#### TOWN WARRANT

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Jefferson in the County of Coos in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Jefferson on Tuesday, the tenth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1338.00 for construction on Bailey Road and receive \$4,014.00 from the State.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$500.00 to be expended on the so-called Ingerson Road beginning at the end of the present improved road.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$92.00 in cooperation with other towns in the White Mountain Region.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the Jefferson end of the so-called Flaherty Road.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue such parts of the Knothole and Turnpike roads as will be abandoned by the State Aid Construction.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to sell the school houses that are not being used at present or will not be used in the future.

- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100 for additional fire protection due to the war emergency.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100 to provide watchmen and additional police protection due to the war emergency.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$25.00 for use of the town health officer and board of Health due to war emergency.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to allow the Selectmen to put out the inventory blanks at the time of taking inventory.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to allow the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired through tax collector's deeds.

### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

# To the School Board and Citizens of Jefferson:

Herewith is submitted my eighth annual report including statistics for the last complete school year.

This present year as last year, all pupils of the town are consolidated in the Hill and Meadows school buildings.

The enrollment in the lower grades at the Hill has been somewhat larger than desirable for most efficient results, and some readjustment of the pupil load per teacher should be made for next year. The Meadows school could easily accommodate more pupils.

During the past summer resignations were received from Miss Elizabeth Carpenter, who had

charge of lower grades at the Meadows, and also from Mrs. Alice Carr, intermediate teacher at the Hill. These places have been filled by the election of Mrs. Ursula Kellum George to the Meadows Primary and Mrs. Barbara G. Miller to the Hill position. Both are teachers of experience.

In the High School, Mr. Samuel Fuller resigned to enter military service, and Mr. Raymond E. Morton, a graduate of the University of Maine, and with credit for work at two summer sessions at Bates College, was elected to this position. Mr. Morton is a teacher of several years' experience. Thirty pupils are now enrolled in senior and junior high combined.

The superintendent has kept in touch with classes and teachers by weekly visits to the schools, and the work observed, tested, and suggestions made wherever necessary.

The average attendance for the last complete school year of 37 weeks was 93.8, a slight drop from the previous year.

The average scholarship, accomplishment, and deportment of pupils has been good, and work done has been commensurate with that of other schools.

The health examination and follow-up work has been done as usual by the School Physician, Dr. L. C. Aldrich, and School Nurse, Mrs. Mary Spaulding.

It is recommended that some painting and renovations should be made at the Hill school.

Repair work should be done on the sheds at the Meadows in order to create a more sanitary condition.

The school board and superintendent have made an estimate of necessary expenditures for the year 1942-43, and this estimate may be found in another part of this report.
