STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Whitefield in the County of Coos and State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs. You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town, on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a Town Clerk, one Selectman to serve for a period of three years, a Town Treasurer, Highway Agent, two Library Trustees, Trust Fund Trustee, Auditor, three Hospital Trustees to serve for three years, and all other necessary Town Officers.
- 2. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for
 - a. Town Officers' Salaries
 - b. Town Officers' Expenses
 - c. Election Expenses
 - d. Municipal Court Expenses
 - e. Care and Repair of Town Buildings
 - f. Police Department
 - g. Town Fire Protection and Department
 - h. Forest Fires
 - i. Bounties and Damage by Dogs
 - j. Health Department and Vital Statistics

- k. Sewer Maintenance
- 1. Highways and Bridges
 - 1. Town Maintenance
 - 2. Snow Removal
 - 3. Cleaning Streets
 - 4. Street Lighting
 - 5. General Expense—Highway Dept.
- m. Public Library
- n. Old Age Assistance
- o. Town Poor
- p. Memorial Day
- q. Soldiers' Aid
- r. Morrison Hospital
- s. Cemeteries
- t. Insurance
- u. Interest, Bonds and Notes
- v. Sidewalk Maintenance
- w. Band Concerts
- x. Payment on Principal of Town Debt
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to grant to the Woman's Study Club, American Legion and Morrison Hospital Auxiliary, Mount Washington Grange and Rotary Club, for public purposes, the free use of the Town Hall.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money by temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.

- 5. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid Construction of Class V roads, commonly known as town roads, raise and appropriate for the purpose, the sum \$428.85, and receive from the State \$2,858.98.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for advertising, the same to be expended through the Board of Trade.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250 to the White Mountains Region Association, being 10c per \$1,000 of the assessed valuation (1/100th of 1%), for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter and advertising and otherwise publicizing the advantages of the town in cooperation with the other 45 towns in the region.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 for the purchase of land to be used as a Town Dump.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purchase of a new street Flag. (Estimated cost \$125.)
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for building an additional room onto the Town Office, said room to be used as a Courtroom. (Estimated cost \$3,000.)
- 11. To see what action the Town will take in regard to numbering the houses on each street in town. (Estimated cost \$50.)
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to adopt a plan for extending to employees of the Town the benefits of title II of the Federal Social Security Act (Old-Age

and Survivor's Insurance) as authorized by Chapter 234 of the Laws of 1951 and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$890 to defray the town's share of the cost thereof.

- 13. If the foregoing article is adopted, to see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to execute on behalf of the Town the necessary agreement with the State of New Hampshire to carry into effect the plan and to see if the Town will designate the Town Treasurer as the officer to be responsible for the administration of the plan.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise the amount of \$400 to continue the control of White Pine Blister Rust in cooperation with the State Forestry and Recreation Department, thereby receiving the usual State Aid.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of chapter 171-A of the Revised Laws relative to playing games of beano.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting, and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to purchase a new Four Wheel Drive truck and to turn in the F.W.D. in part payment, the balance of cost to be spread over a term of years. (The sum not to exceed \$11,000.)
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 for a skating rink, the same

to be expended through the American Legion. (By petition.)

- 19. To see what action the Town will take in regard to deeding to the American Legion the land on which the Legion building now stands, plus a 230 foot frontage by 140 foot back, on U. S. Route 116; allowing the Town a right-of-way across same to Ball Park, with present parking facilities. (By petition.)
- 20. To see what action the Town will take with reference to selling and conveying to Catherine S. Wilford and Charles M. and Margaret M. Bolich that part of Lot 10, Range 24 known as the Schoolhouse Lot in East Whitefield, of which they are now tenant owners, or take any other action which seems to be advisable with reference thereto.
- 21. To transact any other business that may law-fully come before said meeting.
