## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hebron in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Hebron on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
3. To see what action the Town will take in regard to Old Home Day and make appropriation for the same.
4. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for maintenance of Town highways and bridges and make appropriation for the same.
5. To see if the Town will raise \$100 to be used for drawing out river gravel to be used when needed on roads and make appropriation for the same.
6. To see if the Town raise \$25 to be used in the Hebron Library and make appropriation for the same.
7. To see if the Town vote to raise money for State Aid construction and make appropriation for the same.
8. To see what action the Town will take in regard to Tomb in the Cemetery and make appropriation for the same.

9. To see what action the Town will take in regard to buying snow fence to be used where needed and make appropriation for the same.

10. To see what action the Town will take in regard to making new road through Oscar Morse field to avoid drifting of snow in the winter and make appropriation for the same.

11. To see what action the Town will take in regard to raising \$1,000 now due the Hebron School District for the year of 1934 and 1935 and make appropriation for the same.

12. To see what action the Town will take in regard to snow removal equipment and take any action in regard to tractors, snow plows or any other question that may come under this acticle and make appropriation for the same.

To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

## REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board:

I submit my second annual report as superintendent of schools.

During the school year ending June 30, 1934, the total enrolment was 40; 20 boys and 20 girls. Average membership was 36. The per cent of attendance was 97. We promoted 36 and failed 2. Of the five graduates of last June, Grace Adams is attending Bristol High School, and Muriel Barnard is enrolled in Plymouth High.

Progress during the school year was excellent. Tests and other checks showed that the pupils were doing well in the fundamentals. They also enjoyed real life conditions in school rooms made attractive by their own efforts in cooperation with their teachers. The schools were centers of actual citizenship. Creative abilities were developed in drawing, music, and English expression in both prose and poetry. Again we were indebted to Mrs. McLane for fostering the prize speaking contests in which the two schools united with much pleasure and profit. In June the schools again joined in graduating exercises of marked excellence.

Two of our children attended the Turnpike School in Bridgewater where they were guided by a competent and understanding teacher.

The slate blackboards added to the equipment of both schools during the summer have proved very serviceable. This present school year new and up to date textbooks have been supplied especially in reading and upper grade mathematics and history. Supplies and other necessities have been liberally adequate.

The schools were fortunate in starting the new year with the same teachers. We were shocked and grieved at the untimely death of the teacher at East Hebron, Mr. Roland W. Davis. This young man had won respect and affection in both school and community. His work was of unusually high grade. He understood young people, was able to get the best out of them and was wholeheartedly and unselfishly devoted to their interests. His death cut short a career of high promise.

Fortunately we were able to secure Mrs. Bertha Cote of Ashland to take the place at East Hebron. She is a teacher of mature experience, a graduate of Plymouth Normal School in the class of 1925. Thus the pupils have been able to go on with their school work with minimum loss.

For the present school year our total enrolment is 40 pupils; 21 boys, 19 girls. East Hebron has 19; 12 boys, 7 girls. The Village has 21; 9 boys, 12 girls. Two of these are beginners. Our eighth grade pupils total seven; 3 boys and 1 girl at East Hebron; 1 boy and 2 girls at the Village. I predict a hundred per cent attendance of these pupils in high school next year. I appeal to the parents to do all they can to assure these young people the opportunity to continue their school life.

The activities of the superintendent as outlined in last year's report have been continued. I am pleased with the work of the teachers, with the fine wholesome spirit of the pupils, and with the evident cooperation of

the parents. The schools are continuing to progress. I am glad to again mention the valuable service of Mrs. Lovett as school nurse.

I beg to offer two recommendations for your consideration.

1—Sanitary toilets should be installed as soon as may be possible and feasible.

2—The school district should be looking forward to a consolidation of the two schools in a two room building centrally located. Such a plan would be in line with educational trends and to the advantage of the pupils.

Again I thank the members of the school board for their very kindly and considerate cooperation.
