4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to continue the permanent construction of the New Boston Road.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to continue the permanent construction of the Wadleigh Point Road.

6. On petition of Guy Amburg and others to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$750.00 to improve and extend the tarvia surface in part on the Cheney Mill road to the Danville line in 1952.

7. On petition of Arthur Hamblen and others to see if

the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1000.00 to continue the permanent construction of the Shore Road.

8. On petition of Jack K. Braley and others to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$795.00 to purchase oil burners and install same in the hot air furnaces in the Town Hall. The purchase of these burners to be opened on sealed bids, and the award given to the lowest responsible bidder.

9. On petition of the Kingston Firemen's Association to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$750.00 to plaster and finish the new fire station.

10. On petition of Ralph E. Ordway and others to see if the Town will vote to have a street light installed near the Wood Heel Shop on the Newton Jct. Road, and raise and appropriate money for the same.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$622.00 to purchase a new Good Roads Model 701 Snow Plow with Moldboard Assembly for the Town Truck.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$425.00 to purchase a new Model DD Highway Power Sander for the T. Truck.

13. On recommendation of William H. Messick, Jr., State Forester, to see if the Town vill vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for continuing control of the White Pine Blister Rust in Kingston during 1952 in accordance with the State laws.

14. To see if the voters will authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow sums of money not exceeding \$15,000.00 in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the current year, and to issue in the name and on the credit of the Town negotiable notes therefor, said notes to be paid during the current year from taxes collected during the year.

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15. Shall the provisions of Chapter 171-A of the Revised Laws of the State of New Hampshire relating to playing games of Beano, be adopted in this town? (This article to be voted on by ballot).

16. To see if the Town will vote to accept the auditors report, and the Town reports as printed.

17. To see if the Town will vote to open all annual Town Meetings at 10 a.m. and close at 7 p.m.

18. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

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REPORT OF TOWN MEETING, MARCH 13, 1951

Polls opened at 9:10 A.M. and the warrant was read by the Moderator.

Voted to close polls at 7 P.M. Proceeded to elect the Town Officers counted by Australian Ballot. Polls closed at 7 o'clock and the Officers counted the ballots until 8 o'clock when the Meeting was called to order by the Moderator.

Article 2. Voted that the sum of \$67,646.61 be raised and appropriated for Town charges.

Article 3. Voted that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$339.00 and the State will contribute \$1,356.00 for Class 5 highways, under the provisions of the T. R. A. so called.

Article 4. Voted that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to continue the permanent construction at the Newton line and work this way as far as the money will go.

Article 5. Voted that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 to continue the permanent construction of Great Pond Park Road.

Article 6. Voted that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for further improvement to the Wadleigh Point Road, to include tarring that portion resurfaced last year.

Article 7. Voted that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for improving the Shore Road.

Article 8. Voted that the Article be laid on the table.

Article 9. Voted that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$330.00 for 100 wooden folding single chairs for the Town Hall. Result of vote taken by paper ballot was— Yes, 118; No, 99. Article 10. The result of this Article relative to playing Beano was as follows: Yes, 223; No, 95.

Article 11. Voted that the Town raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$2,700.00 to purchase a new Dump Truck, the present truck to be traded in toward the new one, and the Selectmen are hereby authorized to borrow money to finance the deal in the name of the Town, with an amendment made and carried that the present truck be sold to the highest bidder.

Article 12. Voted that the Selectmen and Town Treasurer be authorized to borrow sums of money not exceeding \$10,000.00 in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the current year, and to issue in the name and on the credit of the Town negotiable notes therefor, said notes to be paid during the current year from taxes collected during the current year.

Article. 13. Voted that the Town authorize the Selectmen to convey to Exeter & Hampton Elec. Co. a permanent right of way and easement 100 ft. in width throughout, to construct, maintain and operate a transmission line or lines over property owned by the Town of Kingston on the Hunt Rd., so called, bounded; Northerly and Westerly by said Hunt Rd.; Easterly by land now or formerly of Hannah C. Primrose; Southerly by land formerly of Ezekiel Jones, now Isabelle Lynde, for such price and upon such terms as the Board of Selectmen of the Town determine, and to authorize the Selectmen on behalf of the Town to execute and deliver to said Exeter & Hampton Elec. Co. a good and sufficient easement deed, conveying the rights and easements authorized under this Article. The location and extent of said right of way and easement to be determined upon a survey of the premises.

Article 14. Voted to accept the Auditor's Report, and Town Reports as printed.

Article 15. Voted that the Zoning Ordinance be definitely postponed for ninety-nine years. Voted by paper ballot, the result was—Yes 154, No 93. Article 16. Voted that the Treasurer of Fire Wards submit a detailed report of receipts and expenditures to be published in Town Report and Auditors to audit this report.

Motion made and passed that Zoning Committee be discharged wih a vote of thanks.

Motion made and passed that Ivy be removed from corners of Town Hall to protect the building.

Voted to return to Article 1.

Superintendent's Annual Report

To the School Board and the Citizens of Kingston:

It is with a good deal of pleasure that I write this, my second annual report to the School District of Kingston.

One year ago Kingston was looking forward to the possibility of an addition to the Bakie School. Today that possibility has become an actuality, for the promotion of superior educational opportunities for its children. The new two room addition and other alterations have alleviated last year's problems, but Kingston has become a town that more and more parents like to live in as is indicated by a comparison between planned and actual enrollment for this year. The best forecast possible indicated a top enrollment of 158 pupils for 1951-52, there is now an enrollment of 177. The following breakdown of the enrollment by grades gives a good idea of the problem involved when you consider that there must be two combinations of two grades each with six teachers and eight grades.

This, without the impetus of the Newington Air Base. It is well that Kingston has its eyes on the future and what it will probably mean to future enrollment.

This report is accompanied by a page devoted to Return of District Revenue which shows the actual budget we are operating on this year, (1951-52.) In studying this year's budget and comparing it with the proposed budget of 1952-53, I would ask you to bear in mind that increased enrollment means more books, school supplies, and equipment; consequently greater costs. You may be assured your school Board and Superintendent are doing all they can to be economical, but at the same time maintain the high educational standards you have enjoyed in the past.

TEACHERS

Mrs. Marguerite Hill (Gr. 5 and 6) has been added to the teaching staff to alleviate the crowded classroom conditions at Bakie School. Mrs. Hill comes to us with eight years experience in the schools of Maryland and one year at Bridgewater, N. H. Mrs. Hill is doing a very creditable job in maintaining the high level of instruction associated with Bakie School. Kingston is rightly proud of its teachers. The teachers of Bakie School have continued their high level of professional interest in their work. You would indeed be fortunate if the continuity of your present staff could be maintained.

Miss Ann-Marie O'Shea, B.U. School of Music "51" to replace Miss Jean Readio who resigned to be married. Miss O'Shea's musical background has permitted her to fit very nicely into the type of instruction necessary for a Supervisory Union position.

HOT LUNCH

The hot lunch program is well organized and successful. The alterations in the kitchen have facilitated matters considerably. Although it is regrettable that the dishwasher has not as yet proven too successful, the School Board is doing everything in its power to correct the situation.

The P.T.A. is to be commended for its continued interest in and support of the program. Such close cooperation between school and home is bound to be advantageous to all.

TESTING PROGRAM

A union wide testing program has been instituted this year. Children in grades 4, 6, and 8 were tested in October by the University of New Hampshire counseling service. Grades 4 and 6 were given Mental Efficiency tests plus Achievement tests in Reading, Arithmetic and English. Grade 8 was given a battery of tests which included, Interest Inventory, Mental Effi-

ciency, Mechanical Aptitudes and Comprehensive Reading. Grade 8 tests shall be used as a medium for counseling and guiding pupils into selection of a high school program best fitted for them in terms of interest and abilities.

These tests are in the hands of the respective teachers who would welcome the opportunity to sit down with any and all interested parents for a discussion of their child's problems as indicated by the tests. Naturally these tests are not infallible, but they are of immeasurable help when supplemented by the teacher's judgment. I urge parents to take advantage of this opportunity to sit down with the teacher and discuss their child objectively.

You will be interested to know that the pupils of Bakie School rated above National and State averages in all areas tested.

GUIDANCE

As the value of a testing program must be measured by its use and because the State Department recognizes the value of a full time Counselor in Guidance Work, the Union has voted a sum of money to pay part of such a man's salary. The State Department of Education has consented to match the amount voted by the Union in order to set up a pilot program on a Supervisory Union basis. This program will be the only such program in the state and will be closely supervised by your Superintendent and the State Guidance Director.

It should prove of great value to Kingston in that it will make available a man trained in counseling techniques to work with parents, teachers, and children in working toward the solution of problems in mal-adjustment, truancy, and others common to the advanced or retarded pupil.

Finally, I wish to express my appreciation to the School Board, Citizens, Teachers and Pupils of Kingston for the fine spirit of friendliness and cooperation shown me. It has made my work very pleasant.

Health Supervision

To the Superintendent and School Board, Citizens of Kingston:

Following is a report of the school health program from January 1, 1950 to January 1, 1951.

The same health work has been carried on. Monthly inspections of heads, skin, etc., plus visual and hearing tests, examinations of teeth, throats, glands, and posture. Defects found were followed up with home visits and when necessary, ways were provided for the correction of defects.

Weighing and measuring in September, February and June. Brief health discussions when needed. Pupils in grades seven and eight were all skin patched for tuberculosis.

The hot lunch program continues to be a great success. There is as much pep and activity in the Bakie School afternoons as well as mornings. This could be attributed to the fine hot lunches.

With Dr. DeCatur's kind cooperation, a round-up was held in June. This was for the children entering school in the fall. Most of them attended and had physical examinations, and were vaccinated.

I am grateful for this opportunity to thank the people of Kingston for the fine new wing which has been added to the school. This now leaves the auditorium available for much health work. I also wish to thank those who have cooperated and given this program such fine support.
