# TOWN MAINTENANCE

# Report of the Superintendent

To the School Roard of New Castle:

I hereby render to you my fourth annual report of the public schools of New Castle.

The past year we have made steady effort to solve the

problem of the schools of New Castle.

Such a large number of the pupils of the fourth grade of last June were unable to progress at the standard rate in their subjects that it was thought best to form a special class of those pupils. This has worked out well. These pupils have done more thorough work and the rest of the class have not been held back. It may be necessary to continue this special class

as long as these pupils remain in school.

At the close of the school year no change was made in our teaching force, and they have one and all continued their faithful and persistent efforts in behalf of the pupils. The attendance has been excellent except for a few weeks when the epidemic of colds was raging. Of the first eighteen weeks of this school year New Castle for twelve of those weeks led the seven towns of the Union in percentage of attendance. The secret of this lies in that the teachers inspire the pupils with a liking for school, and a truant or a delinquent child is rare in New Castle schools.

The instruction in music has been continued under Mrs. Poore. The addition of a piano for each building has greatly aided this work. Special notice should be made of the work of the little-folks' orchestra in the primary room.

In order that our graduates should be better fitted to take up the work in the Portsmouth schools, the subject of bookkeeping has been added to the course for the eighth grade.

One of the tests of an efficient school system is that its pupils desire to continue their work in higher schools. New Castle had this year in the Portsmouth high school one senior, five juniors, six sophomores and six freshmen.

Numerous tests have been given and the weekly attendance bulletins and the monthly teachers' bulletins have been

issued.

In the modern method of teaching the use of reference books and of library books is almost indispensable, even for the lowest grades. A beginning has been made in providing such books for our New Castle pupils. I trust that each year a small amount of money may be used to provide additional

equipment along this line.

We are still looking forward to the time when New Castle will erect a modern school building to accommodate all of its elementary grades, a well-equipped building of which we shall all be proud.

In conclusion, I desire to thank you as members of the school board, the teachers and the citizens of New Castle as a whole, who have co-operated so well in our work for the
