THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

(L. S.)

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Danville, in the County of Rockingham, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town on Tuesday, the 11th of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To hear the report of the budget committee and act thereon.
- 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for same.
- 4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to repair the several highways and bridges.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money necessary to obtain State aid on either new construction or town road maintenance.
- 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for snow paths.
- 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Public Library.
- 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be used in improving the cemeteries.

- 9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the observance of Memorial Day.
- 10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250.00 to purchase seats for the town hall.
- 11. To see if the town will vote to accept the Trust Fund given by Lester A. Colby for the benefit of the Public Library.
- 12. To see if the town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the division of municipal accounting, and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.
- 13. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money for the use of the town.
- 14. To see how much of the Parsonage Funds the town will vote to spend for preaching for the year ensuing.
- 15. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.


