REPORT OF THE SCHOOL BOARD.

The school board respectfully submit the following report: The schools for the past year have, we think, been fairly successful. The teachers have all had previous experience in teaching, and have performed their duties faithfully.

For want of scholars no school was held at Brown Hill, the elimination of this school increasing the length of the school year, and making the schools sustained seven in number. The small number of scholars in most of the schools, and in many cases irregular attendance, offer little encouragement to ambitious teachers. A strong prejudice exists in every neighborhood against having small children carried far from home to attend school, and has operated against all plans for further union.

The new apportionment for the public taxes by the last legislature makes our per capita tax less than formerly, thus considerably diminishing the school money for the coming year, and if we are to have as much schooling as in the past, it will be necessary to appropriate money for the same.

The law of 1899, authorizing districts to unite with one or more other districts and form a supervisory district, with a superintendent for the several districts, is heartily approved by the state superintendent and others prominent in school work. One half the salary of a superintendent would be paid by the state, and the remainder by the several districts uniting. It would presumably make some extra expense for the town, and whether we are likely to obtain a corresponding return is left for your consideration.

At the last annual meeting the sum of \$75 was appropriated for repairs, which has been expended, also a small per cent. of the school money, most of it being used at Bow Mills. The schoolhouse and shed have been shingled, the shed thoroughly repaired, and both buildings painted.

It would be good economy to keep all the school buildings painted, and we would recommend the appropriation of a small sum this year for that purpose.

SOUTH BOW.

This school has been in charge of Willie F. Davis for the entire year.

Mr. Davis is a teacher of some experience, and by his uniform kindness he at once gained the sympathy and good-will of his pupils, which gave him power to advance his scholars in their studies.

We wish to thank the parents in this district for the interest they have manifested in having their children attend school regularly, which is a great advantage to both teacher and scholars.

BOW MILLS.

Here we find the largest school in town, which has been under the instruction of Miss Lizzie Hammond, who maintained good discipline, and labored hard for the advancement of her pupils.

A part of this school is composed of scholars who evidently attend school to learn, while the others are allowed by their parents to remain at home, regardless of the law, rather than to obey the rules of the school.

RIVER ROAD.

This school for the past two years has been in charge of Miss Birdie E. Gage of Pembroke. As usual, good results, and the high standard of the school maintained.

WHITE.

Taught by Nellie J. Bloomfield of this town. We can only emphasize what has been said in former years as to her ability as a teacher.

BOG.

Edwin A. Colby teacher. Mr. Colby having taught several years in town, his ability as a teacher is well known. The school was small, but excellent progress was made.

WOOD HILL.

This school for the entire year was taught by Mrs. Warren Dow of this town. Mrs. Dow is a teacher of experience, and she worked hard for the success of her school.

The examination at the close of each term was excellent. The parents and pupils desire her return in the spring.

NORTH BOW.

Miss Hattie Kimball, of Concord, taught this school the entire year. Miss Kimball worked for the interest of her pupils, and good improvement was made.
