# Town Warrant

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Acworth, in the County of Sullivan, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Acworth on Tuesday the thirteenth (13th) day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Art. 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

Art. 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

Art. 3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for highways and bridges.

Art. 4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for breaking roads.

Art. 5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for support of town poor and old age assistance.

Art. 6. To see if the town will vote to accept State aid for Class V roads and raise money for the same.

Art. 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for lights.

Art. 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for debt and interest.

Art. 9. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow on notes on credit of the town, such sums of money as may be necessary to meet current expenses in anticipation of taxes.

Art. 10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for observance of Old Home Day.

Art. 11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for support of Silsby Free Public Library.

Art. 12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Memorial Day.

Art. 13. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of four hundred dollars (\$400.00) for control of white pine blister rust.

Art. 14. To see if the town will vote to clean up the dump by the roadside between the premises of Julius Pitkin and that of Rollo Potter, and post necessary warning signs where needed on other highways.

Art. 15. To see if the town will vote to close the road from Willis Ward's to the Five Points, subject to the State law.

Art. 16. To see if the town will vote to raise five hundred dollars to be added to the trust fund for betterment of the Acworth educational system, according to chapter 160, laws of 1943.

Art. 17. To determine and appoint the salaries of town officers.

Art. 18. To see if the town will vote to raise or borrow balance for snow removal equipment, or continue to use town's surplus funds and so instruct Selectmen.

Art. 19. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to clear the channel of the river by the Newton bridge,

Art. 20. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to buy a road grader machine as part of town truck for summer maintenance.

Art. 21. To see if the town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit by the Division of Municipal Accounting and to make appropriation for same.

Art. 22. To see if the town will vote to support United States membership in a general system of international cooperation such as that proposed at the Dumbarton Oaks conference, having police power to maintain the peace of the world.

Art. 23. To see if the town will vote to appoint or elect one or more road agents.

Art. 24. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

That we raise the sum of \$425.00 for old age assistance.

That we raise the sum of \$330.00 for town lights.

That we raise the sum of \$25.00 to pay interest charges.

That we raise the sum of \$140.00 for the support of Silsby Free Public Library.

That we raise the sum of \$25.00 for Old Home Day.

That we raise the sum of \$30.00 for Memorial Day.

That we raise the sum of \$500.00 for betterment of town school system, same to be held by town trustee.

That we raise the sum of \$250.00 for clearing river at Newton's bridge.

I am happy to report that the schools of Acworth are making good progress this year. Mrs. Gladys Murdough is teaching her third year at the Center. The children seem happy, their work is neat and orderly and they are developing the fundamentals of good citizenship. Miss Helen Berry began work at the South School in September. She is kind and patient. Through an accident, Miss Berry had to give up the work during the last of December but was back at her position at the beginning of the New Year. We were fortunate in being able to have Miss Maud Moody teach the school during Miss Berry's illness.

For a number of years the children of Acworth have been sent to the Alstead school. We have been proud in the past of the interest and ability of these children. There has arisen lately a feeling among a few of the children that they did not want to be regular in school in the upper grades and high school. This is a wrong attitude and should be corrected.

The shortage of teachers is becoming more alarming each year. The normal schools of the state have only eighteen students prepared to teach elementary schools, who will graduate next spring. The normal absorption of new teachers in this state is about one hundred. Many of the schools in the state are supplied by teachers with families and who will teach only because they feel it is their duty until the war is over. There are no young people to take their places. The commercial world is paying higher salaries for work that requires less responsibility, less preparation, less outside work and less criticism.

Allow me to quote from one of my last year's reports. "It would be a great help to equalize the cost of education in this state if a law were passed providing up to \$1,500.00 for each district to help maintain high schools or to pay tuitions and other expenses of high school pupils." It looks, at the time of this writing, as though the present legislature would consider a bill somewhat along these lines. The cost of schools, in the rural towns, is bound to grow greater and greater yet the farming population does not have a great increase in income. Something should be done to equalize the cost of education on the basis of the districts' abilities to pay.

It has been a pleasure to work with the present school board, teachers, and pupils. I wish to thank the citizens of Acworth for their many kindnesses.
