- Article 3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for Pine Blister Rust Control.
- Article 4. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to provide for the disposal of rubbish and garbage and raise and appropriate money for the same, and other expenses of the Health Department.
- Article 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the Littleton Hospital.
- Article 6. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for snow removal, maintenance of highways and bridges, and for Town Road Aid.
- Article 7. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the lighting of streets for the ensuing year.
- Article 8. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the general expenses of the highway department.

- Article 9. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Abbie Greenleaf Library and salary of its librarian.
- Article 10. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the poor.
- Article 11. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Age Assistance.
- Article 12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for the proper observance of Memorial Day.
- Article 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$800.00 for a Memorial Plaque.
- Article 14. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for care of its cemeteries.
- Article 15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the Planning Board Fund.
- Article 16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for legal expenses.
- Article 17. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the White Mountain Regional advertising.
- Article 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the following: \$2,500.00 to pay the amount maturing on the town building and water works bonds; \$1,000.00 on outstanding water works purchase notes; also the sum of \$1,060.00 to pay the interest on said

indebtedness and on temporary loans.

Article 19. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for Post-War State Aid Road Construction to be used on Route 18A; also the sum of \$2,000.00 for Post-War Route 116 Bridge Construction.

# Report of the Superintendent of Schools

To the School Board and Citizens of Franconia:

I herewith submit my third annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

The enrollment of your schools last year was 124, the average membership 120.01, and the percentage of attendance 93.59. There were twelve tuition pupils in the Academy and thirty-six in the elementary school. The average attendance in the Academy was 32.47. The percentage of attendance was better than the preceding year.

This year the actual enrollment on February 1 was 137 with 37 in Grades 9-12 and 100 in grades 1-8. There has been a 10% increase in enrollment during the past year.

You are fortunate to retain all of your elementary teachers this year. The teachers are Mrs. Mae Belle Sylvestre, Grades 1 and 2, Mrs. Thelma Waldron, Grades 3 and 4, and Miss Kathleen Callahan, Grades 5 and 6.

Miss Carolyn Lang replaced Miss Margurite Poore at the Academy as Home Economics teacher. Miss Lang is a graduate of Keene Teachers College. She did her practice teaching in Quimby School in Center Sandwich. The Department has shown progress under her guidance.

Mr. Edward Twomey resigned in December, and was replaced by Mr. Arthur Kenney. Mr. Kenney is an experienced English teacher. During the war, he spent some time in England where he had an opportunity to visit many places mentioned in the English Literature. Mr. Kenney is also coaching the basketball team. The team is doing well, and has an enthusiastic following.

Mrs. Louise Peabody is again coaching the girls' basketball. The girls are well instructed in basketball fundamentals.

Winter sports is again assuming its proper place in the activities of Franconia children. Under the auspices of the Ski Club, Mr. Rhoades has arranged for each child to receive instruction one afternoon a week.

A new oil burner was placed in the stove in the Home Economics laboratory. The rooms are warm and comfortable and can be used in winter as well as in the spring and fall.

The contract with the Trustees for the use of the Academy buildings expired July 1, 1945. A new contract should receive careful study before it is adopted by the District.

We could not use the money raised last year for shop purposes since we were unable to hire a teacher for this purpose. The shop program is a valuable part of school work, and we will start the shop just as soon as we can get the teacher.

I wish to express my appreciation to the School Board and teachers for their cooperation during the past year.
