TOWN WARRANT

State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of New Boston, in the County of Hillsborough, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are notified to meet at the town house in said New Boston on Tuesday, the eighth day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, polls to close at six o'clock P. M., to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary officers for the ensuing year.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for the same, or act in relation thereto.
 - (a) For deficit of previous year.
 - (b) For town officers' salaries.
 - (c) For town officers' expenses.
 - (d) For election and registration.(e) For the expense of the town hall.
 - (f) For the police department.
 - (g) For the fire department.
 - (h) For the health department.
 - (i) For vital statistics.
 - (i) For summer maintenance of highways.
 - (k) For winter maintenance of highways.
 - (1) For street lighting.
 - (m) For general expense of highway department.
 - (n) For support of the library.
 - (o) For town poor.
 - (p) For old age assistance.
 - (q) For Memorial Day and care memorial.
 - (r) For interest.
 - (s) For payment of long term notes.
 - (t) For town dump.
- 3. To see if the town will vote to accept state aid for the completion of the Weare Road. Appropriate \$7,500.00 for the same, the state to contribute \$22,500.00. And authorize the Selectmen to issue long term notes in the name of the town for this purpose, said notes not to exceed \$7,500.00 or act in relation thereto.

- 4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,219.62 the state to contribute the sum of \$4,878.48 for Town Road Aid or act in relation thereto.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to appropriate \$333.00 of the capital reserve fund in addition to the \$5,000.00 previously appropriated by the town for the total town's share of the state aid construction of the Woodbury Bridge on the Weare Road, or act in relation thereto.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for co-operation with the state in the control of white pine blister rust or act in relation thereto.
- 7. By request: To see if the town will vote to rescind its vote at the 1948 annual meeting to close, subject to gates and bars, a section of Road 84, from a point 50 feet east of Lull Bridge to a point 50 feet west of said Bridge, or take any action with reference thereto.
- 8. To see if the town will vote to close, subject to gates and bars, the road leading from the Wilton Road to South Hill, from the Wilton Road to a point near land of Walter Berry Heirs or act in relation thereto.
- 9. By request of the New Boston School District: To see if the town will vote to give permission to the school District to use the kitchen and lower town hall to serve school lunches to the children, relative to the school board's future plans, or act in relation thereto.
- 10. By request: To see if the town will vote to purchase any snow fence, raise and appropriate money for the same or act in relation thereto.
- 11. By request: To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$600.00 to resurface the road beginning at Merrimack Farmers' Exchange and continuing around the circle ending at High School, or act in relation thereto.
- 12. By request: To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding \$89.00 to the Merrimack Valley Region Association for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the town.
- 13. By request of the Fire Company: To see if the town will vote to construct a new fire station.

- 14. By request of the Fire Company: To see if the town will vote to give the Selectmen authority to issue long term notes in the name of the town for cost of construction of a New Fire Station, said notes not to exceed \$14,000.00 or act in relation thereto.
- 15. By request of the Fire Company: To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to execute any and all contracts or agreements necessary, proper and advisable in connection with Articles No. 13 and/or No. 14.
- 16. By request of the Fire Company: To see if the town will vote to use the present Fire Station as an Historic Building to house Molly Stark Cannon, "Old Constitution No. 2" and any other historic relics, or act in relation thereto.
- 17. To see if the town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the division of municipal accounting, and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit or act in relation thereto.
- 18. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell or administer property of the town acquired by tax deed or gift.
- 19. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money to meet the necessary expenses of the town.
- 20. To se if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to deliver inventory blanks at the time the inventory is taken.
- 21. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN, 1948

Your local organization to prevent and extinguish brush and woods fires is glad to report a good year of forest protection in 1948. In spite of danger conditions nearly equalling at times those of 1947 when great losses were suffered in New Hampshire and New England, fire damage and loss this year have been gratifyingly low.

With the continuing co-operation of all the people, we can hope to have another successful year in 1949. Let us remember that in any year, over 90% of all fires are caused by carelessness and that all of these man-caused fires are preventable.

Today, we have more slash and uncut grassland than for many years in the past. Smokers, campers and tourists who use our outdoors are also more numerous than ever before. We must therefore be ready for fires which might occur but, above all, prevention by everyone is the greatest need.

A few simple precautions taken by every citizen will help, as follows:

- (1) Always get a written permit from the warden before kindling a fire outdoors when the ground is not covered with snow.
- (2) If you smoke, always extinguish matches and tobacco before dropping or throwing them down. In automobiles, always use the ash trays.
- (3) Report fires and smokes to the warden without delay.

The observance of these and other simple rules will go far to insure safety from fire damage and your co-operation in this way is earnestly solicited.

A NEW FIRE STATION

After considerable discussion, the New Boston Fire Company has unanimously agreed that our town needs a new building with space for the three trucks that we now have. A Special Building Committee, appointed by the Fire Company to study the problem, submitted the following report to the Town Fire Wards:

The present fire station is inadequate for two reasons: *First*, it is structually unsound.

Second, it is too small to house our present equipment.

A drawing of the building proposed as a solution to our problem accompanies this report. With such a building our entire equipment could be properly housed and ready for all emergencies. This fire resistant building would be adequate for our needs for many years and would be an attractive addition to our village center.

Our present fire station formerly housed Molly Stark Cannon and "Old Constitution No. 2" (the old hand tub). Since modern fire apparatus has become necessary, these historic relics of yesterday have been scattered about town wherever people would have them.

With a new building to house our necessary equipment, these historic pieces could be properly displayed for public benefit in the present building.

The proposed building would be constructed as follows: The foundation is to be constructed of Portland cement-concrete; the walls of 12 inch thick cement-concrete blocks; roof frame of 2 wooden trusses with steel connector rings supporting wooden purlins with 2 inch roof planks over.

The truss bearings are to have three feet of the wall under each end filled with concrete and vertical reinforcing rods.

Trim about all windows to be common red bricks.

Lintels over windows to be of reinforced concrete.

Sills are to be of brick.

Front piers will be of solid brick built around steel columns.

Roofing is to be of heavy grade asphalt shingles.

Flooring will be 6 inch reinforced concrete over gravel.


Windows are to be of stock wood sash and frame, and doors to be manually operated overhead type.

Heating will be supplied by a forced warm-air heater with old-burner.

Plumbing will consist of sink with waste drain to dry-well.

Lighting is to be complete electric system and painting to be a 2-coat job of lead and oil paint over all wood trim and sash and doors; also 2 coats of transparent waterproofing over all exterior walls.

- 14. To see what action the district will take relative to a school lunch program, and to determine what sum of money it shall vote to raise and appropriate for equipment and/or maintenance of such a program.

To see what sum of money the district will vote to raise and appropriate as a capital reserve fund for the construction of an elementary school, said funds to be placed in the custody of the trustees of trust funds and reserved for the construction of an elementary school in accordance with the Laws of 1943, Chapter 160 as amended by the Laws of 1945, Chapter 35 and Laws of 1947, Chapter 8.
- 16. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF THE SCHOOL BOARD AND SUPERINTENDENT

To the School District of New Boston:

The current school year opened with the largest enrollment in the history of the New Boston schools. For the second consecutive year the first grade numbered over 25 youngsters, making a total of 129 pupils in Grades 1 through

8. The high school enrollment totaled 47.

In order to accommodate the increased enrollment, the School Board was forced to make certain alterations to the school building. You will recall that the warrant for the annual meeting of March, 1948 contained several articles relative to school housing. A committee was appointed to further study the problem and report back to the district. Several district meetings were held, finally to adjourn, the voters asking that a new warrant be drawn up in which other aspects of the problem could be considered. The School Board petitioned the Superior Court for permission to hold a special district meeting, such was granted, and the meeting held late in June.

At the several district meetings such problems as the construction of a new elementary building, major alterations to the present school building, purchase and alteration of the so-called "cement barn" were considered. With no one plan meeting the approval of the required number of voters of the district, no constructive action was taken. It was, however, voted that the lower town hall be renovated for school use. Such changes called for partitioning of the hall and construction of added toilet facilities. The district authorized the issuance of short term notes to the amount of \$5,000.00

for the above purpose.

The Selectmen of New Boston, however, felt that since no action had been taken by a *town* meeting, they had no legal right to turn over the hall for school purposes. The School Board also felt that the selectmen were without

proper authorization for such action.

With the opening of school some six weeks away, the school board was forced to make provision for the increased number of pupils expected to enter school in September. In order to provide additional classroom space, the following changes were made:

- 1. The office and laboratory on the second floor were converted to a classroom by the relocation of the rear partition of the main room,
- 2. The capacity of the old 7th and 8th grade room was increased by changing the rear wall,
- 3. An office was installed in the girls' cloakroom,
- 4. The laboratory was relocated in the west end of the shop, and necessary heat and plumbing was installed, and
- 5. The second floor of the school building was redecorated.

As was previously mentioned in this report, the district authorized short term notes to cover the cost of the proposed alterations to the lower town hall. These notes were never issued, for, since the purpose for which the bonds were designated was not carried out, a loan could not be floated on such alterations without specific action by the district. We are, therefore, including in the 1949 school warrant an article to authorize the school board to secure the sum of \$6,000 for the expenses incurred in renovating the school building in the summer of 1948. These funds can either be raised by adding the \$6,000 to the school assessment of 1949-50, or by borrowing the funds and discharging the obligation over a period of time to be determined by the district.

It is obvious to those who are familiar with our school enrollment problem that the changes made in the school building will serve as a temporary solution only. If our school population continues to increase, we shall have to study further for the solution of our problem. As far as your school board can now determine, we will be able to provide for the coming school year with our present facilities. However, the fall of 1950-51 will again present a critical housing problem, for by that time we will be unable to accommodate the number of youngsters anticipated. (We would like to call your attention to the pre-school census figures compiled in October 1948, contained elsewhere in this report.)

It is difficult for us to determine how long the renovated school plant will meet our needs. The district was given the use of the Community House for a period of three years (1947-50). If, when that period expires, we are no longer able to use that building, other quarters must be secured.

Based on the assumption that we can continue to use the Community House, we expect that we can take care of our increased number of pupils for two or three years with no further adjustments in housing. If, on the other hand, it seems wise to no longer use the Community House, or if youngsters move into our town from other districts, then some additional program will have to be followed.

In closing we should like to express our appreciation to all of those who had a part in the program of renovation. We are particularly appreciative for the efforts of Mr. Artemus Bolter and Mr. Carroll Sanderson whose interest in

the project was an inspiration to all of us.

REPORT OF THE SCHOOL NURSE

Uncorrected physical defects or conditions affecting a child's health may be responsible for his failure to make the expected progress in his school work. As the school is vitally interested in the health of your child, we endeavor at the time of the fall examination, to notify you of any defects noted which appear to require further attention, and recommend that you consult your family physician or dentist for a more complete examination and advice.

Frequent use of available clinics affords an opportunity for an early diagnosis, treatments, and corrections. Nearly every pupil in our union has had the Patch test. Children showing a positive reaction are referred to the tubercular clinic in Manchester for special chest examinations and chest X-rays. Many little first graders, before entering our schools for the first time in the fall, have been immunized against diphtheria, whooping cough and tetanus.

Periodic examinations of the eyes and correction of defects should and do receive special consideration. This test is given with the aid of the Massachusetts Vision Test recently purchased by the Supervisory Union.

Second only in importance to sight, our hearing is vital to our safety, happiness, and success in life. The person with ears that do not hear is dreadfully handicapped. These were given last spring with our new Maico Audiometer, also purchased by the Supervisory Union. This instrument determines the hearing efficiency of our school children, and is given once a year. Both of these instruments are electrically operated.

On April 5, 1948, Dr. Harry Hughes of Manchester examined the teeth of our 150 pupils. This was done in our school building. About thirty of these children were transported into Manchester on four consecutive Wednesdays to the offices of Dr. Hughes, Dr. Miller and Dr. Goodman for dental corrections. These trips were made possible through the kindness of four ladies who offered their cars and their time to see that the children got in the city and back home

safely. Several organizations in town helped finance this project.

In the fall of 1947 and the beginning of our school year in 1948, about 170 pupils were examined by Dr. Fraser. The following report shows the number of pupils affected and the number of defects corrected.

Defective vision, 28 Number of defects corrected, 22. Defective teeth, 120 Number of defects corrected, 52 Diseased tonsils, 9 Number of defects corrected, 7

There were 33 cases of chicken pox in the winter of 1947-48 and 45 cases of whooping cough in the spring of 1948, also 40 cases of measles. There was one appendectomy, one orthopedic case under treatment at the Elliot Hospital, and one child had an annual check up at the Shrine Hospital. There was one fractured shoulder.
