THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Troy in the County of Cheshire in the said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Troy Elementary School in said Town on Tuesday, the 10th of March next at 10 A.M. in the forenoon for the election of Town officials elected by ballot, and you are hereby requested to meet also at the Troy Elementary School on the same day at 8 P.M. in the evening for consideration of the remainder of the articles in the following warrant:

- Article 1. To bring in your votes for a town clerk, one selectman for three years, town treasurer, tax collector and all other officers chosen by ballot.
- Art. 2. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray the following town expenditures for the ensuing year:
 - a. Town Officers' Salaries
 - b. Town Officers' Expenses
 - c. Election & Registration
 - d. Town Hall & Other Buildings
 - e. Parks & Playgrounds
 - f. Legal Fees & Vital Statistics
 - g. Insurance
 - h. Social Security
 - i. Interest—Temp. Loans
 - j. Memorial Day

- k. Town Dump
- l. Street Lighting
- m. Civil Defense
- n. Pine Blister Control
- o. Monadnock Regional Association
- p. Reappraisal of Property
- Art. 3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for winter highway maintenance.
- Art. 4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for highway oiling and general maintenance.
- Art. 5. To see if the town will vote to appropriate a sum of \$472.45 for Town Road Construction.
- Art. 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the support of the fire department.
- Art. 7. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the police department.
- Art. 8. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the maintenance and operation of the water department.
- Art. 9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the employment of a district nurse.
- Art. 10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money as its share of the operating cost of the Elliot Community Hospital.
- Art. 11. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the War Memorial Program.
- Art. 12. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the support of the Gay-Kimball Library.
- Art. 13. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the care and improvement of cemeteries.

- Art. 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for Public Welfare.
- Art. 15. To see if the town will vote to raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the payment of the water bonds and interest thereon.
- Art. 16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$420.00 as the town's share of the 1970 budget for the implementation of action under said multitown sewage agreement.
- Art. 17. To see if the town will vote to continue membership in the Ashuelot Valley Regional Planning Commission for another year and instruct the Selectmen to appoint two members to represent the town; one from the Board of Selectmen, one from the Planning Board.
- Art. 18. To see if the town will try to recover some of the Welfare money that the town counsel or town overseer believes should be recovered. The legal and collection fees will be up to, but shall not exceed fifty percent of the gross amounts so recovered. (this is put in by petition).
- Art. 19. Brought in by petition; To see if the town will vote to pay the Overseer of Public Welfare Fifteen Dollars weekly.
- Art. 20. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Capital Reserve Fund for the purpose of purchasing equipment for the Highway Department and to appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for this purpose.
- Art. 21. To see if the town (or precinct) wishes to exclude from the plan service in any class or classes of positions of election officials or election workers for a calendar quarter in which the remuneration paid for such service is less than \$50.00.
- Art. 22. To see if the town will vote to accept a deed to a strip of land Fifty (50) feet wide and about One Thousand (1000) feet long, for utilities and highway purposes; and said land being an extension of Memorial Drive to South

Main Street as shown on a plan entitled "Troy Development Co., Troy, New Hampshire" dated October 1968, survey of R. K. P. Keene, New Hampshire as amended June 19, 1969. To one coat of Penetrating Oil and one coat of Seal as approved by the Selectmen.

- Art. 23. To see if the town will vote to accept a deed to a strip of land fifty (50) feet wide and seven hundred and ninety (790) feet, more or less, long for utilities and highway purposes, said land being located on the easterly side of South Street and to be known as Memorial Drive, as shown on a plan entitled "Troy Development Co., Troy, N.H." dated October 1968. Survey by R.K.P., Keene, N.H. as amended June 19, 1969, to one coat of Penetrating oil and one coat of Seal as approved by the Selectmen.
- Art. 24. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,235.92 for a water main about Five Hundred (500) feet long from the last hydrant on South Street to the intersection of said street with Memorial Drive, which has been installed to serve Memorial Drive, Sand Dam Memorial Park, and other properties on South Street.
- Art. 25. To see if the town will vote to enter into an agreement with the Town of Marlborough, the Town of Swanzey and the City of Keene pursuant to the authority granted by New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, Chapter 53-A for the purpose of erecting, maintaining and operating main drains, common sewers and/or a sewage disposal plant or other device necessary or convenient for compliance with any water pollution statute or regulation lawfully issued, and to authorize the Selectmen to execute an agreement in such form as the Selectmen deem advisable and to take such other and further action as the Selectmen deem necessary or advisable to carry out the terms of such agreement.
- Art. 26. Are you in favor of changing the term of the town clerk from one year to three years, beginning with the term of the town clerk to be elected at next year's regular town meeting? By Petition.

- Art. 27. Are you in favor of changing the term of the tax collector from one year to three years, beginning with the term of the tax collector to be elected at next year's regular town meeting? By Petition.
- Art. 28. Are you in favor of changing the term of the town treasurer from one year to three years, beginning with the term of the town treasurer to be elected at next year's regular town meeting? By Petition.
- Art. 29. To see if the town will vote to establish a Capital Reserve Fund for the purpose of purchasing equipment for the Fire Department and to appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 for this purpose.
- Art. 30. To see if the town will set rental fees and standards for the use of the Town Hall.
- Art. 31. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money to pay town charges.
- Art. 31. To hear the reports of agents, officers or committees heretofore chosen, and take any action relating thereto.

In 1969 the welfare department was extremely fortunate in saving more than \$19,000.00 by negotiating with attorneys, state and county welfare agencies to relieve the town of several welfare cases. Our certification of 43 Troy families for Government Surplus Foods helped considerably to relieve the town of additional expenditures. The Town Road Agent helped considerably by trucking this surplus food to Troy.

However, under the new welfare laws, the town is legally liable to pay for various commitments and court orders made by state welfare agencies. The town welfare department is, in a sense, the bill collector for the state through personal collections and court action.

REPORT OF TROY FIRE DEPARTMENT

This year we find ourselves faced with a serious problem of concern to both the town and the fire department.

In April, 1969 an inspection of the Troy Fire Department was made by the New Hampshire Board of Underwriters. It was their recommendation that "early consideration be given to the replacement of the 1946 Seagraves pumper" as they felt the useful life of a fire truck is 15 to 20 years.

We hope the town will make an effort to improve the fire protection facilities presently available. The cost of equipment is saved many times over by the prevention of damage by fire.

The department is also faced with a daytime manpower shortage and would appreciate volunteers to join the department who would be available during daytime hours.

The Engineers wish to thank the members of the department for their quick response to alarms as several fires might have been more serious had not the men responded promptly and done excellent work.

Thanks to the townspeople's support of our annual Lawn Party and Muster the department and auxiliary were able to purchase a portable resuscitator which we are sure will be of much value to the town.

We also wish to thank those citizens who have taken the time to remove snow from the hydrants. Remember — fire prevention is everyone's responsibility.

Report of the Forest Fire Warden and District Chief

Less fortunate than our northern towns, we had too many fires. Carelessness in burning trash and discarding smoking material and children playing with fire caused most of the fires. Your Forest Fire Warden's job would be easier if everyone understood the State laws that govern the kindling of outdoor fires. A synopsis of these laws follow:

FIRE PERMIT

A fire permit is needed for all outdoor fires in or near woodland anytime the ground is not covered with snow. This includes household waste burning, even if in an incinerator, grass burning, garden trash as well as brush burning. Such burning is restricted by regulation to be prior to 9:00 a.m. and after 5:00 p.m.

EXCEPTIONS

Commercial or industrial burning is allowed anytime under normal conditions with permission of the District Chief and a permit from the Fire Warden.

Camp or cooking fires are allowed on your own property with permission of the Fire Warden. On another's property with written permission of the landowner and permission of the Fire Warden. The Warden can forbid such fires if in a hazardous area. Permits for cooking fires in the White Mountain National Forest can be obtained from the Laconia Office or at the Ranger Stations. Permits are not required in public camp or picnic grounds where fireplaces have been built for this purpose.

PENALTIES

- 1. For kindling a fire without a permit. Maximum of \$200.00 fine; or imprisonment for not more than 60 days.
- 2. For kindling a fire by any means wilfully or recklessly that shall endanger woodlands the maximum fine is \$500.00 or one year's imprisonment.
- 3. For failure to totally extinguish a camp or cooking fire before leaving it the same penalties as in (1) above.
- 4. For dropping inflammable material in or near woodland, maximum fine is \$25.00.

Fire prevention is a personal matter and a good habit. Keep our town free from smokes in 1970.
