## WARRANT FOR THE ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

## STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

(L. S.)

*To the Inhabitants of the Town of Webster in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Webster on Tuesday, the ninth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for the same.
3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum necessary to secure State Highway construction.
4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance of highways and bridges.
5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for plowing and sanding roads in winter.
6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for oiling town roads.
7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for relief of the town poor.

8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Age Assistance.

9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 to pay serial note.

10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Library.

11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Home Day.

12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.

13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for payment of interest.

14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400 to cooperate with the State in the control of White Pine Blister Rust, using town labor.

15. To see if the town will vote to give a discount of 2 per cent on 1937 taxes, paid on or before August 1, 1937.

16. To see if the town will vote to give the Selectmen the right to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

17. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to buy insurance for town help.

18. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

## REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

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*To the School Board and Citizens:*

Again we print in the town report a budget for the coming year together with the current year's budget for comparison. Taxpayers will note that this budget calls for a school tax of \$900 less than was raised last March.

In September Mr. Herbert came to the Putney Hill School replacing Mrs. Goodwin, who went to teach the Flaghole School in Andover, where Mr. Herbert had been teaching for two years. This exchange was made to the financial advantage of both teachers.

Both schools are being conducted well and with practically no friction.

The attendance last year was good. Tardiness still seems to be more frequent than necessary, Putney Hill having a somewhat better record than Corser Hill. We are glad to note a decided increase in the number of visitors.

The School Nurse reported four children underweight and three with defective vision. The two found with deformity were receiving treatment. The teeth of twenty-three children, found defective, were corrected at a Dental Clinic held in Warner. The Audiometer was used at both schools to test hearing. No defects found.

Interest in Music is good and new music books are just being introduced.

A new Septic Toilet has been installed in each school. For a long time these schools have been too large to be equipped with only one toilet for the use of both boys and girls.

Allow me to express my personal sense of loss in the death of Mr. John C. Fairbanks, member of the School Board and Truant Officer.
