[L. S.] STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the town of Grafton in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Grafton on Tuesday, the eighth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.

3. To see if the town will vote to elect one or more Road Agents for the ensuing year.

4. To elect a member of the Board of Trustees of Trust Funds for the ensuing three years.

5. To elect a member of the Library Trustees for the ensuing three years.

6. To see if the town will allow a discount of 3 per cent upon all property taxes paid on or before July 30th, 1932.

7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to be expended in proper observance of Old Home Day.

8. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to make short term loans in anticipation of taxes.

9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of maintaining town highways and bridges, including the amount of 1-4 of 1 per cent as required by law.

10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of cutting bushes and railing embankments along the highway.

11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$792.00 for State Aid Construction thereby obtaining State Aid of \$1584.00

12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropripriate the sum of \$50.00 for State Aid Maintenance thereby obtaining State Aid of \$50.00.

13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriiate the sum of \$1550.00 for Trunk Line Maintenance thereby obtaining State Aid of \$5425.00.

14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to be expended in control of White Pine Blister Rust in co-operation with the State Forestry Department.

15. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to enter into a contract with the Danbury Light and Power Co., for electric street lights for a period of 10 years at the rate of \$600.00 per year and make appropriation for the same.

16. To see if the town will vote to set aside the amount of \$1,000.00 to be expended in the construction of a cement bridge on State Aid Road near Dimond's black-smith shop, the State to bear one-half the total cost.

17. To see if the town will vote to accept a legacy as a trust fund of \$100.00 to be applied to care of Johnathan Severance cemetery lot, father of Nathan Severance.

18. To see if the town will vote to purchase the H. A. Haskins blacksmith shop at Gratton Depot for housing town highway equipment at a price of \$275.00 and make appropriation for the same.

19. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell property which has been deeded to the town through the purchase of tax sales.

20. To take any vote or transact any further business that may legally come before said meeting.
