8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for street lighting.

9. To see if the town will take any action relative to sidewalks.

10. To act on any other subject that may legally come before this meeting.

LIBRARIAN'S REPORT

To the Board of Trustees of the Jackson Public Library:

I beg to submit herewith my report of the work done by the Library and a statement of its condition for the year ending Feb. 1, 1927.

The Library has been open 117 days. From July 1 to October 1 the hours were from 10 a. m. to 1 p. m. daily; and for the remaining months from 2 to 4 p. m. every Thursday. In this time the total number of books given out were 3,257; a monthly average of 271 volumes and a weekly average of 63 volumes.

There have been added to the Library by gifts, 97 volumes and by purchase, 20 volumes, making the total number of volumes in the library 3,753. In addition to these we have on file the following magazines: National Geographic, Nature Magazines, World's Work, Musical America, Dearborn Independent, Good Housekeeping, Saturday Evening Post, Literary Digest, Woman's Home Companion, Forum, Amercian, St. Nicholas, Needlecraft, Pictorial Review and John Martin.

We gratefully acknowledge gifts of books and money from friends and especially for the following donations: From Mr. George McCarthy, \$10.00; Mrs. A. H. Atherton, \$5.00; Mr. A. G. Stevens, 32 volumes; Children at Gray's Inn, 22 volumes; Mrs. J. H. Cross, 17 volumes; Mrs. F. H. Shapleigh, 11 volumes.
