Town Warrant

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Stark, New Hampshire, in the County of Coos in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, in said town, on the second Tuesday of March next, March 14, 1950, to act upon the subjects herein after mentioned. The polls will be open at said place and date from 9:00 o'clock in the forenoon until 3:00 o'clock in the afternoon for the reception of your ballots upon the election of town officers under the Non-Partisan Ballot System: furthermore, you are hereby warned that on said date and place, at 9:30 o'clock in the forenoon, the matter of appropriations and such other business properly coming before said meeting will be taken up for your consideration and action.

1. To choose by ballot the following town officers: one town clerk for one year, one selectman for three years; and the following for one year: a town treasurer, a tax collector, one auditor, two road agents, two constables, two sextons and one trustee for the cemetery trust funds.

2. To see if the town will instruct its selectmen to appoint all other town officers required by law.

3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for same.

4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for current expenses.

5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for:

(a) Highway Maintenance

(b) Snow Removal

(c) Town Maintenance

6. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid for Class V Highways and appropriate \$280.86 and set aside for this purpose. The State will contribute \$1,123.45.

7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Town Relief.

8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Old Age Assistance.

9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to defray Interest Charges for the ensuing year.

10. a. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Public Library purposes.

b. To see if the Town will vote to move the Public Library from its present location to the Hearse Building and raise money for same.

11. To see if the Town will vote for a scale of discounts for payment of taxes on the basis of Three per cent if paid by August 31, Two per cent if paid by September 30.

12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to incur debts for temporary loans in anticipation of taxes for the ensuing year and pay such debts from tax money when received.

13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the upkeep of the Cemeteries.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$58.09 to the White Mountains Region Association, being 10c per \$1000.00 (1|100th of 1 per cent) of the assessed valuation of the town for the previous year, for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter and advertising and otherwise publicizing the advantages of the town, in cooperation with the other towns of the region.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$400 for White Pine Blister control recommended by the Forestry Recreation Commission.

16. To see what sum of money the Town will raise to purchase Chloride for Town Roads.

17. a. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to sell the Sargent V-Plow.

b. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to sell the Observation Tower.

18. To see if the Town will vote to cut the Tax Collector's Salary from $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent to $1\frac{1}{2}$ percent.

As can be seen by the table above pupil enrollment has gradually increased over the last five years. The anticipated increase for 1950-51 is significant only as it effects the primary grades in the Stark Village School. The concentration of 35 primary youngsters in one room will tend to retard sound educational practices.

The following pupils are now in attendance at various high schools with their tuition paid by the school district: Victorine Stuart, Franklin Rogers, Beverly Miles, Eugene Hodgkins, Theresa Gibson, Beverly Maguire at Groveton High School; Lorraine Bickford, Donald Fogg, Helen Fisher at Berlin High School; Murray Rogers and Ronald Mason at Lancaster High School; and Rachel McKinnon at Kennebunk, Maine.

Our teaching staff of Mrs. Urania House, Mrs. Winifred Hart, and Mrs. Maude Sanderson returned to their respective positions. Mrs. Sanderson attended the summer session at Keene Teachers College

Teachers from this entire "north country" area met in Groveton on September 30th to participate in a program designed to illustrate the many uses of audio-visual aids in classroom work. Our teachers are currently enrolled in a regular course in Audio-Visual Education sponsored by the University of N. H. Extension Service and taught by Austin V. Olney.

Supplies, equipment, and textbook requirements have been provided in accordance with a planned program of meeting our essential needs.

In the last half century, public education has more nearly portrayed the best in democratic practices than any other single agency. The structure of public schools is indicative of this practice since education is available through public support to all children and youth from kindergarten through senior high school and in many states from nursery school age through junior colleges.

The tremendous progress in the fields of art, science, medicine, business, government—yes—and even of fighting wars and subsequently of establishing and maintaining a just and durable peace to all these—public education has been the greatest single contributor.

Public education has been alert to the many changes in social and scientific progress and has continuously been striving to provide every boy and girl with full opportunity for growth and development for citizenship in a democratic society. The role of public education has been expanded and a sincere effort has been made to meet the requirements of this changing social order. How well schools have succeeded in meeting these requirements is revealed in the remarkable development of our nation.

The early leaders of our country agreed that the success of our democratic form of government was dependent upon the education of all the people. thus free public schools were established. State constitutions placed responsibility upon future generations for the continuing development of education, and education became a function and responsibility of the state, since it alone could best overcome the wide variances among local school districts to adequately support education. Throughout our nation, states have accepted this responsibility and have increased substantially the amount of state funds redistributed for school purposes. Our

State of New Hampshire embarked upon an austerity program and decreased the amount of state support by over one and a half million.

Stark, unlike most communities in the state, has received a little more in state aid this year, but the overall objective of providing educational opportunities for the welfare of all the children in the state has not been achieved.

I wish to express my appreciation to the citizens of Stark for their liberal support of our schools, to the School Board members for their guidance and assistance in the administration of school affairs, and to the teachers for their cooperation during the past year.

HEALTH REPORT

The results of the health examinations which were made by Philip Merriam, M. D., assisted by Florence Wheeler, R. N., were as follows:

Defective Vision, 6; Defective Hearing, 3.

Enlarged or Infected Tonsils, 11; Defective Teeth, 16.

Underweight (10 pct.), 5; Overweight (20 pct), 2.

Defective Speech, 2; Cardiac, 1.

Orthopedic: First degree flat feet, 4; Stoop shoulders, 2; Spinal (under treatment), 1.

Glandular disturbance, 1; Anemia, 1.

Hernia, 1; Genital defects, 5; Unvaccinated, 4.

All defects were reported, in writing, to parents or guardians with requests to consult their family physician, dentist, clinic or optometrist.

All children received a record of weight, height and gain for year, also normal weight.

During the year all pupils have been given the Mass. Vision test and the Maico Audiometer hearing test. The hearing test showed some children had hardened wax in ear passages. Advice for this condition should be obtained from their physician, as it may lead to permanent hearing loss.

All children who had parent's consent were transported to Groveton four times for the Fluorine treatment.

During the early part of the year there was a mild epidemic of mumps, but on the whole, considering the crowded condition of the Primary room, there has been a minimum of sickness.

Several dental corrections and vision defects have been done during the year.
