We take pleasure in commending the board of selectmen not only for the accurate and systematic manner in which their accounts have been kept (proper vouchers having been furnished for nearly every item of expenditure), but for the care and good judgment with which they have managed the affairs of the town. It will be seen, however, that we have been unable to reduce the debt as much as last year. This is owing to the fact that the State and County tax, over and above the amount received from the railroad tax, savings bank tax and literary fund, was nearly \$700 greater than last year, while we were obliged to spend \$360 on the bridges at the Village, Salman Hole and North Lisbon. We also laid out about \$500 on new roads, etc., for the accommodation of our summer hotels at Sugar Hill, which we believe to have been a judicious expenditure.

SCHOOL REPORT.

The committee feel assured that the schools in Lisbon compare favorably with those of other towns in this section. Doubtless there never was a time when the schools throughout the town were in a more prosperous condition; the cause may be attributed to the efficient management by Mr. Ford and others, under the new school system.

The committee have endeavored to secure good teachers, and are confident their efforts have been crowned with success. An extra dollar per week in order to secure the services of a first-class teacher is sometimes an advantage to a school although the length of the term is necessarily shortened. The schools during the summer term were under the direction of Mr. Ford, who left no particular record in regard to their progress, therefore the report will be somewhat defective.

SALMON HOLE.

There have been three terms of school here during the year; winter and spring taught by Miss Bertha Hildreth; fall term by Miss Ardelle A. McIntire. Miss McIntire is a superior scholar and possesses a happy faculty of explaining, but her mode of government does not seem adapted to this school. In regard to Miss Hildreth we can but repeat Mr. Ford's remarks found in the last School Report.

WALKER HILL.

There were three terms, taught respectively by Miss Addie Spooner, Miss Isabel M. Ranlett and Miss Blanche E. Webster. This is one of our best schools and has been prosperous the entire year. As to the merits of the teachers, neither the committee nor the people are able to express a preference.

PEARL LAKE.

This school during the first term was under the charge of Miss Hattie Dow and visited by Mr. Ford. The second and third terms under Miss Ardelle Whipple. The school is one where there is little trouble in enforcing discipline. Such a school in the hands of a first-class teacher becomes a model school. The remark is practically exemplified in the case of Miss Whipple.

GOODNOW.

First term, Miss Ardelle C. Whipple; second and third, taught by Mrs. Lydia K. Gould. Mrs. Gould has had much experience as a teacher. This in connection with her qualification, and her peculiar adaptability to teaching, render her services valuable in any school. The discipline was perfect, and the proficiency entirely satisfactory to the people. At the examination the classes in Reading, first class in Arithmetic, Primary Arithmetic and general questions deserve special notice.

STREETER.

First term Miss Ida Gordon, teacher; second and third, Miss Ardelle Streeter. This school is in a prosperous condition. Miss Streeter has had but little experience, but if she continues we predict for her a successful career as a teacher. Excellent order was maintained, and the pupils made rapid advancement in their studies.

CENTRE.

Taught the entire year by Miss Florence J. Hildreth. This is a small school but, according to the age of the scholars, the most advanced in town. The appearance of the school was highly satisfactory and reflects much credit upon the teacher.

COLE.

There were two terms in this school; first taught by Miss Ardelle Streeter, the second by Miss Etta M. Thayer. This school bears a good reputation, and Miss Thayer entered upon her duties under favorable auspices. The result was a pleasant and profitable term and the reputation of the school was fully sustained.

GEORGEVILLE.

This school was limited to two terms; the first taught by Miss Geneva Barber and visited by Mr. Ford. The second term was taught by Miss Hannah Lehane. The pupils do not seem to be as well advanced as in some schools, but Miss Lehane, [although her first term] managed to awaken an interest and the school made excellent progress.

NORTH LISBON.

This school was also limited to two terms, the first taught by Miss Edna L. Little and visited by Mr. Ford; the second by Miss Ida Gordon. The committee and a majority of the people were not well pleased with the school during the fall term. Miss Gordon had previously borne a good reputation as teacher and doubtless in some other school, and placed in different circumstances, she would have been successful.

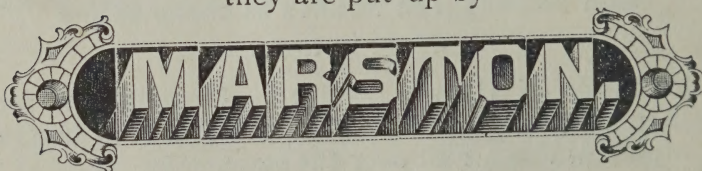
