THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Stewartstown, in the County of Coos, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town house in said Town of Stewartstown on Tuesday, the 14th day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid.
2. To see if the Town will vote to accept the budget, and raise money for the same. If not to see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to defray Town charges for the ensuing year as follows:
 - (a) Town Officers' Salaries.
 - (b) Town Officers' Expenses.
 - (c) Election and Registration.
 - (d) Town Hall Expense.
 - (e) Damage and Legal Expense.
 - (f) Health Department.
 - (g) Vital Statistics.
 - (h) Interest on Temporary Loans
 - (i) Interest on Bonds.
 - (j) County Tax.
 - (k) Payment on Bonds.
3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for support of the Poor.
4. To raise such sum of money as may be necessary for the support of Libraries.
5. To raise such sum of money as may be necessary for the care of Cemeteries.
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise seven hundred thirty-five dollars (\$735.00), for street lighting.

7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the following departments:
 - (a) Police Department.
 - (b) Fire Department.
 - (c) Sewer Department.
8. To see what sum of money, if any the Town will vote to raise in addition to that required by law for the Town Road Maintenance.
9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for winter roads.
10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to incur debts for temporary loans in anticipation of Taxes of the Municipal year and to pay out of the Tax money when it is received.
11. To see if the Town will vote to instruct and authorize the Selectmen to administer and dispose of any and all real estate now owned and acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's Deed.
12. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue any or all of the following roads:
 - (a) Starting at the residence of Clarice Lafoe's at Back Pond and going up the hill to the road already discontinued.
 - (b) Starting at the entrance to the residence of Harley Bunnell's and terminating at the Dead Water Road.
 - (c) Starting at the residence of the late Hazen Lovering and terminating at the end of the so-called Dead Water Road.
 - (d) Starting at the point where the road leaves the highway leading to the so-called Edson Chase farm and now owned by Allie Dion and terminating at the so-called Tibbetts farm.
 - (e) Starting where the road leads to the buildings of the Lemieux farm and continuing through to the so-called Eddie Beauchmin farm buildings.
 - (f) Starting at the residence of Edward Hart's and continuing through to the so-called Hiram Heath place.

13. To see if the Town will vote to instruct and authorize the Selectmen to divide the Town into two or not more than three Road Districts. The same to take effect the following March Town Meeting of 1945.
14. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$100.00 to be used with money previously raised and now available for the purpose of grading and seeding the Hotel Lot for a park.
15. To see if the Town will vote to have the Vital Statistics printed in the Town Report.
16. To choose by Australian ballot the following Town Officers:
 - (a) Town Clerk.
 - (b) Selectman for the three years ensuing.
 - (c) Town Treasurer.
 - (d) Five Road Agents.
 - (e) One or more Constables.
 - (f) One or more Sextons.
 - (g) Collector of Diamond Pond Rent.
 - (h) Overseer of Poor.
 - (i) Trustee of Trust Fund.
 - (j) One Library Trustee for three years ensuing.
17. To see if the Town will instruct its Selectmen to appoint all other Town Officers as required by law.
18. To transact any other business that may be legally brought before this meeting.

Superintendent's Report

To the Superintending School Committee and the Citizens of the Stewartstown School District:

FOREWORD

The heaviest burdens of war are carried by youth. They fight its battles. In the long years after, they pay much of its cost. Even the younger children of wartime are often children of neglect. We must keep constantly before us the fact that children cannot delay the growing-up process. What they will be, they are now becoming.

What ever may happen to grown-ups, our children must be kept safe, strong and assured. Even during war times when parents are hard pressed with new responsibilities, they should realize that there is no care so good as that given by devoted parents in the home. When parents do a good job by their own children they are doing a vital war job for our Nation. Children depend on so many for their chance to grow in safety, strength and security.

May our post-war horizon be brighter because of a thoughtful well-guided program of education and training for youth, started in the home and continually strengthened by their experiences in the home, the church and the school.

Will you as American parents do your part to see that the foundations of morality, religion and culture are not weakened by a rising tide of juvenile delinquency?

Teachers

There has been several changes in the teaching force since the last report. At the West Stewartstown Elementary School: Una Silloway, Keene Teachers' College, was selected for grades 5-6; Barbara Boudreau, Keene Teachers' College filled the grades 3-4 vacancy; and Marjorie Libbey, Keene Teachers' College was chosen for grades 1-2. On the East side Mary Shoff

of Lyndon Normal was elected to fill the vacancy at Bear Rock.

Norman Young, Lillian Hart, Jessie Tibbetts and Dorothy Blodgett returned to the same schools as the previous years.

Notes on the Budget

The School Board's budget for 1944-45 totals \$19,799.00 as compared with \$19,351.50 for last year. The latter figure included a \$900.00 appropriation on school debt. The budget is reduced by an estimated income of \$6,275.00 so that the requested appropriation is \$13,524.00. On March 1943 the district raised \$13,576.50.

Buildings and Equipment

The School buildings are for the most part in fairly good condition. Most of the repairs during the past year have been of minor nature due to the shortage of labor and materials.

It is hoped that in the near future it may be possible to paint the South Hill School outside and so completely redecorate the classroom at Bear Rock.

Enrollment and Attendance

There are at this writing 81 enrolled at West Stewartstown, 46 in the four rural schools and 35 tuition pupils for a total of 162. A year ago there were 176 at the corresponding period.

The percentages of attendance are on the whole not too good. The highest percentages were 95.37% for grades 3-4 and 95.69 for grades 7-8 at West Stewartstown.

The Cedar Brook School had the poorest tardiness record with 114 and West Stewartstown grades 7-8 the best with 23. Most tardiness is inexcusable. An effort should be made to improve the percentage of attendance and reduce the number of tardinesses.

School Debt

Your appropriation of \$900.00 last year was applied to the school debt in July. This means that since July 1943 the Stewartstown School District has been debt free.

Tuition

We have at the present time 35 tuition pupils attending schools outside the district. Of these 24 are at Canaan High, 10 at Colebrook Academy and 1 at the Pittsburg High. A year ago we had 31 tuition pupils.

Conclusion

Since Pearl Harbor, many students have been leaving the classroom, sacrificing their education to take part in the war effort. Many parents have been greatly troubled because their boy wanted to quit school and secure employment. The parents, teachers, industrialists and authorities for the armed forces all know that the best thing for the youngster and the country is that he continue his education. Youth should prepare now for life. Knowledge is no handicap either in war or in peace.

I take this opportunity to express my appreciation to the members of the school board, parents, teachers and citizens for their support in our common effort to maintain good schools.
