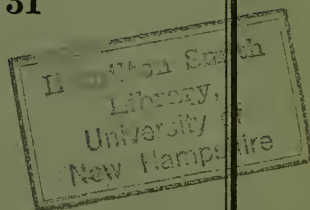

TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

(L. S.)

To the inhabitants of the Town of Hampton Falls in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Hampton Falls on Tuesday, the eleventh (11) day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.

3. To bring in your ballots for a Delegate to the Constitutional Convention to be held at Concord, N. H. on the first Wednesday of June next.

4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of twelve hundred nineteen dollars and thirty-three cents (\$1219.33) to reimburse the treasury for money spent on John Brown's lane and the Curtis bridge and railings.

5. To see if the Town will vote to build a new chimney at the Town Library, and make any changes in the heating system which may be thought advisable, and raise and appropriate such sum or sums of money as may be necessary to defray the cost of same.

6. To see if the Town will vote to purchase a road machine suitable to be used with the Town tractor and to raise and appropriate the sum of twelve hundred dollars (\$1200.00) for the same.

7. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid, and raise and appropriate the sum of eleven hundred fourteen dollars and fifty cents (\$1,114.50) the State giving to the Town the sum of eleven hundred fourteen dollars

(\$1,114.00) to be spent on the road from Kenny Brook to Taylor River Bridge and Dr. Sanborn's Corner so-called.

Signed by 16 signers.

8. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid Construction and to raise and appropriate the sum of eleven hundred fourteen dollars and fifty cents (\$1114.50) for same. This amount together with the State Aid of eleven hundred fourteen dollars (\$1114.00) to be expended on the South road beginning at the Lafayette road thence to the Kensington line and from the Seabrook line beginning at Fogg's Corner to the South road at Ram's hill. Signed by 17 signers.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) to buy a chemical toilet for the Town Hall.

10. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Given under our hands and seal, this 21st day of February, in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and thirty.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT

To the School Board of Hampton Falls:

I hereby submit to you my fifth annual report as Superintendent of schools of your school district.

As predicted in my last report, the number of pupils in the North and the South districts was so small that you wisely decided to close the North School as you already had done the South, and transport the pupils of both these districts to the East School. The number of pupils at present in the East School is only 24. These are in grades 1 to 5 inclusive, and altho, as far as numbers are concerned, they can be handled by one teacher yet the large number of grades renders the task of giving the pupils efficient service a difficult one.

Miss Avery who had served us in the East School for two years with good success refused to continue for another year. We were anxious under these circumstances to retain the services of Mrs. McDevitt and to have her teach the East School. This we were unable to do and the School district has thereby lost the services of a most efficient and worthy teacher.

Miss Mary Clement began the school year but was unable to continue and resigned her position Nov. 1st, 1929. Mrs. McDevitt subsituted for three weeks and then Mrs. Annie L. Tucker of Merrimac, Mass. took charge of the school. Mrs. Tucker is a graduate of Framingham Norimal School and has had several years experience.

In order to give the pupils the advantage of skilled instruction in music Mrs. Esther B. Coombs of Hampton was engaged to teach this essential subject.

Considerable money has been expended in order to make the East school room attractive and fitted for efficient work by the teacher and pupils. A well was dug and

driven near the school building and an ample supply of good water secured. The Kaustine Heater, installed one year ago, renders the school room comfortable and well-ventilated. The most pressing need of the schools at present is installation of a chemical toilet. This would render the school building sanitary.

Owing to the small number of pupils per teacher last year the average cost per pupil was high, being \$145.34. The expense per pupil for the other school districts of this Union is as follows: North Hampton \$116.07, New Castle \$96.80, Hampton \$91.28, Newington \$86.54, Rye \$75.51, and Seabrook \$45.04.

For the present year this cost for Hampton Falls will take a decided drop.

For the year 1928-1929 the expenditure per \$1000 valuation of Hampton Falls for its public schools was \$7.94. Of the 244 school districts in the state 70 expended less than Hampton Falls.

In conclusion I desire to urge the good citizens of Hampton Falls to be loyal to their public schools and let their criticism of the school be given to the right parties and let it be constructive and not destructive.

I assure you that we are endeavoring in every way to render your school efficient.

To those who have cooperated to this end I extend my thanks.
