pay roll slips amounting to \$651.76 that were not sent to State in time for this year's accounts, so the town will get back from State \$325.88 for next year. The balance for 1929 will be \$529.34 instead of \$855.22.

The Selectmen paid \$350. reward for information leading to the arrest and conviction of poultry thieves that were at James H. Thurlow's. You may wonder why the \$50. was paid, as \$300 was all that was offered.

It seems that a reward can be collected as many times as there is a person or persons that may give information leading to the arrest and conviction of a person or persons stealing poultry, therefore \$600. could have been collected in this case: \$300. for James H. Thurlow, \$300 for A. W. Chase and S. E. Wadleigh, as they two were working together. As they were townspeople and interested in the expense of the town they felt that \$600. was too much for the townspeople to pay and we were able to settle it for \$350.

The cave:n at Dodge's Mill Bridge was an unexpected expense. We felt that a permanent job was necessary at such a dangerous place and it would be expensive. It did cost nearly a thousand dollars (\$937.76) but it is paid and also the reward has been paid. We have \$706.39 in the treasury. Besides, the town debt is reduced to \$34.64

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT

To the school Board of Hampton Falls:

I hereby submit to you my fourth annual report as superintendent of the Public Schools of your school district.

We have continued the arrangement begun in Sept. 1927 of closing the South School and transporting the pupils of that section of the town to the North School.

At the present time there are 9 pupils in the North School. Of these only 2 are of the North District and the other 7 are transported from the South District. Two other pupils have moved from the North District temporarily only, and will return in the Spring.

Next September unless new families move into the town there will be in the North District 4 pupils and in the South District 6 pupils.

If these 10 pupils should be taken to the East School, that school would register not more than 25 pupils, in grades 1 to 5 inclusive. Under the present arrangement each teacher would have 4 grades. Thus all of the pupils of the town could be taught by one teacher nearly as efficiently as by two under the present system.

At the last annual school meeting we submitted a proposition to enlarge the present Hill School and combine all the school into one under two teachers. I have not changed my opinion as to advisability of this action. It would give to Hampton Falls as efficient a school organization as any town of its size in the State. It would enable us to furnish the most desirable surroundings and equipment for doing school work. I trust the citizens will give this proposition the careful consideration that any plan affecting the welfare of the children deserves.

We were fortunate in retaining the services of both of our teachers for another year. They have continued to do efficient service.

Our pupils of the Junior High and Senior High grades are, as a whole, doing excellent work in the Hampton and other schools and this town is well represented on the Honor Rolls of these schools. We have continued with increasing satisfaction the transportation to Hampton of all pupils of grades 7 and 8 at the expense of the School District.

Owing to the small number of pupils, widely scattered in the town, the average cost per pupil continues large.

For 1927-28 the State Dept. reports the average per pupil cost of the elementary schools of Hampton Falls as \$138.31, for North Hampton \$119.17; for Hampton \$96.89; for Rye \$86.00; for New Castle \$83.55; for Newington \$75.16 and for Seabrook \$45.03.

In conclusion, I wish to express my appreciation of the cooperation of you as a Board, and of the citizens, in our efforts to make our schools more efficient.
