TOWN WARRANT

(L. S.)

To the inhabitants of the Town of Eaton in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Odd Fellows Hall in said Eaton on Tuesday, the Fourteenth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same. Including Town Officers' salaries, Town Officers' expenses, election and registration expenses, Town Hall expense, Fire Department, Town maintenance, general expenses of highway department, street lighting, library, town poor, old age assistance, health department, cemeteries, interest on temporary loan, town road aid.

3. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds.

4. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes if necessary.

5. To see if the Town will vote to elect one Highway Agent only beginning with the year 1945.

6. To see if the Town will vote to change the price of labor on highways, any change not to exceed the price paid by the State of New Hampshire for similar labor.

7. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the Non-Partisan Ballot System as provided by Chapter 22 Laws of 1943.

Polls will remain open until six o'clock p.m. unless a later hour is voted at the meeting.

Report of Superintendent

To the School Board and Citizens of Eaton:

The average school membership of the school this year has been slightly above thirty pupils. Attendance has been irregular. Much absence has been due to illness, some to poor travel conditions, and some entirely inexcusable. However, much excellent work has been done and the attitude of the pupils is good.

Some of the statistical facts for last year follow: Total registration, 39; days in session, 177; number transported, 20; visits of superintendent, 15; per cent attendance, 85.5; number of tardiness, 37.

The low attendance record of last year indicates that more parental cooperation is needed. Also the medical inspection shows many cases of defective teeth which if not cared for now will be a cause of future trouble and expense.

During the summer the inside of the school house was painted. It would be good economy to paint the outside soon.

The high school pupils attending Kennett High School this year are: Irene Bean, Delbert Bean, Nelson Grant, Donald Linscott, Ernest Nelson, Richard Paul, Mary Perkins, William Perkins.

The budget which the school board will present to the meeting for approval will be based on a careful study of probable needs. School patrons should understand that the amount raised at the school meeting is the total amount that will be available for next year. For that reason all voters should

attend the school meeting. It is impossible except in emergency for school boards to undertake after the school meeting any expense not contemplated and included in the budget accepted by the meeting. It is difficult here and elsewhere for people to understand that there is no school money except what they appropriate in the March meeting.
